Our aims and objectives:

To provide football opportunities both domestic and internationally for people with limb loss or limb deficiency throughout England and Wales.

Our main objectives for this year 2024-2025

- Deliver high quality training weekends for senior England amputee football squad players both male and female.
- Delivery of warm weather training camp in Turkey for men's England team prior to European championships
- Participate in the EAFF men's European amputee football championships in Evian in France.

- Raise funds to deliver football activities through crowd funding, TV appeals and other funding sources,
- Deliver domestic league and cup competitions for 4 national amputee football teams.
- Develop regular training camps and football opportunities for the junior amputee football programme.
- Participate in the inaugural World Amputee Football Federation amputee football world cup for women in Colombia.

Achievements

England male national team

The England men's national team had a busy year; in April they travelled to Belek in Turkey and took part in a 5-day warm weather training camp.

During the camp they played two fixtures against Asian champions Uzbekistan winning 3-0 and then losing 3-2.

The national team also played World Cup winners Turkey and narrowly lost a competitive game 2-1.

Each month the men's team had a training camp in to the build-up to the major event the EAFF European champions that were held in Evian in France in June.

England were in a group with Georgia, Holland and Italy, England swept Georgia away with a comprehensive 6-0 win, in the next group game England defeated Holland with a comfortable 3-0, in their final group game England beat a resolute Italy team 1-0 to top the group.

In the quarterfinal England faced the hosts France and ran out 1-0 winners in a comfortable performance.

In the semifinal England faced Spain and went ahead 1-0, Spain equalised following an error and went on to win the game 2-1 with a last-minute breakaway goal, the England team were then defeated 1-0 by Poland in the 3rd/4th place game.

In September the men's national team travelled to Warsaw to compete in the Amp Cup they played against Poland, Poland U21 and Iraq.

England female national team

EAFSA have started a female national amputee team, there were several monthly training camps set up that the ladies attended.

In September 2024 the national team travelled to Poland to play their first ever competitive international, they played 2 games over the weekend although they lost both games 2-0 and 1-0 respectively the ladies showed enough to suggest that they would do well in the World Cup.

After an extensive fundraising effort, with TV appearances the ladies in November travelled to Colombia to participate in the first ever woman's world cup competition.

In their first game England played Peru and Isabel Papandronicou wrote her name in history by scoring the first ever world cup goal, England went on to win their first ever game in the world cup

Annabel Kiki Remmer finished the Peru game with a hatrick the first ever from an England female player as England beat Peru 6-0.

In their second game England triumphed over a physical Haiti team 1-0, in their 3rd game England suffered a setback losing 1-0 to Kenya which still meant they qualified for the quarterfinal of the world cup.

In the quarterfinal England played a tough USA team the score was 0-0 after extra time and unfortunately like so many England teams previously lost on penalties.

England played for 5th-8th position, they comfortably beat Ecuador 3-0 and then played the Ukraine for 5th/6th play off, England triumphed 2-0 with both goals by Annabel Kiki Remmer to finish top scorer with 7 goals remarkable achievement.

Domestic league and cups

In the league there were 4 teams fighting for the honours Everton, Portsmouth, Newcastle and Chelsea.

In June Portsmouth beat Everton 3-2 in the disability cup final in a close game that was shown live on TNT sports.

In August Portsmouth made it a hat-trick of cup wins and triumphed in the EAFL cup competition.

In October Everton won the league for the second consecutive time beating Portsmouth into second place.

Everton amputees travelled to Italy to compete in the champions league, they had a tough group, in their opening game they defeated Cork 2-0, they lost to eventual winners Wisla Krakow.

Everton narrowly failed to qualify for the semi-final losing to a last-minute winner to Turkish champions Sahim Bay.

Everton then played Paris FC in the 5th/6th play-off game and won 4-0 to finish 5th in a spikey competitive game.

Junior Development

The junior programme, which is for children under the age of eighteen, this part of the charity is growing from strength to strength with over 70 juniors attending camps, eight weekend coaching training camps were delivered throughout the year.

The junior players are split into appropriate age and ability groups and various football skills are coached to the players.

In July 25 EAFA junior travelled to participate in the EAFF international junior camp that was held in Belgium, over 100 juniors from countries around the world took part in the camp.

Several junior players have made the transition from this programme to feed into the league teams and some into the senior international team.

Our main objectives carried out this year:

- EAFA Chairman Steve Johnson attended the World Amputee Football Federations annual conference online.
- Deliver high quality monthly England training camps for male players to prepare for international competition.
- Prepare the England men's national amputee to participate in the inaugural nations league and the amputee cup in Poland
- Organise international friendly matches for the men's national amputee football team
- Organised and delivered high quality bi-monthly training camps for amputee juniors from 3-18 years of age
- Prepare and send amputee juniors from EAFA to the yearly international football camp in partnership with the European amputee Football Federation
- Develop football opportunities, training and competitive opportunities for disabled females including international camp in Belgium
- Deliver and develop domestic league and cup competitions for adult male and female amputees
- Organise and support several fund-raising events and sponsors to support delivery of activities

- Organise, plan and deliver presentation evening to celebrate activities and achievements for the year
- Attend the limb power games and deliver amputee football taster sessions for various age groups of amputees
- Organise referee development workshops

Achievements

The charity is growing again with the formation of the women's national team, they participated in an international camp and domestic training days

The men's national team took part in international friendly matches and where successful in winning the first international honour in over 34 years winning the Nation's league which is a fantastic achievement.

The junior programme is growing with more children attending each camp and we sent a number of junior amputees over to an international camp in Warsaw Poland.

Domestically we had 4 teams compete in the national league and cup competitions throughout the season, a talent identification was put in place.

EFAFA chairman and volunteers took part in the World Amputee Football Federation and the European Amputee Football Federation congresses,

Delivering presentations at each event, EFAFA are one of the leading countries for amputee football development and took part in all of the WAFF and EAFF activities.

EFAFA held its annual awards evening where players and volunteers were recognised for their outstanding achievements throughout the year.

EFAA volunteers attended the Limb Power games in Stoke Manderville to deliver football activities and awareness sessions for amputees of all ages

EFAA held CPD events (Continuing Professional Development) for referee to grow the number of qualified officials in the game

England Amputee Men's National team

It was a brilliant year for the men's national amputee team with new coaching staff Scott Rodgers and Mark Dolan at the helm.

Throughout the year the men's national team delivered monthly weekend training camps where the players were prepared for the international competition.

In May 2023 the team fly to Ireland and took part in friendly matches against a strong Irish team winning one game and narrowly losing another fixture.

In June England travelled to Krakow Poland to participate in the inaugural Nations League event.

In their first match they defeated Turkey 1-0 with a deflected David Tweed goal, the first time we have defeated Turkey for a number of years, Turkey who have recently been World and European champions

In their second Match England played the hosts Poland and despite going a goal down early, Rhyce Ramsden equalised with a volley and David Tweed scored the winning goal after a mazy run by Jamie Tregaskiss.

In the final game England defeated Spain 1-0 with a penalty from Rhyce Ramsden to win the Nations league.

This is the first major trophy and major milestone that the England amputee football team have won since winning the world cup in 1990.

In September England travelled to Warsaw Poland to compete in the Amp cup England played against the USA, Costa Rica, Japan and Poland, England won 3 and drew against Poland in the last game narrowly losing the competition by 1 goal on goal difference.

A successful year for the team and one to remember with pride and joy

Domestic League

The trustees decided to concentrate on international rules league which meant all outfield players played on crutches and the goalkeeper has to be a single arm amputee.

So the league had 4 teams for this season the teams were Everton Portsmouth, Chelsea and Arsenal.

A number of league fixture dates were played including 2 domestic cup competitions and the national Disability cup.

All four trophies were dominated by Everton and Portsmouth each winning 2 trophies.

Everton won the league on the last fixture date defeating Portsmouth who had led most of the season into runners up spot, Everton qualified for the Champions League the following season.

The Disability cup final that was shown live on BT sport and was a great advert for amputee football in this Country, this was played between Everton and Portsmouth.

In a fantastic game of football Everton triumphed 4-1 with some well worked goals and great finishing.

In the other 2 EAFA cup competitions Portsmouth dominated winning both finals one on penalties to claim a cup double!

Junior programme

The junior programme goes from strength to strength with more juniors being found through social media.

We have over 100 juniors on our database with over 40 juniors attending each bi-monthly training weekend.

The training camps give the children to socially interact with other children who have a similar disability, they also learn valuable football skills as well as improving communication skills and co-ordination skills.

For the parents it is a good social and support network as well as a respite and great to see their children having a great time.

In August EAFA sent 18 young amputees to an international junior camp that was held in Warsaw Poland, they joined young amputee from all over Europe to make new friends, learn new skills.

As part of the junior project we have developed a talent identification pathway, children who have potential and are progressing are given extra coaching sessions and are linked to amputee specific or grass roots clubs.

Women's football development

A new part of what we deliver is football opportunities for female amputees, during this year we have put on coaching days with an end goal of having a women's national team.

We already have some female that play in the domestic amputee league are aim is put in place a pathway from grass roots to international level for female amputees

In March we sent some of our players to Ghent in Belgium to participate in a training camp with other females from around Europe organised by the European Amputee Football Federation

The aim of this is to put an England female team in the World Cup competition which will be held in 2024.

Volunteers

Volunteers are the life blood of the charity with no paid staff we rely on volunteers to deliver the various elements of work that EAFA delivers many of them are experts in what their field of work.

To provide football opportunities both domestic and internationally for people with limb loss or limb deficiency throughout England and Wales

Our main objectives for this year 2022-23

- Deliver high quality training weekends for senior England amputee football squad players.
- Prepare the national amputee England team to participate in the world Cup in turkey
- Organise and provide competitive international friendly matches for the England amputee football senior squad players.
- Raise funds and in kind support through BBC Children in Need, Simply Business, Irwin Mitchell, the Football Association and Adidas
- Deliver regular domestic league and cup competitions for the 8 national league amputee football teams, 2 divisions of 4 teams
- Develop regular football opportunities and training camps for junior ampu-tee

It was a busy year for the volunteer staff at the England Amputee Football Association and the return to action after COVID 19 had stopped most activities.

The main pillar activities delivered were preparing the men's national team for the world cup in Istanbul in Turkey, monthly junior domestic camps and the international camp and the domestic adult league, cup and the Campions league competitions.

EFAA chairman attended the European Amputee Football Federation that was online with all the new developments for the coming year.

In April 2022 staff, players and friends took part in a parachute event to raise vital funds for EFAA activities during the year.

EFAA volunteers attended the Limb power games in July and put football coaching sessions and workshops for amputees at Stoke Manderville sports centre.

In November EFAA hosted a presentation evening to recognise the participants achievements for the national team, junior programme and domestic league and cup winners.

In February 2023 there was an in house continuing professional development for the EFAA referees to drive up standards of performance.

In March 2023 the first ever women only training camp took place in Warsaw and female members of EFAA attended.

Achievements

- Co-ordinate and deliver referee development workshops for matchday officials
- Referees attended education CPD workshop
- First activities specifically for female amputee

Portsmouth won the premier league title and the EFAA cup which qualifies them for the next Champions league event run by EAFF, Man city winning the pre-season cup and the BT disability cup, Arsenal won the champion-ship league title and the league cup.

The Premier league teams were Everton, Portsmouth, Peterborough and Man City, the Championship teams were Brighton, Arsenal, WBA and Newcastle.

The domestic league and cup competitions restarted with 2 divisions of 4 teams, the Premier league was played on the international rules basis and the championship had 4 teams playing on an inclusive basis.

Domestic League and cups

Which meant England were out of the World cup but still had to play off for 9-16 places, England defeated European rival Poland 3-0, Japan 2-0 and then gained revenge against Argentina winning 4-3 in an entertaining and feisty game to finish 9th place in the competition.

The result qualified England for a quarter final game against a strong Argentina team, the young lions played really well but were heartbroken losing 1-0 to the eventual finalists.

England lost 1-0 to the USA in the opening group game and then defeated Indonesia 3-0, in the last group game England lost 3-2 in the last minute to Argentina.

In June as part of the lead up to the world cup England also took part in the amp cup in Poland which included the hosts, national teams of England, Italy, Morocco and a representative Polish team made up of players from various teams

In the lead up to the world cup a number of monthly training camps were hosted at Reaseheath College for the national squad, these included friendly matches against strong opposition in Poland and Turkey

The national teams main event as they competed in September World cup in Turkey organised by the World Amputee Football Federation, under the stewardship of head coach Owen Coyle.

In July a number of juniors, parents and staff attended the prestigious European Junior camp in Tbilisi Georgia, the four day camp included coaching and other activities, the children were put in age groups and enjoyed making new friends from various European countries and Costa Rica.

The camps are also a support mechanism and social interaction opportunities for children and parents to make friends and share their experiences.

The children were grouped into ages and ability levels, this is the start of the football pathway where the children receive expert coaching sessions and play friendly matches.

After COVID the junior programme finished the online sessions and started face to face with a number of training camps where held at the home of amputee football Reasheath college in Cheshire

Junior Development

The BT cup was shown "live" for the first time and was a fantastic show case of amputee football with Man City winning 1-0 with a goal from Liam Burbridge.

In May Man City represented EAFa in the champions league event in Krakow Poland, they preformed well and finished 3rd in the competition



Achievements

England Amputee National team

With the European champions postponed from September 2020 to the following year in September 2021 this gave the supporting more staff time to prepare for the championships.

In the build up to the European amputee football championships the England team participated in monthly training camps that were held at Reece-heath college which is the home of amputee football.

The training programme for the national team was still disrupted with Covid 19 restriction

As part of the build up to the European championships the national team were invited and took part in the annual Amp Futbol cup which was held in Warsaw in Poland

In the amp cup England defeated a Poland all stars team 4-0, Italy national team 3-0, winning on penalties after a 2-2 draw with Morocco and then losing narrowly in the final against Poland 3-2

The European championships took place in Krakow in Poland in September, England won their group defeating Greece 5-0 and France 2-0, they were disappointed to be knocked out on penalties to eventual finalist Spain in the quarterfinal.

Domestic League and cups

The domestic league and cup competitions restarted after the Covid 19 break with 2 divisions of 4 teams, the Premier league was played on the international rules basis and the championship had 4 teams playing on an inclusive basis.

The Premier league teams were Everton, Portsmouth, Peterborough and Man City, the Championship teams were Brighton, Arsenal, WBA and Newcastle.

Portsmouth won the premier league title and the EAFA cup which qualifies them for the next Champions league event run by EAFF, Man city winning the pre-season cup and the BT disability cup, Arsenal won the championship league title and the league cup.

Junior Development

The national weekend training events funded by Children in Need returned and saw an increased number of children participating in the junior camps.

Players were kept in touch with regular zoom calls and at Christmas packages were sent to each player including footballs, drinks bottle, bag and other gifts.

We also received funding of £5,000 from Gladstones towards the junior's participation in the international junior camp.

Achievements

England Amputee National team

The England amputee national team were preparing for the European championships that were to be held in Krakow in September 2020.

In March 2020 the coronavirus 19 pandemic caused lock downs in the United Kingdom, this event greatly affected the national team's preparations for the European championships.

During the lockdowns EAFA staff were unable to deliver any face-face football sessions to the participants, but they kept in contact with the players by delivering weekly physical activity and fitness sessions online.

They also delivered quizzes to keep in touch to reduce social isolation and support with mental health issues.

Because the COVID 19 pandemic was growing right across the world teams were pulling out of attending the European Championships and they were eventually postponed to the following year.

In October we were able to deliver a face-to-face football session at Rease Heath college in between lock downs

England Amputee U23 squad

As part of the performance development pyramid EAFF have put in place an England U23 squad.

Unfortunately due to COVID 19 virus and lockdowns most of our face-face delivery, most of our engagement was online delivering fitness sessions, quizzes, social interaction opportunities and mental health support.

Similar to the national squad the U23 squad had 1 face-face training weekend in October between national lockdowns

Domestic League and cups

The 2 domestic international rules and inclusive national leagues and cup competitions were cancelled because of the coronavirus pandemic, many of the participants took part and engaged in the online fitness and social interaction sessions

EAFA has delivered a number of online projects due to the pandemic specifically throughout our junior and England provisions which has been our key areas of focus over the last season.

We have actively worked with fifty young people alongside the thirty five players in our England programme. Additionally, the league came to a standstill until summer 2021 and saw seventy adults returning to football after the pandemic.
