2. Financial Statement – *N Mathur*

Boundary Run

Earlier today, Maxime sent me accounts showing a record profit of 18.4k.

Let us compare with previous highs.

Pre-pandemic we hit a profit of 14.0k in 2019.

Post-pandemic we hit a profit of 13.0k last year in 2024.

In order to consider entries, let us compare income instead of profit:

17.5k in 2019, 18.7k last year in 2024, and now 24.9k.

In summary, crudely comparing with those pre- and post-pandemic highs, income is up by 6k, profit is up by 4-5k.

A big well done to Maxime and everyone else!

Administrative matters

I believe that advance payments are now collected to book items of known value (dinners and stash); and that deposits are taken to book items of uncertain value (BUCS and training camps). We should please ensure that any sign-ups are only valid if accompanied by the corresponding payments.

The accounts for the last financial year 2023-24 passed audit, year end is 30 June.

I made annual declaration to the Charity Commission for 2024 in respect of our status as a registered charity.

Like last year, Cillian has done a fantastic job as Junior Treasurer and I am delighted that he is standing for a third time. If re-elected, this should be a record stint for a Junior Treasurer, at least.

Overall position

The extra Boundary Run profit is really very welcome indeed given increasing costs that include expenses payments to John Eves as well as Phil O'Dell. These expenses for the four 'terms' come to over 4k.

Other major expenses are quite a few k on transport to races, a few k on subsidising BUCS, and a few k on Training Camp subsidies.

Our major sources of general income are membership fees (4.4k) and donations (1.4k).

I anticipate that the extra Boundary Run income implies that there will be no need to increase membership fees or Boundary Run entry fees.

However, costs are always going up, and future Boundary Run income is not certain, so if everyone who leaves can please send £10/year via the portal then that would be nice – Gift Aid will be added for UK taxpayers.



2. Financial Statement – *Neil Mathur*

Boundary Run

The Boundary Run was (re)started in 2007 by the former Captain and current Vice President, Si Rutherford. He thought it would be fun to organise, and he thought we would be good at organising it. He did not think about money. It made a profit of £21.

The Boundary Run profit then rose non-monotonically to a pre-pandemic peak of £14k (2019).

Post-pandemic, the Boundary Run profit was £4k (2022), £9k (2023), and now for this year it will be £13k (income of £19k, expenditure of £6k). This spectacular rebound is particularly welcome as expenditure is escalating.

Many congratulations to Maxime and everyone else.

Overall Position

For the first time since *N Mathur* became Senior Treasurer in 2006, we had a cash flow problem and he could not pay a minor expense. The problem arose because many thousands of pounds were committed to BUCS accommodation and stash. In future, we should take stash payments up-front, partly to avoid cash flow problems, and partly to avoid the need to chase anyone for non-payment. More generally, we should always take up-front payments, as exact amounts where totals are known, or via deposits where totals are not known.

Finances have now rebounded and we have a large cash float.

However, costs remain high and continue to escalate with inflation. The main costs are coaches to races, expenses for Phil O'Dell, and subsidies for BUCS and Training Camps.

More income would be good. We receive almost £1k in donations each year, primarily via the £10/year scheme that *N Mathur* started, but some give much more than £10/year. It would be good if leavers/alumni could make donations via the website, permitting us to collect Gift Aid (UK taxpayers only).

When *N Mathur* makes a spending plan in Easter Term with the new Captain, we should consider the possibility of increasing membership fees or BR entry fees, but only if really necessary.

Administrative Matters

The accounts for the last financial year 2022-23 passed audit. *N Mathur* then completed the corresponding annual declaration to the Charity Commission. (We are a registered charity, but we get no real benefit from this.)

C Doherty has done a fantastic job as Junior Treasurer and *N Mathur* is delighted that he intends to continue and is unopposed.

3. Senior Committee Re-election

J Carr announced his intention to stand down at the Lent committee meeting.

E Bradley renounces her vice presidency. She explains that she is not around enough to be involved in the decision making process.

M Dickinson, as the outgoing captain, was elected as VP.

All the other VPs, plus *J Lasenby* and *N Mathur*, were re-elected in a unanimous vote.

2. Financial Statement – *N. Mathur*
'First, just so everyone knows how the accounts work: income typically goes into the Junior Treasurer account, everything from there is transferred to the account that I administer, and I action all expenditure.

The Boundary Run (BR) is our main source of income.

· Pre-pandemic we had built up to a profit of 10.9k (13.2k in, 2.4k out).

· Last year we had a profit of 4.1k (5.8k in, 1.7k, out).

· This year, we had a profit of 9.2k (11.9k in, 2.7k out).

Thus we are already well on the way back to pre-pandemic levels of BR profit.

The hit to BR profit was absorbed by our large savings, which have thus been reduced from 25k to 13k (these are year's end values).

Huge thanks to Iain and everyone else for the great job in organising the race and earning the largest chunk of club income – maybe 60%.

The other sources of income: 3k in memberships, 1k of donations, 0.7k from the University, and £35 in bank interest... which represents an order of magnitude increase on our (reduced) savings.

The main expenditure items are, as usual, race travel (many k), Phil O'Dell's coaching expenses (2-3k), training camps (2-3k), College league/Cuppers, physio, and kit.

Overall: we are bouncing back from the reduced BR income after the pandemic, but expenses continue to mount, so all donations are welcome – perhaps most obviously for leavers.'

CUH&H annual report

Normally we have 30k flowing in and out of the account.

This year we had 24k in and 26k out. Some of this represents funds that merely pass through the club accounts, i.e. paid by members to the Junior Treasurer account, transferred to the Senior Treasurer account, and paid to suppliers (e.g. kit and catering). Note that all funds paid to the Junior Treasurer account are transferred to the Senior Treasurer account, from which I action all expenditure (normally directly, occasionally as refunds).

Below I have listed the main items of income and expenditure that do not merely represent a transfer of funds from members to suppliers. As always, the Boundary Run is the main source of income and the organisers and volunteers are to be commended for their work.

Income

4.5k Boundary run (5.8k in, 1.3k out), cf. 2020 (13.3k in, 2.4k out), i.e. income was 43% cf. last time.

3.4k Subs - similar to normal

0.7k Donations

Expenditure

6.2k Race travel including BUCS

1.8k Phil O'Dell's coaching expenses

1.5k Training camps

1.3k College league and Cuppers

1.3k Physio

1.0k Kit

Overall

In the previous financial year that was afflicted by covid, we earned relatively little and spent relatively little. Given our model of spending BR income the year after it was earned, the 2020 Boundary Run's net income of 11k was carried over for expenditure that was actioned in the current year. Yesterday's Boundary Run income of 5.8k was 43% of the 2020 income. There are two consequences of the reduced income:

1) Our savings will be reduced. It is thus good that we have savings with which to absorb costs when BR income is reduced, i.e. we can continue to spend as usual.

2) We should be concerned about whether Boundary Run entries will bounce back next year, as our savings are not infinite and costs continue to increase each year. It would be good if we can advertise in some way, both within the University and with the local public. I am not sure whether the public really know about the event (I was thanked yesterday by a member of the public who only learned about the Boundary Run a few years ago when I emailed my daughter's school to suggest that parents could enter to raise money for the school; on the other hand, I saw the event mentioned in a local paper because someone was running it to raise money for a charity).

Recommended action: advertise the Boundary run within the University and with the local public.
