As restrictions were eased, numbers built up. Table Tennis, yoga ,etc started up but sadly the Brownie group did not return. A screen was fitted to the kitchen servery area to protect the servers and all necessary controls were put in place.

During the quiet period the main hall windows were replaced

Terry Williams sourced and supplied a wheelchair to aid the less able users

By the end of 2021, the numbers had built up and Helen Beavan was able to report in January that usage of the hall had built up to 138hour/month. This compared with 56hour/month prior to refurbishment.

In summary the year was successful despite Covid. We were also fortunate to be given a grant from Herefordshire Council.
