#### Southern Chad

The charity continues to support two missions. A large supply of medicines was sent to the dispensary in Mberi. The cases of malaria, including many pregnant women, increased substantially due to heavy flooding. The support from Aid to Chad meant that the clinic operated by a qualified nursing sister was able to be kept running smoothly during a difficult time of increased demand.

In Benoye, the charity continued to support thirty girls in the mission school. The charities donations were used to buy regular supplies of food for the children.

We were also able to help in the building of a basic classroom and carry our repairs to the dining room.

#### Peru

The charity continued to purchase handicraft items made by women and their families in the shanty towns. These were sold in church fairs and handicraft fairs in the UK and 100% of the proceeds returned to the missionary sister to support the women in the shanty towns, especially sending money for them to purchase medicines.



## Aid for Chad and Peru

### Trustees Report


In the Benoye and Mberi Missions in Southern Chad funds have been used to buy essential food for the pupils in both schools and also for the very sick and elderly. A gate is being repaired to prevent severe flooding in the Mission.

A new machine has been bought to grind the millet and rice for the pupils in the school, so they no longer need to laboriously grind all the grain by hand use long poles.

Sr Surita, a nurse, who works in the dispensary at Mberi, has been able to buy a variety of essential medicines, such as antibiotics and analgesics for many of the very poor. Food is also provided and shared with the elderly.

In Lima Peru, Sister Katrina has provided food parcels for the very poor and contributed money needed for a woman in urgent need of surgery. We have continued to sell all the Peruvian decorations made in the shanty towns and the money raised this year has meant that many of the very poor women no longer live in the depths of poverty.

Sr Dina, a nurse, has provided food parcels for those in great need and also bought essential medicines to treat those who cannot afford to pay medical care. Our donations are essential for this work to continue.



In the Mission in Mberi more books and cupboards have been purchased for the school. Meals are also provided for the pupils each day. A machine has recently been purchased to grind the millet and rice for the pupils.

## Peru

In Lima Peru the Charity has continued to support the women manufacturing a variety of handicrafts. Once sold, all the money raised is given to them to buy essential food.

Sr Dina , a nurse working in Lima, has been enabled to buy essential medicines for those unable to purchase them for themselves


## **Aid for Chad and Peru**

The charity has continued to support missions in both Chad and Peru.

In Chad the main project has been the digging of two borewells around Mberi. These not only supply clean water for people in the villages but also safe water to the dispensary in Mberi. We have bought medicines to stock the dispensary and food for both missions in Mberi and Benoye. The girls residential school in Benoye has been provided with food, book, desks and beds.

In Lima, Peru, funds from the charity have enabled trained nurses to purchase medicines and food for the poorest and improve their healthcare. In Lima the charity has continued to support the women in the manufacture of handicrafts which they sell to buy food and other essentials for their families.
