During 2022 the Committee, together with the England Team Manager, were responsible for the selection of England Teams to participate in The UK Indoor Nationals and The International Blind Bowls Association World Championships to be held in Australia in March 2023.

This included the booking of accommodation and air tickets for a party of 26 bowlers, directors and management.

We also organised 2 indoor and 2 outdoor Tournaments throughout the year.
