Annual Report of the Trustees

The Trustees present their report together with the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2024. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the charity's Trust Deed and the Government guidelines for small charities.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is a trust constituted under a trust dated 5 April 1961 as amended by the scheme dated 14 June 1993. Current trustees who are all volunteers, are as follows:

Mrs C Martin also manages the hall.

New trustees are appointed by the existing trustees as necessary.

Objectives and Activities

The objectives of the charity are provision and maintenance of the village hall in Ewshot.

The trustees are responsible for controlling the work, management and administration of the charity and ensuring that the charity provides building, facilities and open space for recreation, to the residents of Ewshot and the surrounding local areas. These must be maintained in good working order.

Achievements and Performance

During the year regular repairs and maintenance continued and included work done on wheelchair access and handrails, fire exit and insulation making improvements for health and safety reasons. Grants have been received from the Ewshot Parish Council, Hart Council and the UK Government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund, towards the costs of these much-needed improvements.

Financial Review

During the year the charity had excess revenue over expenditure of £12,577 to help build up the reserves. The current reserves of £33,935 are represented by unrestricted balances at bank. The trustees consider the current level of reserves to be adequate.

Notes to the accounts

The annual accounts have been prepared on a receipts and payment basis , in line with Government guidelines for small charities.

The accounts have resulted in excess income over expenditure of £ 12,454 with the current reserves of unrestricted funds of £33,812.

Fixed Assets

The charity is responsible for the maintenance and management of the hall which was donated to the residents of Ewshot in a trust deed in 1961 for use as a charitable purpose.

The charity does not own or lease any other buildings or land.

Reserves Policy

The reserves policy requires the Trustees to set aside £20,000 for the charity to continue its current activites if the income starts to decline unexpectedly as proved during the covid epidemic. The excess will be used to meet continous and unexpected maintenance and repairs expenditure. This policy is reviewed annually.
