Annual report. The Management Committee must comply with their obligations under Part VI of The Charities Act 1993 regarding the preparation of an annual report with audited accounts and its transmission to the Charity Commission.

The Trustees meet on the first Monday of each month.

The Trustees decide on the Terms and Conditions upon which Freeland Village Hall maybe used.

The Trustees receive no remuneration or benefits, giving their time voluntarily.

A sub-committee meets each October to discuss the finances, in the light of outgoings, and decide on the Hire Charges for the following year.

At this meeting discussions also take place regarding changes to the Conditions of Hire, reviews of Fire Safety and Risk Assessment documents.

The proceedings and conclusions of such sub-committees are taken back to the Trustees for approval at their next meeting.

Volunteers

The Trustees are always grateful for the support and help of our volunteers in 'meeting and greeting' our hall users at the weekends and the update of the website.

Achievements over the 2024 period in refurbishments to Freeland Village Hall

- The oak wooden floor had a surface treatment rendered.
- Following a localised leak the central heating pipework system was renewed and updated in the recreation facility.
- Taps to the washrooms have been updated
- Window frames and door frames painted and one interior wall.

Financial review

A decision was made and approved by the Trustees in 2024 to transfer £5,000.00 from the Holdings Account, into our main active account. This followed an overspend in 2023 due to costly upgrades to furnishing and fittings.

Reserves held in a Holdings Account

The amount of funds held in this account are used for major refurbishments.

In the unlikelihood that, for some reason, the hall must be closed for a period then adequate funds will be needed to cover regular demands on the account such as insurance, utilities, etc.

Future objectives

The Trustees are resolved to provide and maintain the facilities at Freeland Village Hall to a high standard, to ensure its cleanliness and safety, which our users have grown to expect.

The Trustees endeavour to ensure hire charges as low as possible, accessible to the vast majority of people.

The Trustees are mindful of rising costs particularly in relation to utility providers i.e. electricity, gas and water. They continue to explore alternative sustainable sources of energy to replace the existing gas central heating boilers.

- The oak wooden floor has been stripped and a new surface treatment rendered.
- Four large mats at all the entrances in both the foyer and the hall.
- New flame-retardant curtains made and fitted.
- New LED lighting installed to replace cracked shades. The LED bulbs should prove to be more energy efficient than the previous ones.
- New constant boiling water heater fitted in the kitchen

Financial review

To enable these costly upgrades to happen it was necessary to spend more than our income in 2023. A decision will have to be made and approved by the Trustees in 2024 to move some of the reserves held, in the Holdings Account, into our main active account.

Reserves held in a Holdings Account

The amount of funds held in this account are used for major refurbishments such as seen in 2023.

In the unlikelyhood that, for some reason, the hall must be closed for a period then adequate funds will be needed to cover regular demands on the account such as insurance, utilities, etc.

Future objectives;

The Trustees are mindful of rising costs particularly in relation to utility providers i.e. electricity, gas and water. They are actively engaged in exploring alternative sources of energy e.g. ground sourced heating to replace the existing gas central heating boilers and solar panels which will reduce the electricity bills.
