Structure, Governance and Management

The group is constituted as an unincorporated association and is governed by the Royal Charter of the Scout Association, originally dated 4th January 1912.

The Trustee Board meets quarterly, or more often as required. The day to day operation of the Group is undertaken by volunteers led by the Group Lead Volunteer.

The Group manages its own premises, and the Trustee Board continues to ensure that the building is fit for purpose.

Trustees are appointed by the Scout Council at an Annual General Meeting following an open selection process or, exceptionally, nomination. Trustees may also be co-opted onto the Board if particular skills or knowledge are required.

Objectives and Activities

224th North London Scout Group operates to promote the development of young people in achieving their full physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potential as individuals, as responsible citizens and as members of their local, national and international communities.

The main activities of the Group are regular meetings for young people as Scouts, Cubs or Beavers together with occasional outside activities.

The trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

No funds are held as custodian trustees on behalf of others.

Achievements and Performance

The activities and events described below provided our young people with a diverse range of experiences, fostering skills, teamwork, and a sense of adventure. Each term was filled with opportunities for growth, learning, and fun, ensuring a memorable and enriching year.

Spring 2024: a vibrant term packed with varied activities that kept our young people engaged and learning. We kicked off with the Cubs exploring astronomy and the Scouts developing life skills such as emergency aid. We also enjoyed a fun and educational science night with Dr Andrew S.

Pancake cooking added a delicious twist to the term, and we took part in an amphibian survey at Scout Park to see if there were any crested newts or other water-based wildlife. The term wrapped up with air rifle and clay pigeon activities, as well as a thrilling session in a professional flight simulator to test our budding pilots.

Our Beavers restarted on Saturdays in April with an Easter hunt and the chance to make new friends. We had an amazing 15 Beavers in our first session and the numbers remained good.

Summer 2024: a term of exploration and outdoor fun. The Scouts had a go at parascending, and although we planned gliding and micro-gliding, the weather didn't cooperate on those dates. A highlight was spending the night on HMS Cavalier, a C-class destroyer from WW2.

All sections had a visit from the police, where they learned about personal safety through the "Clever Never Goes" initiative. The Cubs also worked with BASC to build duck nests.

At the East Finchley Festival, our young people gave back to the community by helping with litter picking. We ended the term by practising essential camping skills and enjoying archery and air rifle sessions – all in preparation for the District Camp. Our AGM and BBQ brought everyone together to celebrate the term's achievements.

Autumn 2024: in this term our Scouts focused on navigation skills to prepare for the District Expedition Camp and also visited the National Space Centre as part of a new badge launch. They took part in the always-popular scuba diving session, learning new skills and building teamwork.

The Cubs had a fun Halloween camp at Thriftwood, and the Beavers completed their Science badge while making new friends. The Beavers learnt about animals and finished the term with a trip to freightliners farm.

And finally, a Cub achieved the Chief Scout Silver Award and one of our Scouts achieved the Chief Scout Gold Award. A great achievement for them and also for the group.

In summary 2024 has been a testament to our Scouts' enthusiasm, resilience, and strong community spirit. Here's to even more adventures and achievements in the year ahead!

Financial Review

Summary of Scouting and Support Activities

The year has seen continued growth in expenditure on scouting activities. Subscription income has also risen and together with Gift Aid and activity contributions, provided a surplus of just over £1,000 on scouting activities.

In order to support and expand the range of activities offered, the group bought a minibus early in the year. The cost of just under £50,000 was met from accumulated cash balances and a loan for approximately £28,000.

Significant work was undertaken to maintain and upgrade the scout hut during the year leading to a deficit of approaching £3,000 on overall scout hut and other activities.

The combined balance of the Group's current account and reserve account at year end stood at £13,264. The reduction from circa £44,000 was due primarily to the purchase of the minibus.

Income

The main income sources were subscriptions and contributions to activities from Cubs, Beavers and Scouts, as well as contributions from Ladybird Montessori and others who use the Scout Hut facilities for their activities. Subs, associated Gift Aid and activity contributions amounted to £21,082 and contributions from the other users were £16,561.

Expenditure

The Group spent £19,947 on scouting activities including Scout District membership fees of £4,235. Expenditure to support the Group (excluding the minibus) was £19,499.

Assets & Liabilities

The accounts show that we began the year with a current account balance of £36,927 and ended with a balance of £4,556. The reduction was due primarily to the purchase of a minibus for £43,693. £27,987 of the cost was funded by a loan on which the repayments during the year totalled £5,130. The loan outstanding at the end of the year (including up-front finance charges) was £31,425.


The balance on the reserve bank account was £8,708 at the end of the year. This reserve relates primarily to potential relocation costs which are contingent on any ground rent settlement with London Borough of Haringey. In addition, amounts are being provided to cover the future costs of replacing the minibus and maintaining the roof of the scout hut.

In addition to motor insurance for the minibus, insurance is in place to cover the scout hut buildings and contents relating to scouting activities.

Financial Review

Summary of Scouting and Support Activities

Scouting activities have continued to recover from the impact of Covid-19 and have attained pre-pandemic levels with costs and contributions well-balanced. The level of subscriptions has risen and comfortably exceeds the contribution to the Scout District.

Non-Scouting activities generated a surplus of £451 after recognising the costs of refurbishing the kitchen in December 2022.

The combined balance of the Group's current account and ground rent reserve account at year end stood at £44,027, an increase of £4,067 over the year.

Income

The main income sources were subscriptions and contributions to activities from cubs, beavers and scouts, as well as contributions from Ladybird Montessori and others who use the Scout Hut and facilities for their activities. Subs and activity contributions amounted to £19,190 and contributions from the other users were £14,105.

Expenditure

The Group spent £15,574 on scouting activities including Scout District membership fees of £2,959. Expenditure to support the Group was £13,749, which included insurance costs of £1,598. Costs of £7,421 to refurbish the kitchen were incurred in December 2022 and are included in these Accounts.

Assets & Liabilities

The accounts show that we began the year with a current account balance of £32,934 and ended with a balance of £36,927. This reserve, which is broadly in line with annual expenditure, is maintained in order to provide flexibility to cater for unexpected fluctuations in the income or expenditure of the Group. The savings account held with the intention of providing a ground rent reserve had opening and closing balances of £7,026 and £7,100 respectively; the increase arose from interest received over the year.


