Section B Structure, governance and management

The 7th Halstead's governing documents are those of The Scout Association. They consist of a Royal Charter, which in turn gives authority to the Bye Laws of the Association and the Policy, Organisation and Rules of The Scout Association.

The 7th Halstead is a Trust established under its rules which are common to all Scouts.

The Trustees are appointed in accordance with the Policy, Organisation and Rules of The Scout Association.

The 7th Halstead is managed by the Group Executive, the members of which are the "Charity Trustees" of the 7th Halstead Scout Council, which is an educational charity. As charity trustees they are responsible for complying with legislation applicable to charities. This includes the registration, keeping proper accounts and making returns to the Charity Commission as appropriate.

The Committee consists of three independent representatives, Chair, Treasurer and Secretary, the Group Scout Leader and Group Section Leaders together with the Elected and nominated representatives. It meets every four times a year.

Members of the Executive Committee complete 'Essential Information for Executive Committee' training within the first 5 months of joining the committee.

This 7th Halstead Executive Committee exists to support the Group Scout Leader in meeting the responsibilities of the appointment and is responsible for:

- The maintenance of 7th Halstead property;
- The raising of funds and the administration of Group finance;
- The insurance of persons, property and equipment;
- Group public occasions;
- Assisting in the recruitment of leaders and other adult support;
- Appointing any sub committees that may be required;
- Appointing Group Administrators and Advisors other than those who are elected

Risk and Internal Control

The 7th Halstead Group has in place systems of internal controls that are designed to provide reasonable assurance against material mismanagement or loss, these include two authorised signatories for all payments and comprehensive insurance policies to ensure that insurable risks are covered.

I report on the accounts of the 7th Sevenoaks (Halstead) Scout Council for the year ended 31st March 2018
