Introduction

The highlight of the year was in beginning of May, after 15 months due to COVID restrictions the sections started outdoor meetings again with a max of 15 young persons per meeting, which continued until end of term last week. There were no camps this year which I am sure the young scouters missed greatly. The ruling allowing the increase of numbers of persons allowed for camping and larger groups in scouting was only allowed from the last few weeks, however it was decided that the 3rd Reading Scout Group would continue at current numbers of around 15 per meeting till September.

The new scout hut plans were not progressed in the last 12 months due to the lack of necessary expert input. If the plans were to be started again the key factor to resolve is funding streams/bids from various sources would need to be found. This would take a dedicated knowledgeable person who understands the process and places to bid for moneys.

Following the loss of two large trees within the grounds an 'Amphitheatre' is to be built of recycled railway sleepers around the fire pit to make the bank safer for the young scouters. The moving of 45 sleepers into scout grounds was made into 'light work' with the help from 20 volunteers.

The scout hut and grounds was let to the Henley road nursery for the last 6 months and it was an interesting time sharing a building with other teams especially organizing rigorous cleaning regime accord to Covid-19 rules.

Section update

Scouts

Along with everything else going on in the world right now, Scouting since the last AGM has been dominated by the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic.

The Scout section did hope to meet in November, and got within 1 day before going back into lockdown!

The relaxing of Covid rules has allowed us to start meeting since Easter.

We are meeting outside only and are meeting with smaller numbers, whilst we gain confidence on how this will all work.

To date we have done a hike, cooking on fires and orienteering.

With the changes in SA rules, we are having to get to grips with the new documented Risk Assessment process. To date we have found this time consuming, frustrating and alienating of some leaders and we look forward to a more pragmatic approach being applied. In essence to spend considerable time documenting risk is not why we volunteer and a much better process from the SA is urgently required.

Cubs

As a result of COVID no face to face sessions of Cubs were held from mid march 2020 to early April 2021. Between November 2020 and March 2021 a series of 13 Zoom sessions were held. Around 16-20 cubs from across all three packs attended some of these sessions. We had a number of engaging external speakers, took part in sessions on disability awareness, Burns night, programming, sign language and maps and completed the Scientist badge.

Face to face meetings were finally resumed after the Easter holidays in April 2021. The reduced number of leaders available has resulted in the amalgamation of three packs into two, each of which is divided in half with cubs meeting alternate weeks while leaders repeat the session for each group. So far we have had a Nightline/games session in the scout hut grounds and a problem solving treasure trail around Caversham. The final session of the half term is a hike. A number of cubs have completed their Road Safety badge. All meetings this term are planned to take place outside so we hope for good weather. If social distancing requirements are reduced we are cautiously optimistic of returning to full pack meetings for a few weeks at the end of term in July.

The Cub camp which was originally planned for July 2020 has now been rebooked for July 2022. We will also consider repeating the successful pack sleepover trialled in 2019 if regulations permit in the autumn.

Now we are back to face to face meeting we will revisit moving up needs, but we are also restricted by the number of volunteers we have to continually run sections.

Finances

After a very quiet year, we closed the Financial year 2020/21 with a cash balance of £60,600. This balance includes:

- £20,000 of Covid-19 related local authority grants received due to the closure of the leisure industry,
- £7,400 held in a secure deposit account for unexpected expenses.

Due to the limited program of activities the group were able to offer its members over the year, the Executive team took the decision to postpone future membership collections to all parents/guardians or refund for those that had prepaid.

As a group, we were also happy to step in and offer a local nursery the use of our hut and grounds after their premises were contaminated, which has brought in additional income to the group. The Executive decided to sell the old mini bus as it was not cost effective to have 2 mini buses for the group and was successfully sold in July for £2000.00
