The managing committee present their report and the financial statements for the 12-month period ended 31 August 2024.

Governing Instrument

The charity was established under a constitution adopted at a meeting of the association held on 21 April 1970, as amended at various subsequent Annual General Meetings and is registered with the Charity commission no. 291212. The charity's address is Chestnut Lane, Amersham.

Objects, Organisation and Activities

The charity is established to advance the education of pupils in the schools and to assist in the provision of facilities for education in the schools.

The charity is organised as an independent association of parents with a managing committee comprising elected members. Activities include a variety of projects to raise funds to; "Purchase services and equipment requested by the schools' head teachers". Examples of the activities held in 2023/24 include the Christmas Fair, Family Fun Night, Summer fair and Sausage Sizzle. Income is also derived from a number of other regular sources such as commission on store voucher sales and Easy Fundraising.

Managing Committee members are elected or co-opted on an annual basis, with the officers being elected from the membership of the Managing Committee. The Annual General Meeting is normally held in October.

It was another full year of CLESA activities and events (Christmas Fair, Family Fun Night, Summer Fair)

CLESA would like to thank all parents who have donated their time and efforts to raise the net income of £18,352 (2022/23 £16,105)

The financial breakdown for the year is as follows:

- **£16,196** raised from events, including school lottery (88% of total)
- **£2,156** in commission from the sale of Tesco, John Lewis, Sainsbury's vouchers and Easy Fundraising (12% of total)

Please refer to the Statement of Financial Activities for the income and expenditure for the year.

The total net income generated of £18,352 is a slight increase from the prior year of £16,105. CLESA was able to run the Christmas fair which was not run in 2022/23 and that generated significant profit of £4,803. Unfortunately, no volunteers could be found to run the Camp out and Quiz night this year but these generate far lower profit (PY Camp out £409, PY Quiz night £612). The events making up this year's total are analysed in date order below:

- Children were delighted to have the **Christmas Fair** back in the diary with the very popular Grotto and Secret Santa. Claudia Burns-Snook ran this event with a new addition of an online raffle, run by Raffall. The fair generated a **very significant profit of £4,803** (PY: Nil)
- **Sausage Sizzle and Tea in-a-Box initiatives generated a profit of £2,188** (PY: £2,080) **as CLESA ran three of these events throughout the school year, one per term.** Debbie Wooff continues to run and coordinate Sausage Sizzle. Beth Guck, Fiona Breen and Fiona Jones ran the Tea in-a-Box initiatives throughout the year.
- **The Family Fun Night at Chestnut Lane and disco at Elangeni returned again this year and raised a huge £2,437** (PY: £2,379). Due to the popularity of this event, there were afternoon and evening sessions run at the schools this year. Pam Deering, Mandip Malhotra, Sarah Carroll and Gaelle Symons managed and ran this event.
- **The Summer Fair raised a hugely impressive £4,886** (PY: £4,360). The day was a great success with children and parents enjoying the many different stalls and falconry on display. The raffle proved to be a very good fundraiser. Helen Purchase, Nicola Flenley and Amy Magierek managed and ran this event with the help of many parent volunteers.
- **School Lottery is in its sixth year and generated a profit of £1,543** (PY: £1,720). This is a great fundraiser and is run by Melissa Osborne.
- **Easy Fundraising generated £614** (PY: £574). There are still only a limited number of parents signed up to the scheme which was run and marketed by Jo Benge. This scheme will be managed by Sally Hardcastle going forward.
- **Profits from the giftcard scheme/programme were £1,542** (PY: **£4,043**). Although this is much lower than last year, this figure includes 8 months of income vs 16 months of income in the prior year due to the timing of payments. On an accruals basis the commission income less fees has dropped from £2,845 to £2,403 for the academic year 2023/24. Parents have left the scheme as their children are school leavers and also as they prefer to online shop. We have not been able to attract the same number of new parents as have left the scheme. Giftcards are automatically credited on a monthly basis by Chalfont Education Ltd. Rates of commission are 4% across all companies in the scheme (Tesco, Sainsbury's, John Lewis). The gift card scheme was run by Lou Woolf during this financial period.

The expenditures of the two schools amounted to £7,814 (PY: £61,273). A number of exciting school projects were completed in the prior year, which accounts for the lower spend this year:

- Chestnut Lane spent **£7,772**. This included £6,090 on new Chromebooks and £980 on new devices for Tapestry as well as screen and device covers.
- Elangeni spent **£42** providing Sausage Sizzle meals to the children on free school meals. Last year Elangeni made large and exciting changes to their outdoor area including a multi-purpose gazebo for outdoor learning and new adventure play equipment. They want to continue to develop the play areas and are in discussions with contractors. We anticipate spend on this in the academic year 2024/5.

Funds available to the schools

- Chestnut Lane has £25,125 funds available
- Elangeni has £22,501 funds available

Balance Sheet

Net assets as at 31st August 2024 totalled £47,626 (PY: £37,087). The assets were made up of the balance of the bank accounts.

Comments:

- CLESA hopes to be able to continue to deliver a full programme of events in the next financial year, although this is dependant on more parent volunteers coming forward to run and manage the events.
- CLESA aim to spend approximately what they earn in the year in line with charitable goals. Elangeni spent considerably less than this in the current year as they completed some major projects totalling £43k last year. Expenditure will continue to be reviewed throughout the coming year and again at the next AGM to ensure funds are being used for the good of the charity / schools.

Appointment of the independent reviewer:

- Charities Commission require charities with over £25,000 of revenue to have an independent review. This threshold has been reached this year. Nigel Thompson CA was appointed as Independent Examiner in 2017 and has reviewed the 2024 accounts. With thanks to Nigel Thompson CA for his voluntary independent examination of these accounts.

It was another full year of CLESA activities and the first time that some events had been held since the Covid pandemic (Quiz Night, Family Fun Night)

CLESA would like to thank all parents who have donated their time and efforts to raise the net income of £16,105 (2021/22 £17,906)

The financial breakdown for the year is as follows:

- **£11,205** raised from events, including school lottery (70% of total)
- **£4,900** in commission from the sale of Tesco, John Lewis, Sainsbury's and M&S vouchers, Easy Fundraising and Amazon Smile (30% of total)

Please refer to the Statement of Financial Activities for the income and expenditure for the year.

The total net income generated of £16,105 is a slight decrease from the prior year of £17,906. Although CLESA held two events that had not been run since Covid (Quiz night and Family Fun Night), unfortunately no volunteers could be found to run the Christmas fair which always generates significant profit for CLESA (PY: £3,872). The events making up this year's total are analysed in date order below:

- **Sausage Sizzle and Tea in-a-Box initiatives generated a significant profit of £2,080 (PY: £2,371) as CLESA ran three of these events throughout the school year, one per term.** Debbie Wooff continues to run and coordinate Sausage Sizzle and Beth Guck and Fiona Breen continue to run Tea in-a-Box.
- **The Family Fun Night and disco at Elangeni returned this year and raised £2,379 (PY: £0).** The children were very excited to have this fundraiser back in the diary with all sessions sold out. Pam Deering, Mandip Malhotra, Gurjinder Bhandal-Dyson, Hannah Borthwick, Sarah Sharma and Gaelle Symons managed and ran this event.
- **The Quiz night was also back this year, raising £612 (PY: £0).** Parents enjoyed themselves at this child free event. Sally Hardcastle, Jo Rees and Taryn McCall managed and ran this event with the help of their quiz masters, Trudie Holt and Nicky Shaw.
- **The Summer Fair raised a hugely impressive £4,360 (PY: £4,476).** The day was a big success with many children and parents enjoying the great weather and entertainment. The raffle proved to be a very good fundraiser. Helen Purchase, Nicola Flenley and Amy Magierek managed and ran this event with the help of many parent volunteers.
- **The camp out raised £409 (PY: £923)** despite being cancelled due to bad weather. Parents still collected their food from the campsite and many donated their ticket prices to CLESA. The event was run by Alison Mifsud and Sally Welton.
- **School Lottery is in its fifth year and generated a profit of £1,720 (PY: £1,981).** Participation was slightly lower than the prior year. This is a great fundraiser and is run by Melissa Osborne.
- **Easy Fundraising generated £574 (PY: £539).** There are still only a limited number of parents signed up to the scheme which is run and marketed by Jo Bengé.
- **Amazon Smile raised income of £283 (PY: £242).** This was a scheme where Amazon donated 0.5% of the net price of all eligible purchases to CLESA if chosen as a customer's named charity. Unfortunately, Amazon discontinued this scheme on February 20th 2023. In May 2023 they gave CLESA a final one-off payment equivalent to an estimated six months of payments based on what CLESA had accrued in 2022. We expect no further payments from this scheme. Jo Bengé ran this scheme throughout the year.
- **Profits from the giftcard scheme/programme were £4,043 (PY: £3,418).** Although this is higher than last year, this figure includes 16 months of income due to the timing of payments. On an accruals basis the commission income has dropped to £2,845 for the academic year 2022/23. During the Covid pandemic some parents moved to online shopping and we have seen this trend continue. In April 2023 the % commission from M&S dropped from 5% to 2.5% so Chalfont Education Ltd decided it would no longer be part of the scheme. This caused a dip in income from May. Giftcards are automatically credited on a monthly basis by Chalfont Education Ltd. Rates of commission are 4% across all companies in the scheme (Tesco, Sainsbury's, John Lewis). The gift card scheme was run by Lou Woolf during this financial period.

The expenditures of the two schools amounted to £61,273 (PY: £20,708). At the end of last year there were considerable cash reserves that had been built up due to no spend in 2020/1 when CLESA was on sabbatical. The money has been spent on many exciting school projects detailed below:

- Chestnut Lane spent **£18,083**. This included £7,108 on new playground equipment, £10,800 on a new scooter park and the remainder on the Year 2 leaver's disco.
- Elangeni spent **£43,190**. This included £18,281 on a multi-purpose gazebo for outdoor learning, £22,458 on new adventure play equipment, £1,950 on workshops across multiple year groups and £500 on road safety reflectors for Chestnut Lane and Elangeni schools.

- Elangeni has £13,367 funds available

Comments:

- CLESA hopes to be able to continue to deliver a full programme of events in the next financial year, although this is dependant on more parent volunteers coming forward to run and manage the events.
- CLESA aim to spend approximately what they earn in the year in line with charitable goals. Both Chestnut Lane and Elangeni schools have spent considerable funds this year, helping to drive down the surplus of funds which CLESA had accumulated following CLESA's sabbatical. Expenditure will continue to be reviewed throughout the year and again at the next AGM to ensure funds are being used for the good of the charity / schools.
