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**Structure Governance and Management**

The Bexley District was formed on 1st October 2011 by the merger of the four districts in the London Borough of Bexley and is a charity registered with the Charity Commission number 303506.

Bexley District Scout Council is constituted in accordance with the Rules of The Scout Association to provide Scouting in the area that forms the London Borough of Bexley and is supported under those rules by the Scout County of Greater London South. The Scout Association is incorporated by Royal Charter. The Charter of the Association provides for the making of Bye-Laws approved by Her Majesty in Council which, in turn, authorises the making of the Rules referred to above (known as "Policy, Organisation and Rules", or "P.O.R"). The District's charity trustees are the District Executive Committee and are appointed in accordance with P.O.R.

**Public Benefit.**

Trustees and the District Management Team have referred to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the District's aims and objectives and in planning future activities. By maintaining the same aims and objectives as The Scout Association, we are confident that they are fit for purpose and in line with what we are trying to achieve for both our youth and adult members.

**Objectives**

The purpose, methods and values of Bexley District Scout Council are the same as that of the Scout Association.

**Activities:** Scouting exists to actively engage and support young people in their personal development, empowering them to make a positive contribution to society.

**Financial Review**

The surplus for the year 2021/22 amounted to £10,943.74 (2020/21 £47,181.80). Capitation raised from the groups was £19,802.

Depreciation amounted to £4,944.21 but is a book entry to write off fixed assets over their estimated useful life and does not affect cash.

Mayplace Road West HQ and 5th Erith halls created income of £24,355.31, to cover the property expenses of £31,337.91 including those properties, which do not contribute income, giving a deficit of £6,982.60.

The increase in the reserves of the ESU was £3,052.10. These funds are held by the units themselves and shown as designated reserves in the accounts. For this financial year, 9 of the 17 units provided accounts which have been included. The balance held as at the 31st March 2021 has been carried forward for the remaining units. On going forward all unit accounts will be obtained and reflected accurately in the accounts.

**Reserves Policy**

The District has created a reserves policy in line with the Scout Association recommendations and intends to keep £30,000 in reserves. In the event that there was a total lack of income, the reserves would be used to maintain Scouting in Bexley. Similarly if Scouting discontinued in one of the halls where the council lease the land to the District, the reserves would be used to return the land to the condition when it was originally leased. This would mean the removal of any structures that had been built on it.

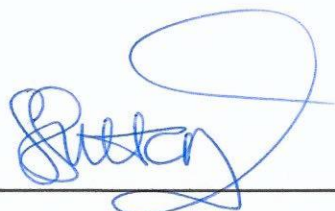

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**1 Accounting Policies**

- a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Charities SORP (FRS102) 2015 and with regard to the Charities Act 2011. An independent examination is required under the Charities Act 2011.

**b) Fixed Assets**

Depreciation is calculated on the District Minibus (Jimmybus) at 20% reducing balance, and is kept by the Black Prince SAS. A second minibus is also owned by the District and looked after by the Black Prince SAS but no value has been attributed in the accounts due to lack of information.

The District Headquarters in Mayplace Road West has been brought into the accounts at the insurance value in 2014 and is written down over 40 years.

The following properties are used by groups in the District and insured by the District Scout Council or the individual Scout Group:

Wooden Hut Kernnals Own at Partridge Rd Sidcup

1st Sidcup Scout HQ, Garage, Log Cabin, Explorers Garage all situated at Oxford Road rear of Warwick Road

8th Erith HQ The Rise rear of Cheviot Close

2nd Sidcup St John's Main hall, Den and the New Building.

5th Erith Scout Hall at Albert Road Upper Belvedere

The lawn mower is depreciated at 20% reducing balance.

- c) **Stock** is valued at the lower of cost price or net realisable value. The Bexleyheath shop at District HQ was refurbished in 2015.

- d) **Donations** are accounted for when received. Where the receipt of a grant is certain it is included when this is known, otherwise it is included when received.

**e) Reserves**

**Restricted funds** represent donations or grants raised for a specific purpose. The funds may only be spent on the specific object or purpose for which they were given. Any balance unspent at the end of each year must be carried forward as a balance on that fund.

**Designated Funds** are designated by the Scout Council for a particular purpose, these are unrestricted funds and any surplus can be moved to general funds by the Scout Council.

Funds held by the Explorer Units are included in these accounts as designated funds. Units use these funds for their own purposes within the Scouting guidelines. Should a unit close, any surplus funds are transferred to the Bexley District Scout Council. The movement of these funds are included in the accounts, not as income or expenditure but as movements in reserves.

Income and expenditure from the 5th Erith halls are included in the accounts and the bank account is shown as designated funds.

The Mayplace West Headquarters is matched by a property reserve designated for the depreciation of the asset over 40 years.

**General Funds** represent the funds of the Scout Council that are not subject to any restrictions regarding use and are available for application on the general purposes of the Scout Council.

#### **INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF THE BEXLEY DISTRICT SCOUT COUNCIL**

This report on the financial statements of the **BEXLEY DISTRICT SCOUT COUNCIL** for the year ended 31 March 2022, which are set on pages 1 to 6 is in respect of an examination carried out in accordance with s145 of the Charities Act 2011 (the Act).

#### **Respective responsibilities of the trustees and the examiner**

As the charity trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts; you consider that the audit requirement of section 144(2) of the Act does not apply and that an independent examination is needed.

#### **Basis of independent examiner's report**

Our examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners.
