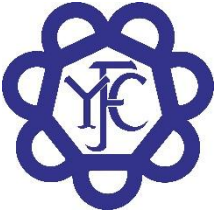

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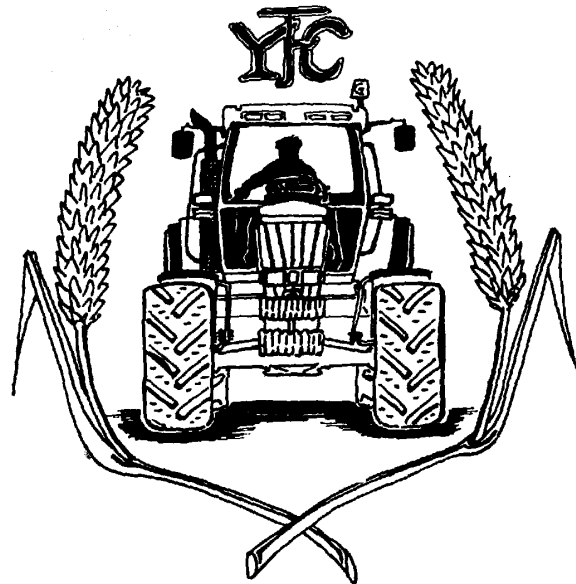


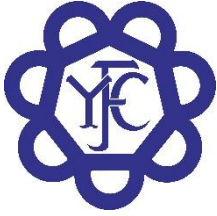

## 2 Structure, governance & management

### 2.1 Type of governing document

The club is constituted as an Unincorporated Association and governed by its constitution adopted on 21<sup>st</sup> March 1973 as amended on 29<sup>th</sup> April 2021.

## 2.2 Charitable objectives (objects)

The charity's objects ("objects") are:

- To advance the education of young members of the public at large in their knowledge of agriculture, crafts, life skills, rural affairs and country life.
- In the interests of the social welfare of such members to provide and promote the provision of facilities for recreation and other leisure time occupations, being facilities which will improve their conditions of life and will assist in the development of their spiritual and mental capacities, self-reliance and individual responsibility so that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of the community.

## 2.3 Trustee selection methods

There must be at least three charity trustees. In accordance with the Constitution, Trustees are appointed or re-appointed at a properly convened Annual General Meeting of the club members. In appointing Trustees due consideration is given to ensuring that the Trustees have, between them, the skills and experience necessary to manage the charity effectively and in accordance with charity law.

# 4 Achievements & performance

## 4.1 Outputs and outcomes for the charity's beneficiaries

2025 saw the club celebrate its 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Membership of 70 remains consistent with previous years and there is a varied range of weekly meetings for the senior club who meet on a Wednesday evening and the juniors who meet on the first Friday of the month. The 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary ball was an evening to celebrate the club with many ex-members attending while looking forward to the future of the members and the club. A special thank you to our sponsors; PC Channer Farms Ltd, Bucks Buildings Ltd, Kubota (UK) Ltd, Agrii and Mason Grab Hire in supporting both the 75<sup>th</sup> year celebrations and this year's club tops for the Country show.

PRYFC hosted the 2025 Buckinghamshire Country show, organised by a committee of thirty-three advisory, club members and supporters and kindly hosted by Lord Carrington at Manor Farm, Bledlow. A successful and enjoyable day enabling young farmers to learn



young farmers to the public. The club successfully won its home rally, making it the fourth year in a row.

Members remain active at County and National with several members representing the club and Buckinghamshire by competing at South East Area Spring Competitions achieving a first in football, second in netball and winning the After Dinner Speaking competition to the compete at National finals.



The junior Tug of War team came second at South East Area Summer Competition while the men's came first and competed at National the Tenbury show coming joint fifth.



At National, a Princes Risborough member, James Nixey was elected NFYFC Chair of Council being the first Buckinghamshire FYFC member to

become NFYFC chair and Sam Smith has been shortlisted in Entrepreneur of the Year 2025.

In April the club visited Landrake Young Farmers in Cornwall for a club exchange and look forward to hosting when they visit in September.



PRYFC continues to invest in members with seven members benefiting from the £150 CV enhancing grant. Four junior members completing a Lantra Tractor Driving 13-15 years old course, two members claimed it against the costs to pass their driving test and one for a telehandler course.

## How the public have benefitted

The charity recruits its members from the area surrounding Princes Risborough. Anyone aged 10 to 28 years can be a member of PRYFC to participate in activities and discussions that increase their knowledge of agriculture, crafts, rural affairs and country life.



Following the success of its first tractor run the 2024 Christmas charity tractor run had 300 tractors and commercial vehicles following a route through Thame, Chinnor, Princes Risborough, Longwick and Haddenham. With a wide community of volunteers to support holding the events the club thanks all involved including the sponsor K&A Scaffolding, Kingshills Estate Agent and Zurn Garford LLP. The event raised £15k split equally between Rennie Grove Peace Hospice and PACE who support children with neurological conditions like cerebral palsy.



The annual Christmas tree collection saw over 700 Christmas trees collected raising £6.9k for PACE. Adding the proceeds from the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary ball raffle, the club increased this amount to be able to present £8.2k to PACE. This continues the club's charitable activities having raised £44.7k over the last four years for Rennie Grove Peace Hospice £24.4k, RABI £4.6k and £15.7k for PACE.

The club also supported Lopemead Farm with Open Farm Sunday.

## 5 Financial review

### 5.1 Policy on reserves

The charity's policy on reserves is to generate and maintain a reserve which will allow sufficient funds to:

- a) maintain the financial viability of the charity in the event of unforeseen and/or unavoidable circumstance that brings a short-term fall in its income;
- b) to permit the charity, in the interests of meeting its charitable objectives, to from time to time establish a new and innovative project on a project basis to demonstrate the feasibility of such activities as a test to maintaining such projects on an on-going basis.

For these purposes the charity will endeavour to maintain reserves at a sufficient level as deemed appropriate by the trustees.

### 5.2 Principal sources of funding and outgoings

The key source of income comes from fundraising activities through the year. Members pay a subscription which covers the levies paid to County.

### 5.3 Remuneration of trustees

All trustees act in a voluntary capacity and receive no remuneration or other material benefits from their services to the charity.

Out-of-pocket expenses necessarily and reasonably incurred by trustees in promoting the purposes of the charity are reimbursed at cost and against receipt only.

### 5.4 Financial status

The charity's current resources from unrestricted membership subscriptions and annual fundraising activities meet its expenses. Forecasts are that this will remain the case for the foreseeable future.

### 5.5 Details of any funds materially in deficit

The charity has no funds which are materially in deficit.

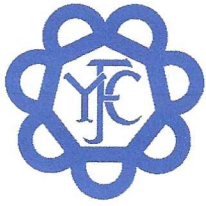

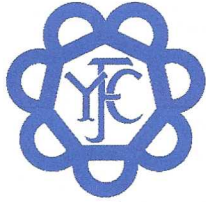

## 2 Structure, governance & management

### 2.1 Type of governing document

# 4 Achievements & performance

## 4.1 Outputs and outcomes for the charity's beneficiaries

2023 has been a busy year with an active range of weekly meetings for the senior club who meet on a Wednesday evening and the juniors who meet on the first Friday of the month.

Membership has increased with over 70 members making the club the largest in Buckinghamshire. Members are active at County and National with several members represented the club competing at South East area and National.



PRYFC Junior Tug of war team represented Buckinghamshire at National pulling at the Tenby show and at the GENSB 2024 International youth tug of war tournament.

Fundraising events held continue to be well supported with Bonfire and Fireworks evening, Bingo, and our annual Dinner Dance.

With lots of new members this year's Buckinghamshire Country Show was the first time they had experienced competing against other clubs in a range of competitions. Building on the success from previous years the club won the Country show for a third year in a row.



PRYFC continues to invest in members with members attending a first aid course. Four members benefited from the £150 CV enhancing grant with two junior members completing a Lantra Tractor Driving 13-15 years old course and two members claiming it against the costs to pass their driving test.



To end the year the club was a finalist in the British Young Farmers awards attending an awards ceremony at Cannon Hall. The judges commenting that the work the club has done to enhance the skills of



their members was impressive and helps to prepare them for life outside YFC. They were also impressed with the charity work and how the club had shown themselves to be a key part of the community.

### How the public have benefitted

The charity recruits its members from the area surrounding Princes Risborough. Anyone aged 10 to 28 years can be a member of PRYFC to participate in activities and discussions that increase their knowledge of agriculture, crafts rural affairs and country life.



In December 2023 the club hosted its first Christmas charity tractor run. With c225 tractors and commercial vehicles attending it raised £9.3k split equally between Rennie Grove Peace Hospice and Royal Agricultural Benevolent Institution (RABI).

Building on previous years, PRYFC collected over 600 Christmas trees raising £4.8k for Rennie Grove Peace Hospice. Adding the profits from the annual Dinner Dance raffle, the club increased this amount to be able to present £5.5k. Having raised over £17k over the last three years, Rennie Grove Peace Hospice named the club as a star supporter with an ambassador attending the club v advisory meeting to thank the members and provide information of how the money raised is used.



## 5 Financial review

### 5.1 Policy on reserves

The charity's policy on reserves is to generate and maintain a reserve which will allow sufficient funds to:

- a) maintain the financial viability of the charity in the event of unforeseen and/or unavoidable circumstance that brings a short-term fall in its income;
- b) to permit the charity, in the interests of meeting its charitable objectives, to from time to time establish a new and innovative project on a project basis to demonstrate the feasibility of such activities as a test to maintaining such projects on an on-going basis.

For these purposes the charity will endeavour to maintain reserves at a sufficient level as deemed appropriate by the trustees.

### 5.2 Principal sources of funding and outgoings

The key source of income comes from fundraising activities through the year. Members pay a subscription which covers the levies paid to County.

### 5.3 Remuneration of trustees

All trustees act in a voluntary capacity and receive no remuneration or other material benefits from their services to the charity.

Out-of-pocket expenses necessarily and reasonably incurred by trustees in promoting the purposes of the charity are reimbursed at cost and against receipt only.

The charity's current resources from unrestricted membership subscriptions and annual fundraising activities meet its expenses. Forecasts are that this will remain the case for the foreseeable future.
