## Report of the Trustees for the year ended 5th April 2023

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 5th April 2023. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

### OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

#### Objectives and aims

The trustees have confirmed that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Trust's aims and objectives and in planning future activities and setting the charitable expenditure policy for the year.

The Trust carries out these objects by:

- a) the purchase or hire of any equipment for use in investigating, treating or alleviating the suffering of any cancer patient in the North Humberside or Scarborough region or for the purposes of research leading to the advancement of medical science in the field of radiotherapy and oncology generally.
- b) paying the expenses of sending any person engaged in the field of radiotherapy and oncology to or upon any conference or course or study.
- c) such other purposes or uses as the trustees may deem desirable and consistent with the above objects.

#### Significant activities

#### Expenditure

##### Education

The educational expenditure this year has provided continued financial support to a research scientist, Dr Dimitris Manolis at the University of Hull to allow him to complete his thesis. He has subsequently found further research funding from Cancer UK; the Trustees are delighted that with the support of the Trust Fund, he now has found stable research funding.

The outcome of these educational activities will be to support the continued development of the Queen's Centre for Oncology and Haematology as a forward-thinking centre of excellence, particularly in molecular biology and radiation physics.

We have also supported a Consultant Radiographer - Miss Stephanie Hatcliffe, to attend an educational course on advanced communication as part of her continuing professional development.

##### Equipment for patients

Once more we have kept the lung cancer team supplied with hand held fans to donate to patients struggling with breathlessness.

### **FUTURE PLANS**

At 5th April 2023, the charity had reserves of £270,634 (2022 £206,519).

#### **Capital expenditure**

As most of the equipment required for the treatment of cancer costs tens if not hundreds of thousands of pounds the trustees intend to build up reserves to such an amount that will enable them to purchase or lease equipment that can assist in the radiotherapy and oncology departments. In either case this will only be possible if the local NHS Trust is prepared to meet the maintenance cost of the equipment.

Capital projects for the forthcoming year will be considered for support if they would not normally be funded by the hospital and would contribute to the care and comfort of patients from the area of benefit being treated at the Queen's Centre or one of the other local cancer units.

#### **Research**

The radiotherapy department at the Queen's Centre is a leading centre for the research and development of new radiotherapy techniques. In addition, the University of Hull carries out research into the basic science of cancer and its treatment in the Daisy building on the Castle Hill site. The Castle Hill Cancer Trust Fund is committed to supporting these endeavours in areas of research which will lead to patient benefit in the future but will expect the recipients of funding to feedback on their progress regularly to ensure and document a return on investment.

#### **Other projects**

The trustees are open to applications for funding for educational purposes and have in the past funded MSc courses, conference attendance etc. They would also welcome applications from innovative projects aimed at improving the quality of life of cancer patients and their carers in the region.



#### Significant activities

##### Income

In the year April 2020 to April 2021, the Castle Hill Hospital Cancer Trust Fund raised a substantial sum from the Burstwick Country Golf Club Charity day held for the benefit of the Trust Fund. A fun day was had by all and the raffle of a prize kindly donated by the Neal's Yard shop in Beverley increased the amount raised on the day.

We also received income from individual donors and legacies and a significant amount of money continues to be raised through charity giving websites.

##### Expenditure

###### Education

The educational expenditure this year has supported radiographers, nurses and doctors to attend courses and a clinical oncology registrar to update his advanced cardiac life support skills. The feedback from the staff attending these events has been extremely positive.

The outcome of these educational activities will be to support the continued development of the Queen's Centre for Oncology and Haematology as a forward-thinking centre of excellence.

A course on oncogeriatrics was particularly popular and has set the scene for the development of a specialist comprehensive oncogeriatrics outpatient service at the Queen's Centre.

###### Research

A donation to the University of Hull is continuing to support a PhD research project being undertaken by a member of the in house medical physics department.

###### Equipment for patients

Once more we have kept the lung cancer team supplied with hand held fans to donate to patients struggling with breathlessness.

### FUTURE PLANS

At 5th April 2021, the charity had reserves of £106,861 (2020 £65,046).

#### Capital expenditure

As most of the equipment required for the treatment of cancer costs tens if not hundreds of thousands of pounds the trustees intend to build up reserves to such an amount that will enable them to purchase or lease equipment that can assist in the radiotherapy and oncology departments. In either case this will only be possible if the local NHS Trust is prepared to meet the maintenance cost of the equipment.

Capital projects for the forthcoming year will be considered for support if they would not normally be funded by the hospital and would contribute to the care and comfort of patients from the area of benefit being treated at the Queen's Centre or one of the other local cancer units.

#### Research

The radiotherapy department at the Queen's Centre is a leading centre for the research and development of new radiotherapy techniques. In addition, the University of Hull carries out research into the basic science of cancer and its treatment in the Daisy building on the Castle Hill site. The Castle Hill Cancer Trust Fund is committed to supporting these endeavours in areas of research which will lead to patient benefit in the future but will expect the recipients of funding to feedback on their progress regularly to ensure and document a return on investment.

#### Other projects

The trustees are open to applications for funding for educational purposes and have in the past funded MSc courses, conference attendance etc. They would also welcome applications from innovative projects aimed at improving the quality of life of cancer patients and their carers in the region.
