ANNUAL REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF LITTLE MISSENDEN VILLAGE HALL (CHARITY NO 300294) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2022

Little Missenden Village Hall is situated opposite The Crown public house in the village of Little Missenden HP7 0RF.

The HALL is run by a Management Committee which, during the year, consisted of eight elected officers: Sue Rose, Jeff Dominy, Roy Bazzard, Bryan Rose, Debbie Barnett, Stephen Barnett, Charlotte White and Phil Sutton.

The year was less difficult than the previous one but Covid 19 still caused a few problems with bookings. Additionally, the village Christmas Party, which promised to be very well attended, had to be cancelled at the very last minute. However, when the going got tough so did the committee and nobody went hungry. The multi course dinner was superbly prepared and distributed leading to one significant comment by a village recipient "It was the best takeaway ever". We are now considering the launch of an initial public offering in 2022 under the banner of Little Mistake Aways!

The committee can look back with satisfaction and reports an improved Cash Position as at 31 March 2022 in the sum of £43,622.41 following Income of £26,250.45 and expenditure of £221,434.39 i.e. a surplus of £4,816.06. Our regular hirers: dance, ballet, music, karate and table tennis classes provided us with useful income together with sundry hire from parties, quiz nights and other community activities.

We took the opportunity to improve the hall's facilities by way of capital expenditure; namely new lighting, new curtains and backdrop for the stage, new village hall sign and a new freezer.

The committee believes the hall provided the community with essential space for meetings, presentations, learning classes, parties, recreational activities and general leisure time sessions throughout the year, to the best of its ability, in line with the ever-changing Covid directives, and within the guidance contained in its governing Trust Deed.

The eight existing committee members are all willing to stand for re-election for the year ending 31 March 2023 and they look forward to the future with unbounded optimism for Little Missenden Village Hall in continuing to serve its community.
