The Annual General Meeting was held on 2nd September 2024. The Hemingford Peace Memorial Field is registered with the Charities Commission, No. 302642. It was established in 1964 and is governed by a Constitution.

Objectives and Activities

On the 12th December 1944 it was decided to inaugurate a scheme for commemorating the peace following World War II. For that purpose the villages of Hemingford Grey and Hemingford Abbots should combine. The scheme intended was to be such that it could include the thought of thanksgiving for Victory, a tribute to those who served their country, and the provision of something which would be of permanent value to them, their children and their neighbourhood. The form which the memorial took is that of a Playing Field to serve the needs of the two villages. Lt. Cl. S.D. Hayward generously gifted the field known as The Vineyard for the purpose.

Over the years there have been many activities based at the Pavilion. Currently there are four National standard squash courts, three all weather tennis courts, a National standard bowls green, two football pitches and a cricket square. All of these have associated clubs with some having representation up to National level. There are also two meeting rooms and a lounge bar. These facilities being fully utilised by local groups such as Scouts and Brownies as well as organisations such as the local History Society.

Achievements and Performance

The Pavilion continues to provide facilities that are well used by members of the sports clubs and the wider local community. All sports and community clubs are operating successfully and the meeting rooms are well used for a wide range of activities including exercise classes, community social events and business meetings. Visitors commonly admire the range and quality of the facilities that are available which are maintained in good order.

All sports clubs continue to thrive with active memberships. The Pavilion building and playing field continues to be regularly used for events, room hire for classes and private parties, and general socialising around the bar. Visitors are always very impressed by the range and quality of the facilities and that the Pavilion is managed solely by unpaid volunteers. There have been several major developments either completed or significantly progressed during the year i) Re-surfacing of the tennis courts and installation of lighting completed ii) Installation of solar panels and batteries completed. Planning and fund-raising to replace the children's play area is at an advanced stage and it is hoped that the installation will be completed in 2025-26.

Financial Review

A full set of accounts is attached to this report. However, the following can be said in summary:

On 30th April 2025, we held cash at bank to the value of £85,494, £32,042 as unrestricted funds and £53,452 as restricted funds for the playpark replacement project. This includes a reserve fund in case there is a need for underbudgeted expenditure. The financial reserves policy that aimed to raise the funds in deposit accounts by £5,000 per year did not occur this year due to various works required. The addition of the solar panels will provide savings, which will enable the target to be achieved over the same ten year period.

The principal sources of income are fees from the hire of meeting rooms, constituent club contributions to expenses, grant from local Parish Councils, and occasional Gifts and Gift Aid. Income is used to maintain and improve the property.

As the charity's trustees you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ('the Act').

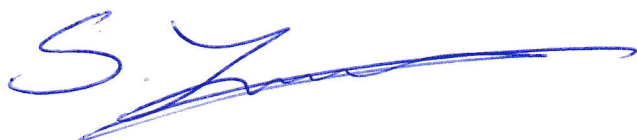

Note

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a 'true and fair' view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair view'. This departure has involved following the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest pound.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Fixed assets

Depreciation is charged at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

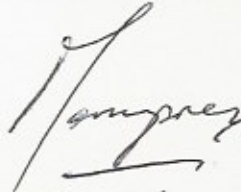

Up to six members of the Management Committee are elected on an annual basis at the Annual General Meeting, six members are nominated by the clubs that use the facility, and two members are nominated by Hemingford Grey and Hemingford Abbots Parish Councils. All members of the Management Committee are volunteers.

The Annual General Meeting was held in September 2022. The Hemingford Peace Memorial Field is registered with the Charities Commission, No. 302642. It was established in 1964 and is governed by a Constitution.

Objectives and Activities

On the 12th December 1944 it was decided to inaugurate a scheme for commemorating the peace following World War II. For that purpose the villages of Hemingford Grey and Hemingford Abbots should combine. The scheme intended was to be such that it could include the thought of thanksgiving for Victory, a tribute to those who served their country, and the provision of something which would be of permanent value to them, their children and their neighbourhood. The form which the memorial took is that of a Playing Field to serve the needs of the two villages. Lt. Cl. S.D. Hayward generously gifted the field known as The Vineyard for the purpose.

Over the years there have been many activities based at the Pavilion. Currently there are four National standard squash courts, three all weather tennis courts, a National standard bowls green, two football pitches and a cricket square. All of these have associated clubs with some having representation up to National level. There are also two meeting rooms and a lounge bar. These facilities being fully utilised by local groups such as Scouts and Brownies as well as organisations such as the local History Society.

Achievements and Performance

The Playing Field continues to provide facilities that are well used by members of the sports clubs and the wider local community. All sports and community clubs are operating successfully and the meeting rooms are well used for a wide range of activities including exercise classes, community social events and business meetings. Visitors commonly admire the range and quality of the facilities that are available which are maintained in good order.

During the year, all activities at the Pavilion have thrived supported by the amazing efforts of the many volunteers who run the Pavilion. There is an increasing number and range of social events which are well attended by the community.

Financial Review

A full set of accounts is attached to this report. However, the following can be said in summary:

On 30th April 2023, the charity held cash at bank to the value of £32,749, all of which are in unrestricted funds. These funds are held in order to meet any unforeseen expenditure that may occur, such as building repairs.

The principal sources of income are fees from the hire of meeting rooms, constituent club contributions to expenses, grant from local Parish Councils, and occasional Gifts and Gift Aid. Income is used to maintain and improve the property.

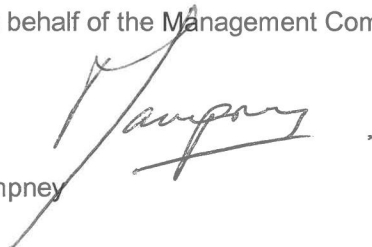

Structure, Governance and Management

Up to six members of the Management Committee are elected on an annual basis at the Annual General Meeting, six members are nominated by the clubs that use the facility, and two members are nominated by Hemingford Grey and Hemingford Abbots Parish Councils. All members of the Management Committee are volunteers.

The Annual General Meeting was held in November 2020. The Hemingford Peace Memorial Field is registered with the Charities Commission, No. 302642. It was established in 1964 and is governed by a Constitution.

Objectives and Activities

On the 12th December 1944 it was decided to inaugurate a scheme for commemorating the peace following World War II. For that purpose the villages of Hemingford Grey and Hemingford Abbots should combine. The scheme intended was to be such that it could include the thought of thanksgiving for Victory, a tribute to those who served their country, and the provision of something which would be of permanent value to them, their children and their neighbourhood. The form which the memorial took is that of a Playing Field to serve the needs of the two villages. Lt. Cl. S.D. Hayward generously gifted the field known as The Vineyard for the purpose.

Over the years there have been many activities based on The Playing Field. Currently there are four National standard squash courts, three all weather tennis courts, a National standard bowls green, two football pitches and a cricket square. All of these have associated clubs with some having representation up to National level. There are also two conference rooms and a lounge bar. These facilities being fully utilised by local groups such as Scouts and Brownies as well as organisations such as the local History Society.

Achievements and Performance

The Playing Field continues to provide facilities that are well used by members of the sports clubs and the wider local community. All sports and community clubs are operating successfully and the meeting rooms are well used for a wide range of activities including exercise classes, community social events and business meetings. Visitors commonly admire the range and quality of the facilities that are available which are maintained in good order.

The year has been dominated by the impacts of the Covid pandemic. During the year, the Pavilion has been closed due to Government lockdown for about 50% of the period and only open for the rest of the period with significant restrictions on use. However, in April 2021, different facilities and sports clubs started to re-open. All facilities and clubs are expected to quickly return to normal activities.

Financial Review

A full set of accounts is attached to this report. However, the following can be said in summary:

We hold cash at bank to the value of £68,450, of which £13,687 is unrestricted funds. These funds are held in order to meet any unforeseen expenditure that may occur, such as building repairs.

The principal sources of income are constituent club contributions to expenses, grants and gifts, and Parish Council contributions. This income is applied to the continued upkeep of the facility as well as supporting the continued growth of all constituent clubs.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in England & Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of the affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the charity for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- * select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- * observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP 2019 (FRS 102);
- * make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- * state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- * prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with Charities Act 2011, the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and trust deed. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

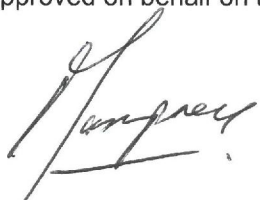

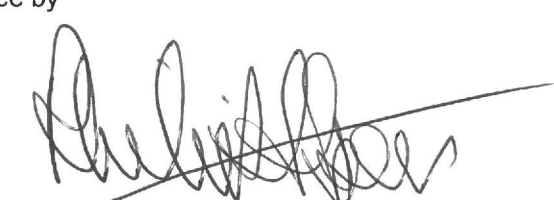

Note

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a 'true and fair' view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair view'. This departure has involved following the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest pound.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Fixed assets

Depreciation is charged at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:
