Objectives and Activities

The objectives of the Group are as a Unit of the Scout Association.

The Aim of The Scout Association is to promote the development of young people in achieving their full physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potentials, as individuals, as responsible citizens and as members of their local, national and international communities.

The Group aims to contribute to the Aims of the Scout Association by delivering a programme of stimulating and educational activities to the young people that are its members.

The Group meets the Charities Commission public benefit criteria under both the advancement of education and the advance of citizenship or community development headings.

Achievements and performance

The year was dominated by COVID and lockdown and this greatly affected the Group. Scouting continued online, however the effect of lockdown was to reduce the number participating, particularly noticed in our Beaver pack. The decision was taken to temporarily close our Beaver pack due to the reduction in Beaver numbers.

During lockdowns, our Section leaders were able to provide a varied and fun programme of online meetings, including virtual camps, crafts, cooking and visiting speakers and educators. Outdoor meetings were held whenever lockdown rules allowed, providing our young members with much need outdoor fun.

Overall the Group made a profit of £24,848.79 compared to the prior year £3,167.20. At the year end the total cash assets were £30,329.85, of which £967.39 is held in an NS&I account.

The Scout Group made a surplus of £24,424.97 after the surplus of £7,167.20 in the previous year. The surplus was largely driven by the availability of local council grant funding, in the form of the Retail, Hospitality and Leisure and Grant Fund. This comprised five separate grants totalling £22,907.43.

Group fundraising came to £0, as a result of the restrictions placed on us by the coronavirus pandemic.

The HQ remained partially available for renting for educational purposes, and the hire by Cambridgeshire County Council for educating an excluded child continued until July 2021. This rental was for 5 days a week in term time and for 3.5 hours a day @£10 per hour. Income is invoiced on a monthly basis. We were unable during the pandemic to extend hire to other parties.

Group expenditure was down to £4,341.64, consisting of general running costs such as utilities, insurance and cleaning. Other expenses included insurance £347.52 and expenditure on the new HQ of £715.05.

The National Savings Account has been kept open, although there has been no interest statement from NS&I for the current year.

Scout receipts were £150.00, compared to £1,565.50 in the prior year. Income was generated solely by subscriptions, which were reduced during the pandemic to reflect the lower levels of activities and lack of face-to-face meetings available.

Cub receipts were £912 in subscriptions, compared to £1,645 in the prior year. Expenditure was reduced as a result of the restrictions, with total expenditure of £657.43.

Beavers subscriptions were £110.00. The Beavers spent £66.98 on activities. Following the reductions in Beavers numbers during the pandemic, and the difficulty in finding Beavers leaders, it was decided to close the Beaver pack, at least temporarily.

The scrutineer has stated that the accounts are in accordance with the records produced and comply with the constitution.

The Group formally wishes to thank Maya Yotova for acting as the Scrutineer for the accounts.
