TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2024

The Trustees, who are also the Directors of the Charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, present their report and independently-examined financial statements for the year ending 31 December 2024. The Trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" 2005 in preparing the annual report and accounts of the Charity.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing Document

The Charity is constituted as a Company limited by guarantee and is therefore governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association. In the event of the Company being wound up, members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.00. It is registered as a Charity with the Charity Commission under number 278856.

Appointment of Trustees

All the Directors of the Company are also Trustees of the Charity and there are no other Trustees. Details of all the Trustees who served during the year are set out on Page 1.

Organisation

The Company as a Charity is organised on an entirely voluntary basis and comprises a Council of Management.

Risk Management

The Directors have assessed the major risks to which the Charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the Charity and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the exposure to the major risks.

Objectives and Activities

Since 1983, the Charity's object and principal activity is to promote and encourage education in music and, for that purpose, to promote public competitions. The Charity's policy is to hold a biennial competition and in between to sponsor concert performances by other participants.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

The public benefit is the opportunity it gives to young classical music artists to further a career and it provides a means by which the public may enjoy the performances of these young artists at times freely and at other times with concessionary rates for pensioners and young people.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The net movement of funds for the year show a deficit of £6,255 (2024 a surplus of £11,298) which, together with the funds brought forward from 2023, give total funds of £35,622.

During the year we held our 2024 Competition which was a great success, attracting 142 entries, a record number. The section winners reflected the Competition's international reach, coming from China & Russia.

The number of entrants exceeded the capacity of the Competition, and we had to place some on a waiting list. For our next Competition in 2026 we are considering reviewing competitor videos to select entrants for the live performances.

INVESTMENT POLICY

The Charity pursues a policy of maximum capital security.



1 Accounting policies

PUBLIC BENEFIT

The public benefit is the opportunity it gives to young classical music artists to further a career and it provides a means by which the public may enjoy the performances of these young artists at times freely and at other times with concessionary rates for pensioners and young people.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The net movement of funds for the year show a deficit of £15,127 (2021 surplus of £4,016) which, together with the funds brought forward from 2021, give total funds of £30,579.

In April 2022 we held the first live Competition since the Covid outbreak. The Competition was a great success attracting 137 entries - a record number. Because of this some entries had to be placed on a waiting list, but in the event, most were able to compete. During the Competition both the Chair and one of the judges contracted Covid, but these problems were successfully managed.

The judges were impressed by the standard of the entrants. The section winners represented the international nature of the Competition - coming from Ukraine, Germany & USA. The piano section winner, at 17, was one of the youngest competitors.







NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2022

1 Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and in the preceding years.

a Basis of preparation of Financial Statements

The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards, including the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006.

b Fund Accounting

Unrestricted Funds are available for the use of, and at the discretion of, the Trustees in furtherance of the general activities of the Charity.

c Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the Charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. Donations and gifts are included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable.

Grants, when entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the Charity, are recognised when the Charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the Grant.

The income from fund-raising ventures is shown gross with associated costs included in the fund-raising costs.

Tax recoverable from Gift Aided income is included but recorded separately pending receipt from HMRC.

Investment income is included when received.

Donated services are included at the values to the Charity where this can be quantified.

The value of the services provided by Volunteers has not been included in these accounts

d Resources Expended

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis, inclusive of non-recoverable Value Added Tax.

Expenditure which is directly attributable to specific activities has been included in the related category. Where costs are attributable to more than one activity, they have been apportioned across the cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of these resources.

e Fixed Assets

None but would otherwise be stated at market value as at the date of the Balance Sheet and the Statement of Financial Activities would have included the net gains and losses arising on revaluations and disposals during the year.

f General

The Competition is intended to be biennial but is subject to Covid restrictions.
