

Chair's report CDRT May 2022/23

The year has been a successful one with activity at the Recreation Centre picking up again following the pandemic of the last few years.

The regular clubs continue to hold their meetings or sporting activities. These include: Village Club, Bowls, Table tennis, Motorbike club, Gardening club, Greensteps, skittles league (season2)

Several teams from Ash Rovers junior football club play their matches and train on the field in addition to using the facilities within the building.

This year we have hosted Yeovil Youth Theatre, Morris men, 2 summer BBQs, school sports day, Skool Beanz open gardens, football world cup sessions, Queen's jubilee and funeral and King Charles' coronation. The rec is increasingly popular venue for birthday celebrations, children's parties and wakes within the village.

The community market happens monthly for recycling, bring / buy with tea, coffee and cake for sale. The early bird monthly community get together session has now been replaced with a monthly village quiz night held Saturday evening.

Investments/ projects this year include a new chiller for the cellar the installation of toddler playground equipment. Trees, shrubs and bulbs have also been planted on the field which was carried out by volunteers from the rec committee, and environmental village group Greensteps. Help for funding these projects came from – Awards for All grant from the National Lottery, SSDC community grant, Parish council and Greensteps. Many thanks to all contributors for time and funds supplied.

The solar panels installed last year continue to contribute to the Rec's electricity supply – adjustments have been needed to maximise the efficiency of the panels.

The present committee have pulled together to make sure that the Recreation Centre continues to run safely and efficiently with necessary health and safety checks in place.

I would like to thank the committee for dedicating their time and skills to the Trust this year and look forward to another successful year in 2023/ 2024 with a new chairperson.
