The promotion of education and training in the art of profession of Journalism including the award of a fellowship to persons engaged in journalism in the British Isles, which currently gives them access to a placement at the Washington Post in Washington DC, and to undertake or execute any other exclusively charitable trusts or activities as shall further the objects of the trust.

**Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)**

The primary purpose of this charity is the promotion of education and training in the art of profession of Journalism.

This involves the award of one fellowship at the Washington Post to a person engaged in journalism throughout Britain. The fellowship comes in the form of a temporary placement offered by the Washington Post in Washington, DC, a stipend provided by the charity, and the reimbursement of the flights for the fellow.

This fellow is selected after an open application process that includes the submission of press clippings; this is open to any person who has written journalism in Britain. The panel of judges include journalists at the Washington Post and previous fellows.

The trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit. This charity benefits other defined groups.




