The village hall will be provided for use without distinction of sex, sexual orientation, age, disability, nationality, race or political, religious or other opinions, including use of the hall for meetings, lectures and classes or other forms of recreation and leisure time occupation in the interests of social welfare and with the object of improving the conditions of life for all in the community.
