The Group is a trust established under its rules, which are common to all Scouts.

Trustees are appointed in accordance with the Policy, Organisation & Rules of the Scout Association.

The Group is managed by the Group Executive Committee, the members of which are the Charity Trustees of the Scout Group which is an educational charity. As charity trustees they are responsible for complying with legislation applicable to charities. This includes the registration, keeping proper accounts and making returns to the Charity Commission as appropriate.

The Group Executive Committee consists of three independent representatives, Chair, Treasurer and Secretary together with the Group Scout Leader, individual section leaders and parent's representation and meets regularly throughout the year.

The Group Executive Committee exists to support the Group Scout Leader in meeting the responsibilities of the appointments and is responsible for:

The maintenance of Group property;

The raising of funds and the administration of Group finance;

The insurance of persons, property and equipment;

Group public occasions;

Assisting in the recruitment of leaders and other adult support;

Appointing any sub committees that may be required; and

Appointing Group Administrators and Advisors other than those who are elected.

Risk and Internal Control

The Group has in place systems of internal controls that are designed to provide reasonable assurance against material mismanagement or loss; these include two signatories for all payments and comprehensive insurance policies to ensure that insurance risks are covered.

At the end of the year the Group held reserves amounting to £54,833 and the Executive Committee is looking at ways that the funds could be used to further support the individual sections. The Group considers it prudent to hold £20,000 of these reserves towards the imminent lease renewal (June 2024), equipment and tent replenishment and ongoing hut maintenance to extend its useful life.


Independent Examiner's Statement
