The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The aim of the charity is to promote any charitable purpose for the well-being of the inhabitants residing in the neighbourhood by associating local authority, voluntary organisations and residents in common effort to further health, to advance all forms of education and to foster a community spirit for the achievement of these and such other purposes as may by law be deemed to be charitable.

Its real strengths lie in the enormous amount of voluntary service it receives from its members who willingly and generously give up their time at all hours. Volunteers do not receive any remuneration and in almost all cases do not claim out of pocket expenses. Volunteers' executive committee is also responsible for the management of the building including rental of halls and their maintenance. All other activities of the association are done through voluntary sections and members.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Due to the COVID 19 pandemic, all planned events and club activities were postponed or cancelled from January 2021 to May 2021.

A special Whist Holiday was organised for June and then another in October.

The local Woman's Institute have begun to use the facilities on a regular basis.

No fundraising activities were organised during this year. Events were organised to support members of the community following the pandemic.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the charity to maintain and set aside reserve funds at a level which approximately to equate two years unrestricted expenditure. This provides sufficient funds to cover management, administration and support costs. This also allows for forward planning on a going concern basis.

FUTURE PLANS

The future long term plans include: insulating the main hall roof and walls (where possible), upgrading the main hall heating and lighting and to repaint the exterior of the building.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Belmont Community Association was established in 1945 and registered as a charity on 27 October 1965. The charity operates under rules adopted on 30 May 1950 as amended from time to time.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Short leasehold	- in accordance with the property
Fixtures and fittings	- 10% on cost
Computer equipment	- Straight line over 3 years

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
