Pluckley Village Hall Annual report 2020 -2021

As you can expect we have had a very quiet year. Having spent some time making the hall Covid Safe and writing Covid risk assessments both for the hall and for the hirers for the time that we were allowed to open in 2020, we managed a few weeks of hire for dog training sessions and then of course we had to close again. During the time of closure we have visited regularly to run water through the system to prevent any occurrence of legionella, to read the meter and to check to make sure everything was as it should be. We have also kept in touch regularly via email to cover any issues that needed committee input and agreement. The garden maintenance continued and we extend our thanks to Dave Thripp who has kept everything in ship shape. Ashford Borough Council have helped us keep our heads above water with some grants and we are now planning to use some of that money to make a few minor improvements to improve the safety of the hall for our community. We opened fully on 21st June although Parish matters and local elections happened before that date. Despite the end of lockdown and removal of legal requirements for social distancing, mask wearing etc we are still asking hirers to follow our covid related guidelines when using the hall so that we can manage to continue to keep the hall covid free. We are beginning to welcome our regulars back and are planning some major events, including the next phase of the extension to the front of the hall and our annual Quilt and Craft Show which will return on 11th and 12th September this year. It will be great to have this event back on the calendar as it raises so much money in support of our hall. It will also be good to see our regular classes open up again and the hall be used as it should be. We have missed everyone this year, no Panto, no quizzes, no chilli and bingo nights, no ceilidh or horse racing as we had planned. Fingers crossed that we can begin to get back to something like a normal life.


My thanks go to the Committee who have helped to manage the hall over the past year despite the difficulties we have encountered. The hall exists to provide for this community and we hope that with your support it will continue to do so in the years ahead.

Financially we have survived this year very well with Ashford Borough Council grants enabling us to prepare our survival through Covid. We have been able to have the hall deep cleaned and equipped with hand sanitisers, anti bacterial cleaning products and equipment and required signage that hopefully will see the hall remain covid free. We are still maintaining the level of covid protection the hall requires to operate with the help of some of that grant money. The gardens have been maintained throughout and we have been able to replace the old gazebos and look towards having the patio replaced in the near future for the safety and enjoyment of our hirers, and to allow for greater use of the garden.

We are hoping that the new extension will begin soon and some of the grant money may be absorbed in that to provide users with a more flexible and useable space.




