TRUSTEES REPORT FOR YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2022

The normal activities of the Hall – Mens and Ladies outdoor bowls, Scottish dancing, Dog training, Exercise classes and private parties continued throughout 2022 producing a welcome bounce-back from the Covid affected activities of 2021.

The total income for the Hall increased from £12,188 in 2021 to £27,001. The main contributors to this increase were Bar Takings, up £5,433, Hall Hire which rose by £4,873 due to more party bookings and new exercise classes. In addition the Hall received a Government Hospitality Grant of £2,667 and grants towards maintenance from Wirral Council and Rank Organisation totalling £1,900.

The total expenditure for the Hall increased from £12,539 in 2021 to £21,812 due mainly to increased Bar costs, up £4,922, Energy costs, up £2,521 and higher Maintenance costs, up £1,302 which included 3 replacement windows.

Overall the Hall had a surplus of £5,188 compared with a deficit of £351 in 2021. The current year has seen further new classes starting and no let-up in the number of private bookings which leaves the Hall well placed to continue serving the community as it begins its second hundred years.

Independent Examiner's Report

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner
