Description of the charity's trusts

Type of governing document

The Group's governing documents are those of the The Scout Association. They consist of a Royal Charter, which in turn gives authority to the Bye Laws of the Association and The Policy, Organisation and Rules of The Scout Association.

How the charity is constituted

The Group is a trust established under its rules which are common to all Scouts.

Trustee selection methods

The Trustees are appointed in accordance with the Policy, Organisation and Rules of The Scout Association.

Additional governance issues

The Group is managed by the Group Trustee Board, the members of which are the 'Charity Trustees' of the Scout Group which is an educational charity. As charity trustees they are responsible for complying with legislation applicable to charities. This includes the registration, keeping proper accounts and making returns to the Charity Commission as appropriate.

The Trustee Board consists of the Chair, Treasurer and 8 Trustees (including 2 Ex Officio Trustees, and 2 co-opted Trustees) and meet every month.

Members of the Trustee Board complete Being a Scouts Trustee learning within the first 6 months of joining the Board.

This Group Trustee Board exists to make sure the charity is well-managed, risks are assessed and mitigated, buildings and equipment are in good working order, and everyone follows legal requirements and the organisation's policies and rules. Their support helps other volunteers run high-quality and safe programmes that gives young people skills for life.

The group has in place systems of internal controls that are designed to provide reasonable assurance against material mismanagement or loss, these include 2 signatories for all payments and a comprehensive insurance policies to ensure that insurable risks are covered.

The Purpose of Scouting

Scouting exists to actively engage and support young people in their personal development, empowering them to make a positive contribution to society.

The Values of Scouting

As Scouts we are guided by these values:

Integrity - We act with integrity; we are honest, trustworthy and loyal.

Respect - We have self-respect and respect for others.

Care - We support others and take care of the world in which we live.

Belief - We explore our faiths, beliefs and attitudes.

Co-operation - We make a positive difference; we co-operate with others and make friends.

The Scout Method

Scouting takes place when young people, in partnership with adults, work together based on the values of Scouting and:

- enjoy what they are doing and have fun
- take part in activities indoors and outdoors
- learn by doing
- share in spiritual reflection
- take responsibility and make choices
- undertake new and challenging activities
- make and live by their Promise.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The Group's main function is to support the sections in achieving the aims of the Scout Association. As a Group the main activities during the last twelve months have included but not limited to.

Local hikes, cooking over open fires, camping and lots of badge work, encouraging youth leadership and supporting the continued development and expansion of the Group.

The Provision of Scouting within the Group is totally dependent on the contribution made by volunteers.

The Group meets the Charity Commission's public benefit criteria under both the advancement of education and the advancement of citizenship or community development headings.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

It was another successful year of Scouting in Calne. The group continues to attend the major community events held within the town, showcasing our youth leadership as well as raising significant funds to provide fun activities for our young people.

As a Trustee Board we have been focussed on increasing membership and attracting more adult leaders to support the growth of 1st Calne Scouts, making scouting available to all young members of our community.

This year also saw the beginning of a period of significant investment into the scout hall, replacing a very old boiler and the refurbishment of what was the boy's toilets where three separate cubicles have been built to be used by any gender.

Section E**Financial Review**

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

Reserves Policy

The Group's policy on reserves is to hold sufficient resources to continue the charitable activities of the group should income and fundraising activities fall short. The Group Trustee Board considers that the group should hold a sum equivalent to 12 months running costs, circa £12,000 (excluding any significant hall repairs or maintenance).

Despite the significant investment into the hall, the Group maintained reserves of approximately £22,000 at year end, which remains above the level required for operating expenses

Further financial review details

The Group does not have sufficient funds to invest in longer term investments. The Group has therefore adopted a risk averse strategy to the investment of its funds. All funds are held in cash using only mainstream banks or building societies.

Section F**Other Optional Information**

Plans for future periods (details of any significant activities planned to achieve them)

The Trustee Board continue to manage the investment into the infrastructure of the hall, with plans in place to redecorate, supported by local volunteers.

Focus remains on seeking support from adult volunteers, encouraging Young Leaders to join our Trustee Board and expanding the Group to a provision for the younger members of our community by adding a Squirrel drey.
