REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2025

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2025. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

To preserve for the benefit of the inhabitants of the London Borough of Hackney and the nation at large whatever of the historical, architectural and constructional heritage may exist in and around the Borough in the form of buildings of particular beauty or historical interest

Public benefit

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to public benefit guidance published by the Commission in determining the activities undertaken by the charity.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The board of Trustees is pleased with the results of the charity during the year, enabling it to continue to manage two significant listed buildings, the Grade II listed Round Chapel and the Grade I St Augustine's Tower. We have seen a broad range of activities take place at the Round Chapel hosting food and drink festivals, civil marriages and wedding celebrations, film shoots, markets and concerts covering a wide range of music genres.

The Round Chapel has remained accessible to the local community through its work with schools, community groups and charities and by holding regular community dances.

The charity has continued to develop activities at St Augustine's Tower, which it manages and maintains via a lease from the owners, Hackney Council. This includes open days, school visits, recitals, talks and Santa's grotto.

The charity continues to make input from time to time into planning consultations, particularly where these involve the setting of the charity's heritage assets.

The Trustees and staff of the charity are grateful to the generosity of individuals and organisations who support the Trust. The Trustees acknowledge the contribution of the many volunteers who assist the Trust particularly in carrying out duties vital to the regular monthly opening of St Augustine's Tower.

Reserves policy

That the Trust shall regularly review its reserves policy and in any case quarterly with the production of management accounts comprising Income and Expenditure Account and Balance Sheet. The reserves policy has been developed to cope with two scenarios:

1. Where the hire income generated at the Round Chapel should drastically diminish for whatever reason and
2. That severe damage to the Round Chapel rendered the building unavailable and emergency repairs were needed. In both cases the trustees have determined that over and above the current liabilities of the Trust (the creditors) the organisation must retain £25,000 in reserve to allow for the winding-down and/or mothballing of all or most of the Trust's operations - and an additional £25,000 in reserve to pay for any emergency repairs.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Funds in Surplus

The Trustees consider the charity remains in a strong position to continue its activities during the coming year and that the charity assets are adequate to fulfil its obligations. The Board of Trustees is satisfied that the charity's assets in each fund are available and adequate to fulfil its obligations in respect of each fund.

Total income received in the year amounted to £196,868 (2024: £222,585) indicating a decrease of £25,717 over the previous year and resources expended were £216,513 (2024: £209,058), indicating an increase of £7,455 from previous year.

Funds carried forward as at year ended 31st March 2025 was £290,961 (2024: £310,606) all of which are unrestricted

FUTURE PLANS

The board of trustees will continue to re-invest funds in the maintenance and restoration of the Round Chapel. The Trust is developing an asset management plan to ensure that essential repairs and maintenance projects are carried out in a timely manner. Large restoration projects will require a big investment and the Trust is committed to protecting and restoring its property and will strive to generate sufficient reserves through hire income and fundraising. The charity has continued to explore opportunities for external funding for works at St Augustine's Tower, to update exhibitions and carry out remedial works.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Structure, Governance and Management

Hackney Historic Buildings Trust is a registered charity and private company incorporated on 22nd January 1985 and limited by guarantee. It has no share capital and is permitted to omit the word limited from its title. The governing document is the Limited Company Memorandum and Articles of Association. A management committee governs the work of the charity as the decision-making body, according to its governing document. The committee meets regularly. The senior management team report to the committee. The Trustees are regularly trained on their own role within the charity, including induction, and are kept fully up to date by the managers on important issues. With the forthcoming retirement of three long serving trustees the board is delighted to have attracted an impressive group of new trustees to ensure the continuity of the operations at the buildings in our care and to steer the Trust to a prosperous future.

Round Chapel

The Trust owns the freehold of a major Heritage Asset known as The Round Chapel on Lower Clapton Road, which is a Grade II* listed building, together with an adjoining cottage. The day to day running costs of the building are funded by the hire of the building and its facilities to local residents, community groups and private companies/individuals for both public and private events. The Cottage is let out to generate income. The buildings have a book value of £63,245 (which is carried in the accounts). The Trustees consider the actual value of the building, including the attached dwelling which brings in a rental income stream, to be substantially in excess of the acquisition cost. However, in current market conditions and bearing in mind the listed status of the property, the Trustees believe it would not be prudent to include a revaluation in the accounts and have opted to include this disclosure in the Trustees' Report rather than create a revaluation reserve that has neither certainty nor purpose.

St Augustine's Tower

The Trust cares for St Augustine's Tower which it leases from Hackney Council at a rent of £100 per annum and the lease runs for a period of 25 years from 3rd December 2004. Following a refurbishment project funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund and completed in 2006 the building is regularly open to the public. It is also used for educational visits, exhibitions and both public and private events.

Contribution of Volunteers

The charity has drawn upon the pool of volunteers without whom the level of work that it undertakes would be significantly reduced. The charity uses volunteers whenever necessary and appropriate for specific tasks and projects.

Risk management

The trustees have examined the business and operational risks the charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to lessen these risks.

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Hackney Historic Buildings Trust (THE) ('the Company')

I report to the charity trustees on my examination of the accounts of the Company for the year ended 31 March 2025.

Responsibilities and basis of report

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements and assessment of going concern

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Going Concern

The Board confirms that they would be in a position to operate for the next twelve months. For this reason, the accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Income

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, net of discounts and value added taxes. Turnover includes revenue earned from the rendering of services which are recognised by reference to the stage of completion of the contract. The stage of completion of a contract is measured by comparing the costs incurred for work performed to date to the total estimated contract costs.

Expenditure and irrecoverable vat

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Debtors

Basic financial assets, including trade and other debtors, are initially recognised at transaction price, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Such assets are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

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OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

To preserve for the benefit of the inhabitants of the London Borough of Hackney and the nation at large whatever of the historical, architectural and constructional heritage may exist in and around the Borough in the form of buildings of particular beauty or historical interest.

Public benefit

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to public benefit guidance published by the Commission in determining the activities undertaken by the charity.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The board of the Trustees is pleased with the results of the charity during the year, enabling it to continue to manage two significant listed buildings, the Grade II listed Round Chapel and the Grade I St Augustine's Tower. We have seen a broad range of activities take place at the Round Chapel hosting food and drink festivals, civil marriages and wedding celebrations, film shoots, markets and concerts covering a wide range of music genres.

The Round Chapel has remained accessible to the local community through its work with schools, community groups and charities and by holding regular community dances.

The charity has continued to develop activities at St Augustine's Tower, which it manages and maintains via a lease from the owners, Hackney Council. This includes open days, school visits, recitals, talks and Santa's grotto.

The charity continues to make input from time to time into planning consultations, particularly where these involve the setting of the charity's heritage assets.

The Trustees and staff of the charity are grateful to the generosity of individuals and organisations who support the Trust. The Trustees acknowledge the contribution of the many volunteers who assist the Trust particularly in carrying out duties vital to the regular monthly opening of St Augustine's Tower.

Reserves policy

That the Trust shall regularly review its reserves policy and in any case quarterly with the production of management accounts comprising Income and Expenditure Account and Balance Sheet. The reserves policy has been developed to cope with two scenarios:

1. Where the hire income generated at the Round Chapel should drastically diminish for whatever reason and
2. That severe damage to the Round Chapel rendered the building unavailable and emergency repairs were needed. In both cases the trustees have determined that over and above the current liabilities of the Trust (the creditors) the organisation must retain £25,000 in reserve to allow for the winding-down and/or mothballing of all or most of the Trust's operations - and an additional £25,000 in reserve to pay for any emergency repairs.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Funds in Surplus

The Trustees consider the charity remains in a strong position to continue its activities during the coming year and that the charity assets are adequate to fulfil its obligations. The Board of Trustees is satisfied that the charity's assets in each fund are available and adequate to fulfil its obligations in respect of each fund.

Total income received in the year amounted to £222,585 (2023: £222,810) indicating a decrease of £225 over the previous year, and resources expended were £209,058 (2023: £195,098), indicating an increase of £13,960 from previous year.

Funds carried forward as at year ended 31st March 2024 was £310,606 (2023: £297,079) all of which are unrestricted.

FUTURE PLANS

The board of trustees will continue to re-invest funds in the maintenance and restoration of the Round Chapel. The Trust is developing an asset management plan to ensure that essential repairs and maintenance projects are carried out in a timely manner. Large restoration projects will require a big investment and the Trust is committed to protecting and restoring its property and will strive to generate sufficient reserves through hire income and fundraising. The charity has continued to explore opportunities for external funding for works at St Augustine's Tower, to update exhibitions and carry out remedial works.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Structure, Governance and Management

Hackney Historic Buildings Trust is a registered charity and private company incorporated on 22nd January 1985 and limited by guarantee. It has no share capital and is permitted to omit the word limited from its title. The governing document is the Limited Company Memorandum and Articles of Association. A management committee governs the work of the charity as the decision-making body, according to its governing document. The committee meets regularly. The senior management team report to the committee. The Trustees are regularly trained on their own role within the charity, including induction, and are kept fully up to date by the managers on important issues.

Round Chapel

The Trust owns the freehold of a major Heritage Asset known as The Round Chapel on Lower Clapton Road, which is a Grade II* listed building, together with an adjoining cottage. The day to day running costs of the building are funded by the hire of the building and its facilities to local residents, community groups and private companies/individuals for both public and private events. The Cottage is let out to generate income. The buildings have a book value of £63,245 (which is carried in the accounts). The Trustees consider the actual value of the building, including the attached dwelling which brings in a rental income stream, to be substantially in excess of the acquisition cost. However, in current market conditions and bearing in mind the listed status of the property, the Trustees believe it would not be prudent to include a revaluation in the accounts and have opted to include this disclosure in the Trustees' Report rather than create a revaluation reserve that has neither certainty nor purpose.

St Augustine's Tower

The Trust cares for St Augustine's Tower which it leases from Hackney Council at a rent of £100 per annum and the lease runs for a period of 25 years from 3rd December 2004. Following a refurbishment project funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund and completed in 2006 the building is regularly open to the public. It is also used for educational visits, exhibitions and both public and private events.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements and assessment of going concern

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Going Concern

The Board confirms that they would be in a position to operate for the next twelve months. For this reason, the accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Income

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, net of discounts and value added taxes. Turnover includes revenue earned from the rendering of services which are recognised by reference to the stage of completion of the contract. The stage of completion of a contract is measured by comparing the costs incurred for work performed to date to the total estimated contract costs.

Expenditure and irrecoverable vat

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Debtors

Basic financial assets, including trade and other debtors, are initially recognised at transaction price, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Such assets are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

The board of the Trustees is pleased with the results of the charity during the year, enabling it to continue to manage two significant listed buildings, the Grade II listed Round Chapel and the Grade I St Augustine's Tower. We have seen a broad range of activities take place at the Round Chapel hosting food and drink festivals, civil marriages and wedding celebrations, film shoots, markets and concerts covering a wide range of music genres.

The Round Chapel has remained accessible to the local community through its work with schools, community groups and charities and by holding regular community dances.

The charity has continued to develop activities at St Augustine's Tower, which it manages and maintains via a lease from the owners, Hackney Council. This includes open days, school visits, recitals, talks and Santa's grotto.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Funds in Surplus

The Trustees consider the charity remains in a strong position to continue its activities during the coming year and that the charity assets are adequate to fulfil its obligations. The Board of Trustees is satisfied that the charity's assets in each fund are available and adequate to fulfil its obligations in respect of each fund.

Total income received in the year amounted to £222,810 (2022: £221,461) indicating an increase of £1,349 over the previous year, and resources expended were £195,098 (2022: £182,410), indicating an increase of £12,688 from previous year.

Funds carried forward as at year ended 31st March 2023 was £297,079 (2022: £269,367) all of which are unrestricted.

FUTURE PLANS

The board of Trustees will continue to re-invest funds in the maintenance and restoration of the Round Chapel. The Trust is developing plans for works including re-roofing the Round Chapel and re-instating heating in the building. These will require a big investment and the Trust is committed to protecting and restoring its property and will strive to generate sufficient reserves through hire income and fundraising. The charity has continued to explore opportunities for external funding for works at St Augustine's Tower to update exhibitions and carry out remedial works.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Structure, Governance and Management

Hackney Historic Buildings Trust is a registered charity and private company incorporated on 22nd January 1985 and limited by guarantee. It has no share capital and is permitted to omit the word limited from its title. The governing document is the Limited Company Memorandum and Articles of Association. A management committee governs the work of the charity as the decision-making body, according to its governing document. The committee meets regularly. The senior management team report to the committee. The Trustees are regularly trained on their own role within the charity, including induction, and are kept fully up to date by the managers on important issues.

Round Chapel

The Trust owns the freehold of a major Heritage Asset known as The Round Chapel on Lower Clapton Road, which is a Grade II* listed building, together with an adjoining cottage. The day to day running costs of the building are funded by the hire of the building and its facilities to local residents, community groups and private companies/individuals for both public and private events. The Cottage is let out to generate income. The buildings have a book value of £63,245 (which is carried in the accounts). The Trustees consider the actual value of the building, including the attached dwelling which brings in a rental income stream, to be substantially in excess of the acquisition cost. However, in current market conditions and bearing in mind the listed status of the property, the Trustees believe it would not be prudent to include a revaluation in the accounts and have opted to include this disclosure in the Trustees' Report rather than create a revaluation reserve that has neither certainty nor purpose.

St Augustine's Tower

The Trust cares for St Augustine's Tower which it leases from Hackney Council at a rent of £100 per annum and the lease runs for a period of 25 years from 3rd December 2004. Following a refurbishment project funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund and completed in 2006 the building is regularly open to the public. It is also used for educational visits, exhibitions and both public and private events.

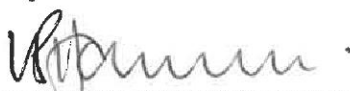

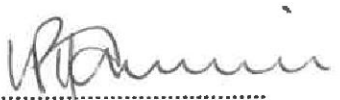
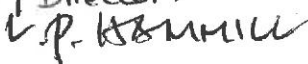

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements and assessment of going concern

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Going Concern

The Board confirms that they would be in a position to operate for the next twelve months. For this reason, the accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Income

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, net of discounts and value added taxes. Expenditure and irrecoverable vat

Total income received in the year amounted to £221,461 217,396 (2021: £170,789) indicating an increase of £50,672 over the previous year, and resources expended were £182,410 (2021: £206,531), indicating a reduction of £24,121 from previous year.

Funds carried forward as at year ended 31st March 2022 was £269,367 (2021: £230,316).

FUTURE PLANS

The board of Trustees will continue to re-invest funds in the maintenance and restoration of the Round Chapel. The Trust is developing plans for works including re-roofing the Round Chapel and re-instating heating in the building. These will require a big investment and the Trust is committed to protecting and restoring its property and will strive to generate sufficient reserves through hire income and fundraising. The charity has continued to explore opportunities for external funding for works at St Augustine's Tower to update exhibitions and carry out remedial works.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Structure, Governance and Management

Hackney Historic Buildings Trust is a registered charity and private company incorporated on 22nd January 1985 and limited by guarantee. It has no share capital and is permitted to omit the word limited from its title. The governing document is the Limited Company Memorandum and Articles of Association. A management committee governs the work of the charity as the decision-making body, according to its governing document. The committee meets regularly. The senior management team report to the committee. The Trustees are regularly trained on their own role within the charity, including induction, and are kept fully up to date by the managers on important issues.

Round Chapel

The Trust owns the freehold of a major Heritage Asset known as The Round Chapel on Lower Clapton Road, which is a Grade II* listed building, together with an adjoining cottage. The day to day running costs of the building are funded by the hire of the building and its facilities to local residents, community groups and private companies/individuals for both public and private events. The Cottage is let out to generate income. The buildings have a book value of £63,245 (which is carried in the accounts). The Trustees consider the actual value of the building, including the attached dwelling which brings in a rental income stream, to be substantially in excess of the acquisition cost. However, in current market conditions and bearing in mind the listed status of the property, the Trustees believe it would not be prudent to include a revaluation in the accounts and have opted to include this disclosure in the Trustees' Report rather than create a revaluation reserve that has neither certainty nor purpose.

St Augustine's Tower

The Trust cares for St Augustine's Tower which it leases from Hackney Council at a rent of £100 per annum and the lease runs for a period of 25 years from 3rd December 2004. Following a refurbishment project funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund and completed in 2006 the building is regularly open to the public. It is also used for educational visits, exhibitions and both public and private events.

Contribution of Volunteers

The charity has drawn upon the pool of volunteers without whom the level of work that it undertakes would be significantly reduced. The charity uses volunteers whenever necessary and appropriate for specific tasks and projects.

Risk management

The trustees have examined the business and operational risks the charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to lessen these risks.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements and assessment of going concern

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Going Concern and Implication of Covid-19

With the easing off of Covid restrictions, the Trust started to operate at an increasing capacity which enabled the Trust to secure further additional income.

As a result of this, the Board confirms that they would be in a position to operate for the next twelve months.

For the above reasons, the accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Income

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, net of discounts and value added taxes. Turnover includes revenue earned from the rendering of services which are recognised by reference to the stage of completion of the contract. The stage of completion of a contract is measured by comparing the costs incurred for work performed to date to the total estimated contract costs.

Expenditure and irrecoverable vat

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Debtors

Basic financial assets, including trade and other debtors, are initially recognised at transaction price, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Such assets are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

Creditors

Basic financial liabilities, including trade and other creditors, loans from third parties and loans from related parties, are initially recognised at transaction price, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Such instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

To preserve for the benefit of the inhabitants of the London Borough of Hackney and the nation at large whatever of the historical, architectural and constructional heritage may exist in and around the Borough in the form of buildings of particular beauty or historical interest.

Public benefit

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to public benefit guidance published by the Commission in determining the activities undertaken by the charity.

Going Concern and Impact of Covid 19

Given the huge impact the Sars-Cov2 pandemic had on the events industry and heritage sector, the board of trustees are pleased with the financial result for the year ending 31st March 2021. Through prudent financial management, appropriate use of the Job Retention Scheme, significant grant support via local government administered schemes and from the National Lottery Heritage Fund together with an entrepreneurial spirit and preparedness meant that Hackney Historic Buildings Trust as an entity, its properties and its finances remained in good shape.

The Round Chapel was used extensively as a location facility for various productions when it was unable to open to the public. Concerts and markets took place when they could, bringing welcome relief to our communities in between lockdowns. St Augustine's Tower was unable to open during the year.

The charity continues to make input from time to time into planning and consultations.

As a result of the above, we confirm that the Organisation would be operating as a going concern for the next twelve months.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The board of the Trustees is pleased with the results of the work of the charity during the year enabling it to continue to manage two significant listed buildings, the Round Chapel, listed II*, and the Grade I St Augustine's Tower. We have seen an exceptional range of activities take place at the Round Chapel hosting food and drink festivals, civil marriages and wedding celebrations, film shoots, markets and concerts covering a wide range of music genres.

The Round Chapel has remained accessible to the local community through its work with schools, community groups and charities and by holding regular community dances.

The charity has continued to develop activities at St Augustine's Tower, which it manages and maintains via a lease from the owners, Hackney Council. This includes open days, school visits, talks and Santa's grotto. During the year a successful programme of artistic residencies commenced at the Tower.

The charity continues to make input from time to time into planning consultations, particularly where these involve the setting of the charity's heritage assets.

The Trustees and staff of the charity are grateful to the generosity of individuals and organisations who support the Trust. The Trustees acknowledge the contribution of the many volunteers who assist the Trust particularly in carrying out duties vital to the regular opening of St Augustine's Tower.

The Trustees consider the charity remains in a strong position to continue its activities during the coming year and that the charity assets are adequate to fulfil its obligations.

Reserves policy

The Trustees aim to maintain reserves to enable it to meet its objectives.

Funds in Deficit

The Board of Trustees is satisfied that the charity's assets in each fund are available and adequate to fulfil its obligations in respect of each fund.

Total income received in the year amounted to £170,789 (2020: £220,535) indicating a fall of £49,746 from the previous year, and resources expended were £206,531 (2020: £236,580), indicating a reduction of £30,049 from previous year.

Funds carried forward as at year ended 31st March 2021 was £230,316 (2020: £266,058).

FUTURE PLANS

The board of Trustees will continue to re-invest funds in the maintenance and restoration of the Round Chapel. The Trust is developing plans for works including re-roofing the Round Chapel and re-instating heating in the building. These will require a big investment and the Trust is committed to protecting and restoring its property and will strive to generate sufficient reserves through hire income and fundraising. The charity has continued to explore opportunities for external funding for works at St Augustine's Tower to update exhibitions and carry out remedial works.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Structure, Governance and Management

Hackney Historic Buildings Trust is a registered charity and private company incorporated on 22nd January 1985 and limited by guarantee. It has no share capital and is permitted to omit the word limited from its title. The governing document is the Limited Company Memorandum and Articles of Association. A management committee governs the work of the charity as the decision making body, according to its governing document. The committee meets regularly. The senior management team report to the committee. The Trustees are regularly trained on their own role within the charity, including induction, and are kept fully up to date by the managers on important issues.

Round Chapel

The Trust owns the freehold of a major Heritage Asset known as The Round Chapel on Lower Clapton Road, which is a Grade II* listed building, together with an adjoining cottage. The day to day running costs of the building are funded by the hire of the building and its facilities to local residents, community groups and private companies/individuals for both public and private events. The Cottage is let out to generate income.

The buildings have a book value of £63,245 (which is carried in the accounts). The Trustees consider the actual value of the building, including the attached dwelling which brings in a rental income stream, to be substantially in excess of the acquisition cost. However, in current market conditions and bearing in mind the listed status of the property, the Trustees believe it would not be prudent to include a revaluation in the accounts, and have opted to include this disclosure in the Trustees' Report rather than create a revaluation reserve that has neither certainty nor purpose.

St Augustine's Tower

The Trust cares for St Augustine's Tower which it leases from Hackney Council at a rent of £100 per annum and the lease runs for a period of 25 years from 3rd December 2004. Following a refurbishment project funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund and completed in 2006 the building is regularly open to the public. It is also used for educational visits, exhibitions and both public and private events.

Contribution of Volunteers

The charity has drawn upon the pool of volunteers without whom the level of work that it undertakes would be significantly reduced. The charity uses volunteers whenever necessary and appropriate for specific tasks and projects.

Risk management

The trustees have examined the business and operational risks the charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to lessen these risks.

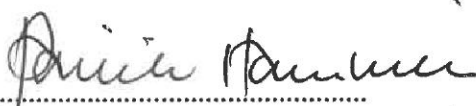

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements and assessment of going concern

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Going Concern and Implication of Covid-19

Although the Trust has been impacted by the Pandemic, the Board of Trustees is confident that the Organisation has sufficient fundings to carry on their charitable objectives. They are abiding with the government rules and regulations and are taking all advantages of various schemes provided by the Government. The Organisation is also considering various prospective projects as an alternative to secure further income. As a result of this, the Board confirms that they would be in a position to operate for the next twelve months.

For the above reasons, the accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Income

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, net of discounts and value added taxes. Turnover includes revenue earned from the rendering of services which are recognised by reference to the stage of completion of the contract. The stage of completion of a contract is measured by comparing the costs incurred for work performed to date to the total estimated contract costs.

Expenditure and irrecoverable vat

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Debtors

Basic financial assets, including trade and other debtors, are initially recognised at transaction price, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Such assets are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

Creditors

Basic financial liabilities, including trade and other creditors, loans from third parties and loans from related parties, are initially recognised at transaction price, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Such instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
