Structure, governance and management

Governing document

The Linthorpe Community Association is an unincorporated charity, constituted under a trust deed and registered with the Charity Commission under charity number 510300.

Governing body and organisational management

The policy and general management of the affairs of the Association are controlled by a General Committee.

If vacancies occur among the honorary officers of the Association or its own members, the General Committee has the power to fill these posts from amongst its members and those of the Association.

The General Committee meets not less than six times per year.

In addition, the General Committee may co-opt further members, who shall be members of the Association, provided that the number of co-opted members shall not exceed one third of the total membership of the Committee.

The General Committee also has the power to appoint such committees as it may from time to time determine, and may determine their power and terms of reference.

Members of the General Committee are trustees for the purpose of charity law. Details of those members of the General Committee who served during the year are included at page 1.

Trustee training

New trustees are inducted into the working environment of the charity, and also of the organisation as a registered charity, including trustees' policy and procedures.

Risk management

The trustees and members of the General Committee have examined the major strategic, business and operational risks which the charity could be exposed to, and have established systems to monitor and control any such risks to mitigate any impact that they may have on the charity.

Objectives and activities for the public benefit

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives.

The objectives of the Charity

The objects of the Linthorpe Community Association are twofold. Firstly, to promote the benefit of the inhabitants of Linthorpe and neighbourhood by associating the Local Authorities, voluntary organisations and inhabitants in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the objects of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants. Secondly, to establish or to secure the establishment of a Community Centre and to maintain and manage, or to co-operate with any local statutory authority in the maintenance and management of such a Centre for activities promoted by the Association and its constituent bodies in furtherance of the above objects.

Achievements and performance

Chairperson's report

The charity's policies in the pursuit of its objectives have not changed during the year. The General Committee considers the activities of the charity during the year to be satisfactory. The Linthorpe Community Association continued to run the Linthorpe Community Centre through its volunteers, thus providing a place for various groups to hold their meetings. The Association also continued to operate regular coffee mornings and other fundraising events in order to contribute funds for the general running of the building. Other funding included rental fees for the use of the Community Centre by user groups, and from the availability of the hall for hire for private parties.

Financial review

Results for the year

The charity continues to be reliant on the local community utilising the facilities of the Linthorpe Community Association. The Charity is pleased to report that the hire of the community centre has once again resulted in a surplus this year with charitable incoming resources during the year exceeding charitable resources expended for the year by £4,132.

Reserves policy

The charity has established a reserves policy whereby the unrestricted reserves held by the charity should be sufficient to enable the charity to fund between 6 and 9 months of resources expended. At this level, the management committee feel that they would be able to continue the current activities of the charity in the event of a significant drop in its income. This 6 to 9 month period would provide the charity with the necessary time to seek and develop new streams of income. In the unlikely event that the Community Centre could not function on a voluntary basis through the Linthorpe Community Association, the building would revert to the control of Middlesbrough Borough Council. The Linthorpe Community Association currently has general reserves of £16,611 which would cover 8 months of normal operational costs. It is hoped that activity levels and use of the community hall should continue. The trustees continue to endeavour to establish additional income streams and encourage existing income streams to increase. However fixed operating costs of the establishment continue to increase by a greater amount and this places a burden on the long term viability of the organisation.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the charity for that year. In preparing these financial statements the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principals in the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

I report on the accounts of Linthorpe Community Association for the year ended 31 July 2025 set out on pages 1 to 12.

1. Statement of Compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland FRS102 (Charity SORP (FRS102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

2. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

2.1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 and the Charities Act 2011.

2.2. Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

The major sources of income are received by ways of fees, donations, fundraising activities, community centre hire and coffee bar. Gifts donated for resale are included as income when they are sold. Donated assets are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified and a third party is bearing the cost. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable.

2.3. Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs are those costs incurred with the administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

2.4. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Fixtures, fittings and equipment - 20% reducing balance

2.5. Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
