The Trustees present their Annual Report together with the Financial Statements for the year ended 30th September 2022 which have been independently examined.

Who We Are

We are a registered charity. We were registered on 2nd October 1968. Our governing Document is a Scheme dated 21st July 1967.

What We Do

We maintain the Village Hall to a high standard for use by all villagers. We organise fund raising activities to augment the letting fees and to provide funds for future improvements.

What We Will Do

We will continue to ensure that the hall is maintained to a high standard.
We will also continue to raise funds for the maintenance of the Village Hall.

Financial Review

At the end of the financial year the general fund had a balance of £35,355. Of this sum the committee has resolved to set aside £10,000 as a reserve for unforeseen eventualities.

The balance is designated for future Hall Maintenance.

Restricted funds at the end of the year amounted to £309, being balance of £500. grant from a previous year (2015) for planting the landscaped plot at the side of the new vehicle exit. It will be used for ongoing maintenance of this area.

Reserves Policy

As stated in the previous note the committee considers that reserves amounting to £10,000 should be retained in order to meet running costs in the event that future income reduces.
