1. Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of accounts

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

(b) Funds

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the trustees for a particular purpose.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by charity for particular purposes.

(c) Income

Income is recorded in these financial statements when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. Income is recognised on a receipts basis.

No amounts are included in the financial statements for services or time donated by volunteers.

(d) Expenditure

All expenditure is accounted for on a payment basis. Expenditure includes attributable VAT, which cannot be recovered.

2. Related party transactions

No trustee has been paid expenses (other than reimbursement for items purchased during the year on behalf of the choir) nor received remuneration.

3. Ultimate controlling party

There is no ultimate controlling party.

Structure, governance and management, including objectives and activities:

The choir was founded in 1974 and operates under an amended constitution adopted on 22 July 1998 – and subsequently amended on July 9th 2003. The choir's objectives are to learn music and songs for male voices, with a view to singing in concerts, to educate the community as to the beauty of music, and to raise monies for other good causes.

The trust's significant activities for achieving its objectives for the public benefit are holding weekly rehearsals enabling the choir to perform in concerts.

New trustees are elected at general meetings. Prospective trustees are nominated by members before being voted on by choir members in attendance at the AGM. Each of the trustees shall retire with effect from the conclusion of the AGM next after his or her appointment but shall be eligible for re-election at that AGM. Trustees are inducted and trained by the other trustees and committee members.

Achievements and performance:

Following the impact of the COVID-19 outbreak the choir has seen a reduction in the number of choristers. However the choir was successful in raising funds for numerous charities.

Following a Thanksgiving Service in Alcester, the 50th Annual Concert was held at Ragley Hall, Alcester, with two performances over one weekend. As this was a concert celebrating 50 years of the choir together with its founder and musical director, it was never intended that this would be a profit-making event, and some of the funds which had been accumulated over previous years were used to offset the shortfall incurred. The concerts were however very successful and raised the profile of the choir even more in the local area.

In May the choir participated in the Cornwall International Male Voice Choir Festival, performing in numerous concerts throughout Cornwall over the May Day Bank Holiday weekend.

Other concerts in which we participated were reasonably local, held in Stratford-upon-Avon, Henley-in-Arden and Alcester.

The year culminated in the choir giving a recital in Chester Cathedral.

Supporting Alcester is a prime function of the choir and during the last year we supported the Alcester High Bailiff's function/services/concerts and participated in carols at Christmas.

The choir is very much self-supporting and continued to raise funds to fulfil its charitable objectives by collecting subscriptions from members, and through internal fund-raising activities eg raffles, producing Christmas cards, photographs of the choir etc.

Financial review

The lower number of choristers obviously had some impact in the choir accounts.


The Deposit Account holds funds primarily as Reserves to be used for one off expenditure and to support future Annual Concerts. At the end of the financial year 2023/4, the balance stood at £37,536.71, having been reduced by a net amount of £8496.68 during the year largely due to the shortfall on the celebratory 50th Annual Concert. From the remaining balance at 31/7/24, £17610 is ring-fenced for Annual Concerts and £18587 for Reserves.

All choir income and expenditure is processed through the main account, and this shows a deficit of £1713.05 on the general running of the choir during the 2023/4 financial year, largely due to the fact that the majority of any miscellaneous income, grants and donations received was used to reduce the shortfall on the Annual Concert as much as possible prior to using accumulated funds held in the Deposit Account. This deficit was slightly reduced by a small excess made on the Cornwall weekend, resulting in an overall deficit on the general account of £1374.22. As previously stated, this was a one-off celebratory year and it is anticipated that the choir will return to a break-even/profit situation during 2024/5.

Public benefit

The trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers or duties.

Report of the Trustees
For the year ended 31 July 2022

Structure, governance and management, including objectives and activities:

The choir was founded in 1974 and operates under an amended constitution adopted on 22 July 1998 – and subsequently amended on July 9th 2003. The choir's objectives are to learn music and songs for male voices, with a view to sing in concerts, to educate the community as to the beauty of music, and to raise monies for other good causes.

The trust's significant activities for achieving its objectives for the public benefit are holding weekly rehearsals enabling the choir to perform in concerts.

New trustees are elected at general meetings. Prospective trustees are nominated by members before being voted on by choir members in attendance at the AGM. Each of the trustees shall retire with effect from the conclusion of the AGM next after his or her appointment but shall be eligible for re-election at that AGM. Trustees are inducted and trained by the other trustees and committee members.

Achievements and performance:

The impact of the COVID-19 outbreak still affected the choir's activities during the 2021/22 choir year, with concerts not commencing until December 2021.

However, subsequently the choir was successful in raising funds for a number of charities. The 48th Annual Concert was held at Pershore Abbey.. It was a successful concert and the profit raised enables the choir to secure subsequent annual concerts with ever increasing costs. In April/May the choir took part in the Cornwall Festival of Male Voice Choirs and our contributions in the various concerts were well received. We also participated in concerts in Evesham, Broadway and Alcester and the year was rounded off by a group of choristers singing in the massed choirs at the Opening Ceremony of the 2022 Commonwealth Games in Birmingham.

Supporting Alcester is a prime function of the choir and during the last year we supported the Alcester High Bailiff's function/services/concerts and participated in carols at Christmas.

The choir is very much self-supporting and continued to raise funds to fulfil its charitable objectives by collecting subscriptions from members, and through internal fund raising activities eg raffles, producing Christmas cards, photographs of the choir etc.

Financial review

The impact of COVID-19 epidemic also affected the choir in that a number of choristers did not return when choir activities recommenced and we are now rebuilding to a degree. This obviously had some impact in the choir accounts.

In addition, as a result of our bank instigating bank charges, it was decided to consolidate our accounts and close three of them during the year to save on charges:-.

The Tour Account was closed and the small balance transferred to the Main account.

The Concert Account was closed, an amount of £24800 was transferred to the deposit account and ringfenced to be used for future concerts, with the remaining small balance transferred to the Main account.


The Reserves Account was closed, an amount of £20800 was transferred to the Deposit Account and ringfenced to be used for unexpected or one-off expenditure, with the remaining small balance transferred to the Main Account.

All choir income and expenditure is now processed through the main account, and this shows an excess of income over expenditure of £3907.33 during the financial year. £1660 of this was profit made on the Annual Concert and it is anticipated that a further transfer will be made to the Deposit Account during the next financial year. The additional profit will be used to replenish funds which were lost over the last two years as a result of the COVID epidemic.

Public benefit

The trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers or duties.
