Structure, Governance and Management

The Exeter Division of the Guide Association is a branch of the Guide Association which was incorporated by Royal Charter. It is a registered charity (287550). The Exeter Division of the Guide Association is responsible for the administration of the Association's affairs within Exeter and some outlying areas, and for the general development of the principles, aims, organisation and rules of the Association in accordance with the Royal Charter and the Guiding Manual. It is headed by the Division Commissioner, who is the chair of the committee.

Members of the committee are appointed in accordance with the procedures established by the Devon County Guide Association. The charity trustees are the voting members of the committee. The trustees determine the general policy of the Exeter Division of the Guide Association. The day to day management is done by trustees and other volunteers.

Objectives and Activities for the Public Benefit

The Exeter Division of the Guide Association shares the aims of The Guide Association; to promote the education of girls and young women to help them develop emotionally, mentally, physically and spiritually so that they can make a positive contribution to their community.

To enable girls and young women to fulfil their potential to take an active and responsible role in society through its distinctive stimulating and enjoyable programme of activities delivered by trained volunteers. The trustees' policy is to see that the highest quality of care and instruction is available to the beneficiaries.

All adult members of Exeter Division are volunteers who willingly give their time to deliver and administer opportunities when running their part of Guiding i.e. unit, District or Division.

Achievements and Performance

At the annual subscription census in 2025 the Division had a total of 856 girls in Rainbows, Rainbow, Brownies, Guides, Rangers & Young Leaders sections and 190 adult leaders and unit volunteers.

During 2025 the Division held large scale events with a Thinking Day activity day at Haldon Racecourse for all and in September we all came together at Tawbottom for an activity day and an opportunity to say thank you to the outgoing Division Commissioner Joanne Shute.

The Rainbows went to Escot, The Brownies to Dartmoor Zoo and the Guides & Rangers went to Pax Lodge. The Rangers had a bowling evening and the Rainbows & Brownies did some Christmas craft and met Father Christmas.

The Ten Tors group completed their challenge and are working towards the 2026 challenge. The Young Leaders held a few meetings during the year.

All sections had the opportunity to attend residential events, held at Kenton Victory Hall or Grenville House.

The Exeter Scout & Guide shop passed on a profit of £3,370.33 during 2025 and we thank the team for all their work continued hard work. New volunteers always welcome.

Trefoil Lodge has continued to be well used by Guiding and community groups. The kitchen and toilets were repainted during the year.

Financial Review

The financial statements of Exeter Division Guides have been prepared in accordance with The Charities Act using the Receipts and Payments basis.

The results for the year and the financial position of the Exeter Division of the Guide Association are shown on the next page.

Total income was £51,101 (2024: £48,722). Expenditure was £44,973 (2024: £42,433), giving a net incoming of £6,128 (2024: incoming £6,289).

The charity maintains a general liquid reserve for Trefoil Lodge of £13,000 that is sufficient to cover one year's operating expenditure. The Division also holds a reserve of £20,000 for Exeter Division Guides which would be sufficient to cover one year's operating expenses and some event costs if cancelled.

During 2026, a building insurance valuation survey was done on Trefoil Lodge (cost of £750) and the property insurance premium were increased as a result. The property had not been revalued in the last 10 years.

At the end of the year a payment of rent was duplicate and subsequently refunded at the beginning of 2026.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees on the Financial Statements
