Objects and Public benefit resulting from the Trust's activities

The object of the Trust is the advancement of the Christian faith by providing funds to assist in extending, developing and maintaining the outreach of the Christian Church through spreading the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ in the world. These funds are distributed to various Christian societies and individual workers involved in this Gospel outreach, both in the UK and other parts of the world.

The Charity's Trustees have complied with the duty of Section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to Public Benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission.

Although several of these societies, their members and the individual workers in the course of their Christian service provide assistance on projects to relieve poverty, their proclamation of the Good News of Jesus Christ is where the over-riding and unique benefit arises. Those who respond positively to the Gospel by repenting and putting their trust in the Lord Jesus Christ receive the peace of forgiveness for all their sin, and they enter into a deep relationship with God which assures them of everlasting life with Him in Heaven throughout eternity.

Administration

The Trust has no employees. The Chairperson, Treasurer, Secretary and an Appointed Trustee handle its day-to-day administration. The Trustees met four times in 2025 to review the Trust's activities, identify projects to be supported through special appeals and to approve the distribution of the income received from other sources, if considered appropriate, in accordance with any requests expressed by the donors. The Trust is not a grant making Trust as that expression is usually interpreted, and does not solicit or invite applications for grants.

In 2025, other than committed funds falling due for payment within one year, 63% of the Trust's income was distributed as specifically requested by the donors ('restricted funds') compared with circa 43% in the previous year. The remaining income which was donated to the Trust for the Trustees to distribute as they saw fit ('unrestricted funds') was used to support Christian mission societies linked with Bishop Hannington Memorial Church, and Christian workers linked with that Church and serving outside the parish and, at the Trustees' discretion, to meet emergency requests and assist other projects.

Policy on reserves and powers of investment

The Trust Deed gives the Trustees unrestricted powers of investment. It is their normal policy to distribute the Trust's income on a regular basis and only retain a relatively small amount as reserves to meet any appropriate emergency requests for financial support. The Trust's reserves of restricted funds held on 31 December 2025 amounted to £3,871, the same amount at the end of the previous year.

The Trust has no capital assets.

Financial Review

Total income during 2025 decreased by circa 21% over the previous year to £48,349. Total expenditure relating to contributions to Christian societies and workers was £57,289 a reduction of circa 18% over 2024. Consequently, taking everything into consideration, total funds held at the end of the year were £11,673 compared with £20,758 at the end of 2024. Details of the amounts distributed to the various Christian societies and workers supported by the Trust during 2025 are set on Pages 9 and 10 to the accounts.

The distribution of the Trust's income may be classified under four broad categories of Christian outreach namely, overseas missionary service, evangelistic outreach in the UK, training for Christian service and Christian relief and development work overseas. On this basis, the Trust's income has been distributed:

The Trustees receive a full, written financial report at every meeting and the Trust's accounts and records are scrutinised by the Trust's Independent Examiner annually.

During the year under review, the Trustees have updated all of its Policy Statements.

The Trustees feel that the current controls and checks set in place are satisfactory for the collection of cash income and remittance of payments.

Future Plans

The Trustees intend to continue to encourage the members of Bishop Hannington Memorial Church to support, by prayer and giving, the work of spreading the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ outside the parish of that Church.

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" published in March 2005 and applicable accounting standards.

1.2 Fund accounting
