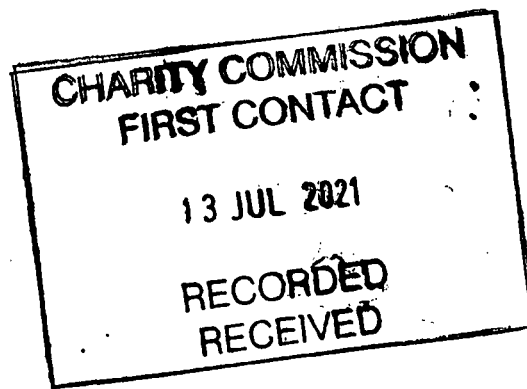

Report of the Trustees **for the Year ended 31 March 2021**

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2021. The trustees at the date of this report are set out on page 1.

Structure, governance and management

The trust is governed by trustees in accordance with the Declaration of Trust "The Christian Fellowship (Easingwold and District)" dated 4th May 1984, and the Supplemental Deed of Trust dated 4th July 2007. The trustees delegate the spiritual oversight and day-to-day organisation to a leadership team. Recruitment and appointment of trustees is carried out in accordance with the provisions of the Declaration of Trust. Application for the position of trustee is open to any individual who subscribes to the statement of faith as set out in the Declaration of Trust. The trustees have given due regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission in respect of public benefit when fulfilling the objectives of the charity.

Objectives and activities

The objectives of the Trust are set out in detail in the Declaration, but summarised as the advancement of the Christian faith and the relief of hardship resulting from distress, age or sickness.

Achievements and performance

Meetings on Sundays continued intermittently at the Gaitres centre and mid-week at Springhill Court and in members' homes as virus restrictions have allowed in the year. Financial support has been given to individuals and organisations in the UK and abroad.

Financial review

Unrestricted income exceeded expenditure for the year by £1,315. Funds placed on deposit earned interest of £153. The trustees are satisfied that that the trust has sufficient unrestricted reserves to continue to fulfil its objectives.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 March 2021

1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year.

1.1 Statement of Compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS102, "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland", Charities SORP (FRS102) and the Charities Act 2011. The entity transitioned from previous UK GAAP to FRS102 as at 1 April 2015. No transitional adjustments were required in the retained funds or income and expenditure for that year.

1.2 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Gifts donated for resale are included as incoming resources within activities for generating funds when they are sold.

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable.

1.3 Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of trading for fundraising purposes.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:
