The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 January 2024. The financial statements have been prepared on a cash receipts and payments basis and comply with the charity's governing document and the Charities Act 2011.

The trustees are very grateful to everyone who supported the Trust, enabling it to continue supporting our beneficiaries. The Trust was fortunate to be the beneficiary of a large legacy donation of £46,039 received in September 2023. This has helped considerably to bolster our funds so that we can continue, with confidence, to support our beneficiaries.

We would like to express our thanks to everyone who donated to the Trust via Eddie Elliott's memorial collection which raised a further £70 in this financial year. Our thanks also go to the BDS Berkshire area which donated £250 raised at its Autumn drive at Windsor Great Park.

Total donations received in the year were £46,489 (£2,706 in FY23). Interest earned on funds held in deposit accounts totalled £500 in the financial year.

We are delighted that, thanks to the support of our donors, we were able to provide training grants to the CDSG totalling £1,200 to support two training courses dedicated to disabled drivers at the Unicorn Trust. The Trust also provided scholarships to two individuals, Amanda Shirtcliffe and Neomi Sutton, both disabled drivers towards costs for training. The Trust has also continued to sponsor rosettes to RDA coaches at the RDA National Championships. The Trust incurred charges for bank accounts totalling £68.

Reflective of the significant legacy donation received, the Trust had a net surplus of £45,049 for the year to 31 January 2024 compared to a surplus of £2,456 in the prior year. At the year end the Trust had cash at bank totalling £60,372 comprised of unrestricted funds (£15,323 in the prior year).

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and the accounts in accordance with applicable law.

The law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the charity for that year.

They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
