Overview: -

The Alder Hey Children's Hospital League of Friends Charity has been raising funds to support the Hospital for many years. In our earlier years we have raised substantial funds to help purchase equipment and support the good work done by the hospital for the children being treated there.

In recent years we have been winding down our activity to prevent confusion and overlap, as the Hospital now has a team of paid professional fund raisers undertaking this task on a much larger scale. For this reason we are not actively fundraising, operating on a collection basis only.

We have put off winding up Charity as there are still some small donations being paid directly into our bank account via standing orders and indirectly via the charitable sections of PayPal, Charitable Aid and Cafgye. In addition we have received a small number of bequests from wills set up historically when we were more active, which we would not wish the Hospital to lose out on.

Our Trustees are aging and we have lost 2 in recent years but it would not seem prudent to appoint new Trustees if we are likely to wind the Charity up in the near future so they haven't been replaced.

Income: -

During 2024 we received the usual small payments totalling £618 as outlined above but also received an unusual bequest from the estate of Sylvia Pearl Mackintosh of £36,891. This almost doubled our funds and we sought new projects from the Hospital for the purchase of equipment – see expenditure below.

Expenditure: -

Some of the funds were used to purchase “**Advanced Defibrillators**”, special units for children which are used during operations and we continued our support for the “**Rainbow Centre**” within the Hospital which treats physically and mentally abused children.

Costs: -

The Trustees all give their time freely so there are no overheads for the Charity other than the production of year end accounts.

Year – End Position: -

The year ended with a healthy balance of funds - £57,502 which will be used to purchase equipment or fund projects as requested by the Hospital in the coming months. These funds are held in simple bank current and savings accounts under dual control requiring 2 signatures for payments as authorised by the Trustees.

There are no plans for further fundraising and consideration will continue to be made to close the Charity at the right time. If that decision is made we will likely remit any remaining funds to the larger Hospital Registered Charity so that it remains in support of the Hospital.

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention. In preparing the financial statements the charity follows best practice as laid down in the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice FRS 102. (SORP).

Investment income

Investment income is accounted for in the period in which the charity is entitled to its receipt.

Expenditure

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. Expenditure is accounted for as expenditure for charitable purposes, support costs or governance costs, based upon the nature of the individual item of expenditure. There is no apportionment as such; costs are allocated on an invoice by invoice basis.

Donations and fund accounting

1 Accounting policies

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention. In preparing the financial statements the charity follows best practice as laid down in the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' (SORP 2015).

Investment income

Investment income is accounted for in the period in which the charity is entitled to its receipt.

Expenditure

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. Expenditure is accounted for as expenditure for charitable purposes, support costs or governance costs, based upon the nature of the individual item of expenditure. There is no apportionment as such; costs are allocated on an invoice by invoice basis.

Donations and fund accounting

Donations are received for the general purpose of the charity are included in unrestricted general funds. Funds set aside by the trustees out of general unrestricted funds for particular expenditure/projects are included as designated funds. Donations for activities restricted by the wishes of the donor are taken to "restricted funds". Income and expenditure related to such donation income are charged to "restricted funds".

Provisions

Provisions (i.e. liabilities of uncertain timing or amount) are recognised when there is an obligation at the reporting date as a result of a past event, it is probable that economic benefit will be transferred to settle the obligation and the amount of the obligation can be estimated reliably.

Going concern

The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis. In drawing this conclusion, the trustees have considered their plans for a period of no less than 12 months from the date of signature of these accounts.

Volunteers

The Trustees are grateful for the support of the volunteers in the activities of the charity . In accordance with SORP 2015, no valuation of volunteer time has been included in the accounts.
