TRUSTEES AND GOVERNANCE

The Executive Committee consists of elected and co-opted members, the majority of whom are over 18 years of age and who are Trustees of the charity. Those people who served as executive committee members during the period covered by this report, and not listed above, were as follows: Miss N Chapman, Mr B Collins, Miss E Freeman, Mr I Jerney, Mrs A Keable, Mr E Keable, Mr A Lawrence, Mr J Manning, Miss C Plank, Miss R Reynolds, Mr S Rose, Mr J Sewell, Miss A Snelling, Mrs S Stanley, Miss G Tuggey, Mr S Webber, Miss Z Webber, Mrs C West and Miss F Waite.

Any Executive Committee member under 18 years of age is not entitled to vote on matters, which affect the management of the Charity. Members of the Executive Committee are appointed as follows:

- Elected members – each Member Club elects annually, three representatives, one of such representatives shall be a Member of a Young Farmers' Club under twenty eight years of age.
- Co-opted members – the Executive Committee may co-opt for such period as they may think fit, representatives of grant aiding bodies and other organisations and individuals interested in the YF Movement in the county.
- The President is ex-officio, a member of the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee has an obligation to meet at least three times a year (in practise there are normally seven meetings a year) and to carry out the objects and manage the affairs of the County Federation subject to any decisions given to it by a General Meeting.

The Executive Committee has the power and obligation to annually appoint a Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Treasurer from amongst its members. The Executive Committee also has the power to appoint and remunerate such employees and agents (not including any of its own members) as it thinks fit. A Staff Management Committee consists of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Treasurer and at least two people with experience of staff employment.

The Executive Committee currently delegates the day-to-day operations of the Federation to one part time member of staff. The member of staff is responsible for, but is not exclusive to, organising fund raising and charitable events, producing promotional material and attending promotional events, attending and recording minutes of meetings, administrating membership on behalf of Member Clubs and editing and distributing a Federation newsletter that keeps Member Clubs informed of Federation business.

The Federation has an obligation to hold an Annual General Meeting within three months of the termination of its financial year. The business to be transacted includes the adoption of an Annual Report and Statement of Accounts, the election of a President and Vice-President(s), the appointment of an Examiner and the presentation of the Annual Return of Membership.

Activities and achievements.

The Federation, in pursuit of its objects, continues to offer training, social activities, competitions and fun to any young person who is interested in the countryside and related subjects.

The Member Clubs, which the Federation serves, consists of members aged from 10 to 28 although the people who actually help run the clubs are aged from 10 upwards. Each club is responsible for arranging its own programme of events with meetings on a weekly or fortnightly basis. The activities, which range greatly, are geared towards the clubs' objects which are consistent with those of the Federation. Examples of specific activities include public speaking, quizzes, farm walks, craft evenings, speakers, visits to places of interest and sports. Some of these are organised by the Federation. Each individual member of the Federation's Member Clubs has the opportunity to compete in County Competitions and, subject to winning, progress on to South East Area and National Finals.

The Federation continues all year round with its efforts to raise its profile and that of Member Clubs. Significant drives to raise the profile of Berkshire Young Farmers occurs at Ploughing Matches and local Farm Open Days both of which are open to the public. The County Federation also endeavours to support Member Clubs in undertaking their own promotional events.

As ever the Federation is indebted to the generosity of a wide range of sponsors and donors. The Federation values all its sponsors and donors regardless of the level of financial contribution they make. Recognition must also be given to all the volunteers who have served the Federation over the past year. The continued existence of the Federation is very much dependant upon the voluntary services that associates to the Federation provides.



To conclude, the Executive Committee's major plans for the coming year include the following:

- * to continue to work towards achieving greater membership in Member Clubs
- * to continue to take on board the challenges set by the National Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs, including child protection issues, health and safety issues and any matters raised by National Council.

POLICIES

Reserves Policy

The restricted funds of the Federation represent the value of cups and trophies and the Lord Sieff Fund. The cups and trophies serve a continuing purpose in rewarding young members who benefit from the Federation pursuing its objects. The restricted Lord Sieff Fund (see grant making policy below) is currently managed with a view to making awards that equate to the donations and investment returns that the trust receives. This policy will allow the fund to continue to exist and allow individual members and Member Clubs to benefit over a long period of time.

The Federation's unrestricted funds have accumulated over a number of years. These funds are held by the Federation with a view to maintaining a prudent level of reserves that could be utilised in the event of a bad operating year.

Grant Making Policy

The grant making function of the Federation is in the main co-ordinated from the restricted Lord Sieff Fund. The Lord Sieff Fund may be (and is) only used to make grants or loans to individual members of Member Clubs or to Member Clubs for specific projects of an educational or personal development nature.

Investment Policy

The Federation's investment assets represent amounts invested in COIF Charity Funds. The intention is to maintain or increase reserves, which the Federation can use to pursue its charitable objects.

Review of Major Risks

Executive Committee members regularly review the Federation's financial risks at Executive meetings.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the year ended 30th September 2024

1. Accounting Policies

a) Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared in all material respects on a receipts and payment basis in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and the Statement of Recommended Practice (2000) issued by the Charity Commission.

b) Current Value of Assets

The current value of the assets retained for the Federation's own use has been determined by writing down the value of each asset over its estimated useful life;

| Computers | The 2013 office pc was replaced in 2016 with a laptop pc. This was to aid the County Organiser in being able to fulfil the flexibility of the role and deliver training. The value given in the asset list for the 2021/2023 accounts equates to the purchase price less depreciation to date, calculated on a less 25% annual basis. A replacement for the 2016 laptop was purchased during the year, the value given in the assets list in 2024 equates to the purchase price. |
| Printer | The value given equates to the 2020 purchase price less depreciation to date, calculated on a less 25% annual basis. |
| Office equipment | No current value assigned, though serviceable, not considered to be worth more than negligible scrap value (limited to just a filing cabinet and shelf unit) |
| Gazebos | Three - 6m x 3m Berks YFC branded gazebos were purchased during 2023 for use at the Country Fayre and any other shows the Federation attends. The value given in the assets list equates to the 2023 purchase price less depreciation to date, calculated on a less 25% annual basis. |
| Display Boards | New display boards were purchased during 2023 to better promote the Federation at various events throughout the year. The value given in the assets list equates to the 2023 purchase price less depreciation to date, calculated on a less 25% annual basis |

Only assets with a cost of over £100 are recognised as assets retained for the Federation's own use.

No record is made of the Federation's stock of branded merchandise or stationery supplies in the statement of assets and liabilities on the basis that such stock does not have a material net realisable value.

c) Taxation Status

The Federation is a registered charity and therefore is exempt from taxation on its income and gains arising in the United Kingdom.

d) Cups and Trophies

The cost of the Federation's Cups and Trophies is unknown and therefore no historic cost is included in the statement of assets and liabilities. The current value of the cups and trophies is based on the most recent valuation carried out for insurance purposes (2013).

e) Donations

Donations of capital assets are recorded in the statement of assets at their current value. No cost is assigned to such donated assets.

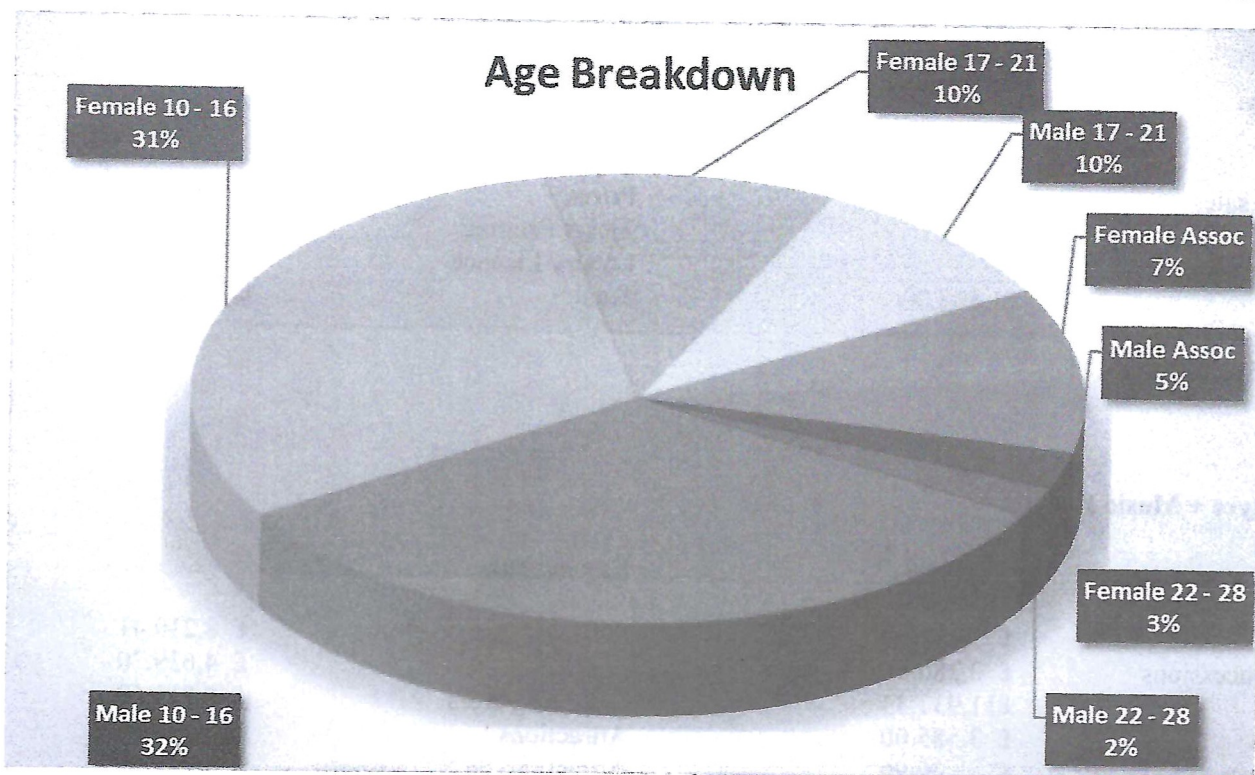

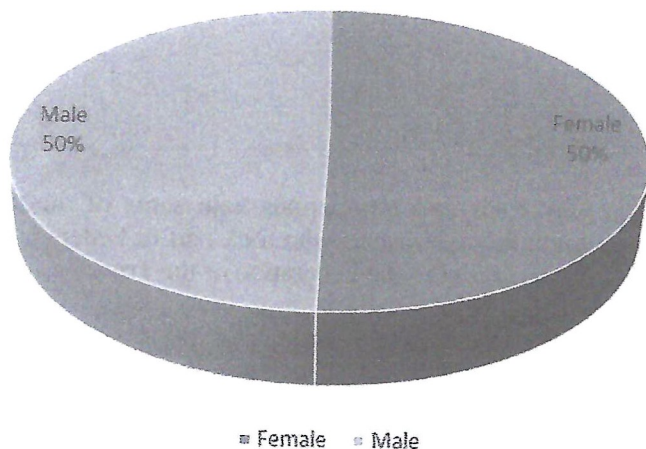

TRUSTEES AND GOVERNANCE

The Executive Committee consists of elected and co-opted members, the majority of whom are over 18 years of age and who are Trustees of the charity. Any Executive Committee member under 18 years of age is not entitled to vote on matters, which affect the management of the Charity. Members of the Executive Committee are appointed as follows:

- Elected members – each Member Club elects annually, three representatives, one of such representatives shall be a Member of a Young Farmers' Club under twenty eight years of age.
- Co-opted members – the Executive Committee may co-opt for such period as they may think fit, representatives of grant aiding bodies and other organisations and individuals interested in the YF Movement in the county.
- The President is ex-officio, a member of the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee has an obligation to meet at least three times a year (in practise there are normally seven meetings a year) and to carry out the objects and manage the affairs of the County Federation subject to any decisions given to it by a General Meeting.

The Executive Committee has the power and obligation to annually appoint a Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Treasurer from amongst its members. The Executive Committee also has the power to appoint and remunerate such employees and agents (not including any of its own members) as it thinks fit. A Staff Management Committee consists of the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Treasurer and at least two people with experience of staff employment.

The Executive Committee currently delegates the day-to-day operations of the Federation to one part time member of staff. The member of staff is responsible for, but is not exclusive to, organising fund raising and charitable events, producing promotional material and attending promotional events, attending and recording minutes of meetings, administrating membership on behalf of Member Clubs and editing and distributing a Federation newsletter that keeps Member Clubs informed of Federation business.

The Federation has an obligation to hold an Annual General Meeting within three months of the termination of its financial year. The business to be transacted includes the adoption of an Annual Report and Statement of Accounts, the election of a President and Vice-President(s), the appointment of an Examiner and the presentation of the Annual Return of Membership.

Activities and achievements.

The Federation, in pursuit of its objects, continues to offer training, social activities, competitions and fun to any young person who is interested in the countryside and related subjects.

The Member Clubs, which the Federation serves, consists of members aged from 10 to 26 although the people who actually help run the clubs are aged from 10 upwards. Each club is responsible for arranging its own programme of events with meetings on a weekly or fortnightly basis. The activities, which range greatly, are geared towards the clubs' objects which are consistent with those of the Federation. Examples of specific activities include public speaking, quizzes, farm walks, craft evenings, speakers, visits to places of interest and sports. Some of these are organised by the Federation. Each individual member of the Federation's Member Clubs has the opportunity to compete in County Competitions and, subject to winning, progress on to South East Area and National Finals.

The Federation continues all year round with its efforts to raise its profile and that of Member Clubs. Significant drives to raise the profile of Berkshire Young Farmers occurs at Ploughing Matches and local Farm Open Days both of which are open to the public. The County Federation also endeavours to support Member Clubs in undertaking their own promotional events.



As ever the Federation is indebted to the generosity of a wide range of sponsors and donors. The Federation values all its sponsors and donors regardless of the level of financial contribution they make. Recognition must also be given to all the volunteers who have served the Federation over the past year. The continued existence of the Federation is very much dependant upon the voluntary services that associates to the Federation provides.

To conclude, the Executive Committee's major plans for the coming year include the following:

- * to continue to work towards achieving greater membership in Member Clubs
- * to continue to take on board the challenges set by the National Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs, including child protection issues, health and safety issues and any matters raised by National Council.

POLICIES

Reserves Policy

The restricted funds of the Federation represent the value of cups and trophies and the Lord Sieff Fund. The cups and trophies serve a continuing purpose in rewarding young members who benefit from the Federation pursuing its objects. The restricted Lord Sieff Fund (see grant making policy below) is currently managed with a view to making awards that equate to the donations and investment returns that the trust receives. This policy will allow the fund to continue to exist and allow individual members and Member Clubs to benefit over a long period of time.

The Federation's unrestricted funds have accumulated over a number of years. These funds are held by the Federation with a view to maintaining a prudent level of reserves that could be utilised in the event of a bad operating year.

Grant Making Policy

The grant making function of the Federation is in the main co-ordinated from the restricted Lord Sieff Fund. The Lord Sieff Fund may be (and is) only used to make grants or loans to individual members of Member Clubs or to Member Clubs for specific projects of an educational or personal development nature.

Investment Policy

The Federation's investment assets represent amounts invested in COIF Charity Funds. The intention is to maintain or increase reserves, which the Federation can use to pursue its charitable objects.

Review of Major Risks

Executive Committee members regularly review the Federation's financial risks at Executive meetings.

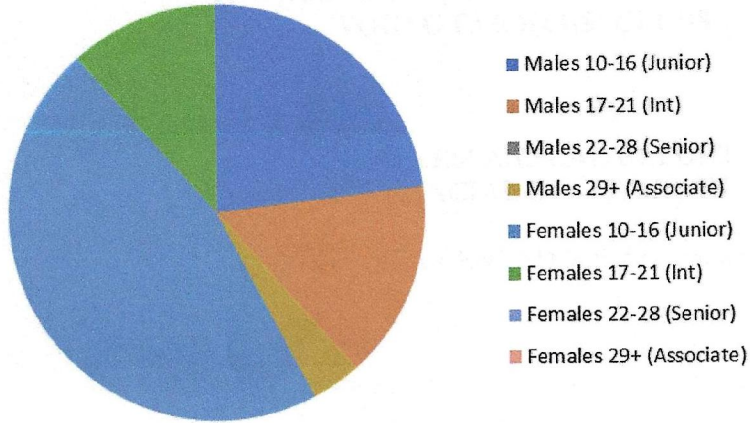
