Report of the Chair

I would like to start by taking this opportunity to thank the trustees, staff and our lovely volunteers for acting tirelessly for the benefit of our charity, service and our listeners. I am proud of what we have achieved this year under challenging circumstances.

We started the year with the very real possibility that we might have to wind up the service as our finances were such that we only had enough to cover several months operating costs and salaries.

The Trustees agreed that we would have a fundraising drive with adverts in the local papers, and on social media making people aware of our situation. This was well received, and we received an influx of donations from listeners and people in the local area whose relatives had received our service in the past. It was heart-warming to see how much the local community values our service. This also led to an increase in our listener

Having applied to over forty grant funders, we were fortunate to receive a grant from the National Lottery and a grant from the Prevention and Early Intervention Grant Programme to Combat Social Isolation, we also received smaller grants from other funders, many of whom have supported us in the past. The outcome of all this fundraising was that our service could continue, and we could afford to give our staff a small but well deserved pay rise.

Yet again this year we have still been affected by delays with the post, this has been ongoing for the last year leading to delays with both the recordings being delivered to our listeners and delays with items being returned to us. The Talking News Federation had a meeting with Royal Mail as this is a countrywide problem experienced by many Talking Newspaper services. We are fortunate that grants from Morrisons Supermarket and Hillard's Trust have enabled us to buy extra pouches to help alleviate the impact on our service and ensure that it continues uninterrupted. The postal issues have improved slightly but we are still experiencing delays as are our listeners.



Report of the Chair

2020 has been a very trying year due to the Covid situation. The finances are still in a very healthy position due to the very generous allowances by the Grantees of accepting that the spends may not be of what the grants were initially allowed.

We did have grants that paid for salaries and the furlough scheme did help with not having to use all our grants for the time lost.

We managed to only close for three months due to the government restrictions, but the age of our volunteers does mean that we have been restricted with the amount of help that has been offered.

As we were limited for space all trustee meetings from February had to be cancelled. We were short on volunteers at the beginning of the year and Covid has only exasperated the matter.

We have been unable to run our usual fund raising items this year and this has had an effect on our income. A grant by RMBC of £10,000 has been very welcome and this does not have any restrictions placed upon it.

We did manage to run our Christmas Raffle and this proved to be a great success giving some light to, what was for all concerned, a very miserable year. Alexa has been up and running and is proving to be a further weapon in our arsenal in reaching the visually impaired community.

Both I and the trustees would like to thank all listeners and volunteers for the hard work and effort that has been applied during this difficult year, and here is to 2021 with the hope that it will bring better days.
