The charity was established under a trust deed in 1945 and is registered with the Charity Commission, No 509743, and affiliated with the British Beekeepers Association. Its principal correspondence address is Wharfe Bank House, Ings Road, Ulleskelf, North Yorkshire, LS24 9SS.

The objective of the association is to promote and further the craft of beekeeping.

The Committee is appointed by and from the membership. The policy is determined by the Committee which meets regularly and is responsible for all decision making. Decisions are implemented by the officers and other volunteers.

Review of the Year

The financial health of the charity remains robust. The annual honey show, hosted by the Egton Show, attracted a record number of entries and our attendance at the Great Yorkshire Show helped, amongst other things, to raise public awareness to the threat posed to honey bees and other pollinators by the Yellow Legged Asian Hornet. The National Bee unit confirmed that an Asian Hornet nest had been found in Langton, North Yorkshire as part of their ongoing eradication programme and a strategy is in place to deal with any future incursions. Bee improvement events, featuring guest speakers, were well attended using "Zoom" technology and are set to continue during the winter months. Committee Meetings, the Annual Delegate's Meeting and the Annual General Meeting are held in hybrid format using "Zoom"; and regular contact with the membership has been maintained through the association's website and mailshots.

Financial Review

The Charity's income totalled £68,596 (2024: £70,755) and expenditure totalled £64,235 (2024: £67,547), resulting in a surplus of £4,361 (2024: £3,208 surplus) for the year.

Reserves Policy

The trustees aim to hold an unrestricted reserve equal to around six month's expenditure to provide sufficient working capital and to fund future equipment purchases. The reserves currently stand just above this level.

Risk Management

The Committee has conducted a review of the major risks to which the Charity is exposed and systems have been developed to mitigate those risks. These systems are reviewed periodically to ensure that they still meet the needs of the Association.







NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2025

1 Accounting policies

Charity Information

Yorkshire Beekeepers Association is a public benefit entity. It is a registered charity constituted under a trust deed. The principal address is Wharfe Bank House, Ings Road, Ulleskelf, North Yorkshire, LS24 9SS.

1.1 Accounting Convention

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Charities SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice: 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities') FRS 102 version, (effective 1 January 2015).

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest pound.

1.2 Income

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

The following specific policies are applied:

- Investment income is included when receivable.
- Income from charitable trading activities are accounted for when earned.
- Capitation fees are accounted for when receivable.
- Voluntary income by way of donations or sponsorship is included when the charity is entitled to the income.

1.3 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as the liability is incurred and includes the related VAT as this cannot be recovered.

Charitable expenditure comprises the costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services.

All costs are directly allocated to a particular activity.

1.4 Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Fixtures, fittings & equipment 4 years straight line.

The charity capitalises all asset purchases over £250.

The trustees believe the cups are worth around £1,500 more than their net book value due to recent rises in metal prices, but no professional valuation has been obtained.

The investment in Bee Craft Limited, comprising 320 Shares of Nominal Value £1.00 each, represents 5.33% of the total number of shares issued and is held on behalf of the Yorkshire Beekeepers Association by the Treasurer and Secretary, who are the nominated shareholders. The shares are recognised in the accounts at nominal value and no dividends have ever been paid.

1.5 Fund Accounting

General funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds ear-marked by the committee for particular purposes.

Restricted funds can only be applied for particular purposes as set by the donor.

1.6 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

1.7 Financial Instruments

The Association has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments Issues' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments. Financial instruments are recognised in the balance sheet when the Association becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

1.8 Basic Financial Assets

Basic financial assets, which include debtors and cash and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial assets classified as receivable within one year are not amortised.

1.9 Classification of Financial Liabilities

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the Association after deducting all of its liabilities.

1.10 Basic Financial Liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including creditors, bank loans, loans from fellow group companies and preference shares that are classified as debt, are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial liabilities classified as payable within one year are not amortised.

Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method.

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Amounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade creditors are recognised initially at transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

The financial health of the charity remains robust. A planned Autumn Convention was cancelled due to a lack of support by members, with significant costs incurred, but several other activities have taken place successfully, including a microscopy training course and a honey show hosted by the Emley Show Society. Our attendance at the Great Yorkshire Show helped to increase public awareness of the risks to beekeeping of Asian Hornets, and highlighted the strategy to be implemented to deal with any incursions. Bee improvement events, featuring guest speakers, were well attended using "Zoom" technology and are set to continue during the winter months. Electronic equipment has been purchased to enable Committee Meetings, the Annual Delegate's Meeting and the Annual General Meeting to be held in hybrid format using "Zoom"; and regular contact with the membership has been maintained through the association's website and mailshots.

Financial Review

The Charity's income totalled £70,755 (2023: £63,628) and expenditure totalled £67,547 (2023: £64,764), resulting in a surplus of £3,208 (2023: £1,136 deficit) for the year.

Reserves Policy

The trustees aim to hold an unrestricted reserve equal to around six month's expenditure to provide sufficient working capital and to fund future equipment purchases. The reserves currently stand just above this level.

Risk Management

The Committee has conducted a review of the major risks to which the Charity is exposed and systems have been developed to mitigate those risks. These systems are reviewed periodically to ensure that they still meet the needs of the Association.





1 Accounting policies

Charity Information

Yorkshire Beekeepers Association is a public benefit entity. It is a registered charity constituted under a trust deed. The principal address is Wharfe Bank House, Ings Road, Ulleskelf, North Yorkshire, LS24 9SS.

1.1 Accounting Convention

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Charities SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice: 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities') FRS 102 version, (effective 1 January 2015).

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest pound.

1.2 Income

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

The following specific policies are applied:

- Investment income is included when receivable.
- Income from charitable trading activities are accounted for when earned.
- Capitation fees are accounted for when receivable.
- Voluntary income by way of donations or sponsorship is included when the charity is entitled to the income.

1.3 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as the liability is incurred and includes the related VAT as this cannot be recovered.

Charitable expenditure comprises the costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services.

All costs are directly allocated to a particular activity.

1.4 Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Fixtures, fittings & equipment 4 years straight line.

The charity capitalises all asset purchases over £250.

The trustees believe the cups are worth around £1,500 more than their net book value due to recent rises in metal prices, but no professional valuation has been obtained.

The investment in Bee Craft Limited, comprising 320 Shares of Nominal Value £1.00 each, represents 5.33% of the total number of shares issued and is held on behalf of the Yorkshire Beekeepers Association by the Treasurer and Secretary, who are the nominated shareholders. The shares are recognised in the accounts at nominal value and no dividends have ever been paid.

1.5 Fund Accounting

General funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds ear-marked by the committee for particular purposes.

Restricted funds can only be applied for particular purposes as set by the donor.

1.6 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

1.7 Financial Instruments

The Association has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments Issues' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments. Financial instruments are recognised in the balance sheet when the Association becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

1.8 Basic Financial Assets

Basic financial assets, which include debtors and cash and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial assets classified as receivable within one year are not amortised.

1.9 Classification of Financial Liabilities

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the Association after deducting all of its liabilities.

1.10 Basic Financial Liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including creditors, bank loans, loans from fellow group companies and preference shares that are classified as debt, are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial liabilities classified as payable within one year are not amortised.

Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method.

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Amounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade creditors are recognised initially at transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Bee improvement events, featuring guest speakers, were successfully staged and well attended using "Zoom" technology and will continue during the winter months. Unfortunately, the planned Autumn Convention and Honey Show had to be cancelled due to a lack of support by members, with significant costs being incurred. All Committee Meetings, the Annual Delegate's Meeting and the Annual General Meeting continue to be held via "Zoom"; and regular contact with the membership has been maintained through the association's website and regular mailshots.

Financial Review

The Charity's income totalled £63,628 (2022: £61,940) and expenditure totalled £64,764 (2022: £58,417), resulting in a deficit of £1,136 (2022: £3,523 surplus) for the year.

Reserves Policy

The trustees aim to hold an unrestricted reserve equal to around six month's expenditure to provide sufficient working capital and to fund future equipment purchases. The reserves currently stand just above this level.

Risk Management



The objective of the association is to promote and further the craft of beekeeping.

The Committee is appointed by and from the membership. The policy is determined by the Committee which meets regularly and is responsible for all decision making. Decisions are implemented by the officers and other volunteers.

Review of the Year

The financial health of the charity remains robust, although activities have been affected by Covid-19. However, as restrictions have been eased, there are positive signs that a number of events will take place during the course of the year, including cosmetics and soap from honey and beeswax workshops; a honey show; and beekeeping displays at the Great Yorkshire Show, which successfully returned in 2022 after an absence of two years. Bee improvement events, featuring guest speakers, have been successfully staged using "Zoom" technology and will continue during the winter months; and Study Sessions covering Honey Bee Health Assessments; Honeybee Management; and Honeybee Products and Forage; were convened via "Zoom". All Committee Meetings, the Annual Delegate's Meeting and the Annual General Meeting continue to be held via "Zoom"; and regular contact with the membership has been maintained through the association's website and distribution of the monthly newsletter containing practical advice for all levels of beekeeping.

Financial Review

The Charity's income totalled £61,940 (2021: £55,691) and expenditure totalled £58,417 (2021: £52,085), resulting in a surplus of £3,523 (2021: £3,606 surplus) for the year.

Reserves Policy

The trustees aim to hold an unrestricted reserve equal to around six month's expenditure to provide sufficient working capital and to fund future equipment purchases. The reserves currently stand just above this level.

Risk Management

The Committee has conducted a review of the major risks to which the Charity is exposed and systems have been developed to mitigate those risks. These systems are reviewed periodically to ensure that they still meet the needs of the Association.

Public Benefit

The trustees have complied with their duty under Section 17(5) of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to Charity Commission guidance on public benefit.



1 Accounting policies

Charity Information

Yorkshire Beekeepers Association is a public benefit entity. It is a registered charity constituted under a trust deed. The principal address is Wharfe Bank House, Ings Road, Ulleskelf, North Yorkshire, LS24 9SS.

1.1 Accounting Convention

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Charities SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice: 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities') FRS 102 version, (effective 1 January 2015).

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest pound.

1.2 Income

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

The following specific policies are applied:

- Investment income is included when receivable.
- Income from charitable trading activities are accounted for when earned.
- Capitation fees are accounted for when receivable.
- Voluntary income by way of donations or sponsorship is included when the charity is entitled to the income.

1.3 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as the liability is incurred and includes the related VAT as this cannot be recovered.

Charitable expenditure comprises the costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services.

All costs are directly allocated to a particular activity.

1.4 Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Fixtures, fittings & equipment 4 years straight line.

The charity capitalises all asset purchases over £250.

The trustees believe the cups are worth around £1,000 more than their net book value due to recent rises in metal prices, but no professional valuation has been obtained.

Information relating to a long standing investment in Bee Craft Limited, comprising 320 Shares of Nominal Value £1.00 each, only recently came to light. This shareholding represents 5.33% of the total number of shares issued and is held on behalf of the Yorkshire Beekeepers Association by the Treasurer and Secretary, who are the nominated shareholders. The shares are recognised in the accounts at nominal value and no dividends have ever been paid.

1.5 Fund Accounting

General funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds ear-marked by the committee for particular purposes.

Restricted funds can only be applied for particular purposes as set by the donor.

1.6 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

1.7 Financial Instruments

The Charity's income totalled £55,691 (2020: £47,794) and expenditure totalled £52,085 (2020: £44,872), resulting in a surplus of £3,606 (2019: £2,922 surplus) for the year.

Reserves Policy

The trustees aim to hold an unrestricted reserve equal to around six month's expenditure to provide sufficient working capital and to fund future equipment purchases. The reserves currently stand just above this level.

Risk Management

The Committee has conducted a review of the major risks to which the Charity is exposed and systems have been developed to mitigate those risks. These systems are reviewed periodically to ensure that they still meet the needs of the Association.

Public Benefit



- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.



As the charity's trustees, you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ("the Act").





1 Accounting policies

Charity Information

Yorkshire Beekeepers Association is a public benefit entity. It is a registered charity constituted under a trust deed. The principal address is Wharfe Bank House, Ings Road, Ulleskelf, North Yorkshire, LS24 9SS.

1.1 Accounting Convention

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Charities SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice: 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities') FRS 102 version, (effective 1 January 2015).

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest pound.

1.2 Income

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

The following specific policies are applied:

- Investment income is included when receivable.
- Income from charitable trading activities are accounted for when earned.
- Capitation fees are accounted for when receivable.
- Voluntary income by way of donations or sponsorship is included when the charity is entitled to the income.

1.3 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as the liability is incurred and includes the related VAT as this cannot be recovered.

Charitable expenditure comprises the costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services.

All costs are directly allocated to a particular activity.

1.4 Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Fixtures, fittings & equipment 4 years straight line.

The charity capitalises all asset purchases over £250.

The trustees believe the cups are worth around £1,000 more than their net book value due to recent rises in metal prices, but no professional valuation has been obtained.

Information relating to a long standing investment in Bee Craft Limited, comprising 320 Shares of Nominal Value £1.00 each, only recently came to light. This shareholding represents 5.33% of the total number of shares issued and is held on behalf of the Yorkshire Beekeepers Association by the Treasurer and Secretary, who are the nominated shareholders. The shares are recognised in the accounts at nominal value and no dividends have ever been declared or received.

1.5 Fund Accounting

General funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds ear-marked by the committee for particular purposes.

Restricted funds can only be applied for particular purposes as set by the donor.

1.6 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

1.7 Financial Instruments

The Association has elected to apply the provisions of Section 11 'Basic Financial Instruments' and Section 12 'Other Financial Instruments Issues' of FRS 102 to all of its financial instruments. Financial instruments are recognised in the balance sheet when the Association becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, with the net amounts presented in the financial statements, when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

1.8 Basic Financial Assets

Basic financial assets, which include debtors and cash and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial assets classified as receivable within one year are not amortised.

1.9 Classification of Financial Liabilities

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the Association after deducting all of its liabilities.

1.10 Basic Financial Liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including creditors, bank loans, loans from fellow group companies and preference shares that are classified as debt, are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial liabilities classified as payable within one year are not amortised.

Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method.

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Amounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade creditors are recognised initially at transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.
