The Trustees are pleased to present their report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 August 2022.

Objectives and Activities

The objectives of the Charity are to advance the education of the pupils of John Hampden Grammar School (JHGS) by raising money from parents, guardians and former pupils, and providing or assisting in the provision of educational and related facilities, in augmentation of such facilities financed by annual government funding.

The charity undertakes various fundraising activities within the school community. All activities are planned in conjunction with the management of the school as a whole and in this regard the Trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on Public Benefit.

Achievements and Performance

Donations from parents to the general fund and the fund designated for refurbishment of the science laboratories totalled almost £63,000.

The Fund has continued to support the school by donating £18,000 to support the counselling service.

Financial Review

Restricted income includes donations received for the upgrade of science laboratories, which together with Gift Aid totalled £1,703. General donations and associated Gift Aid contributed £61,267.

Direct Charitable Expenditure of £18,915 includes the donations to JHGS of £18,000 as noted above and external professional and administrative fees of £915.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Charity was constituted by a Declaration of Trust on 20 May 1986 and was registered as a charity under number 296155 on 24 February 1987. The Constitution was revised and was adopted by the Trustees on 4 March 2016.

Under the constitution, the Trustees are the Headteacher of John Hampden Grammar School, the Chair of the Governing Body, a Parent Governor, and a Staff representative from the School. The Chair of the Board of Trustees is the Headteacher.



Reserves

The reserves policy has been determined in accordance with the perceived future needs of the school to help balance annual variations in Government revenue funding that arise from fluctuations in pupil numbers, and to enhance the funding of capital projects. It is hoped that the level of reserves will increase during 2022/2023 following a fundraising initiative.

At 31 August 2022, reserves were £73,852 (2021: £29,790), comprising general funds of £69,023 (2021: £26,664) and restricted funds of £4,829 (2021: £3,126).

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2022

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of The John Hampden Grammar School Fund (the charity)

I report to the charity Trustees on my examination of the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 August 2022.

Responsibilities and Basis of Report

As the Trustees of the charity you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ('the 2011 Act').

I report in respect of my examination of the charity's accounts carried out under section 145 of the 2011 Act and in carrying out my examination I have followed the applicable Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act.

Independent Examiner's Statement



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2022

1. Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) - Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

The John Hampden Grammar School Fund meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102.

1.2 Income

All income is recognised once the charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

1.3 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is classified by activity. The costs of each activity are made up of the total of direct costs and shared costs, including support costs involved in undertaking each activity. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs which contribute to more than one activity and support costs which are not attributable to a single activity are apportioned between those activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Central staff costs are allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges allocated on the portion of the asset's use.

Expenditure on charitable activities is incurred on directly undertaking the activities which further the charity's objectives, as well as any associated support costs.

All expenditure is inclusive of irrecoverable VAT.

1.4 Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount after any trade discount offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

1.5 Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash and short-term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

1.6 Liabilities and provisions

Liabilities are recognised when there is an obligation at the Balance sheet date as a result of a past event, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefit will be required in settlement, and the amount of the settlement can be estimated reliably.

Liabilities are recognised at the amount that the charity anticipates it will pay to settle the debt or the amount it has received as advanced payments for the goods or services it must provide.

Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation. Where the effect of the time value of money is material, the provision is based on the present value of those amounts, discounted at the pre-tax discount rate that reflects the risks specific to the liability. The unwinding of the discount is recognised in the Statement of financial activities as a finance cost.

1. Accounting policies (continued)

1.7 Financial instruments

The charity only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value with the exception of bank loans which are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

1.8 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The costs of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

2. Critical accounting estimates and areas of judgment

Estimates and judgments are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Critical accounting estimates and assumptions:

There were no critical areas of judgment or accounting estimates involved in preparing the accounts.

12. Related party transactions
