Para 1.17 and 1.19	<p>The activities of the hall has been severely limited by COVID and the legislation introduced to protect the community. In a normal year the hall would be used on a regular basis by a number of groups that attract a wide cross section of the village population. Regular users of the hall in 2020/21 include: Tirril Womens Guild; The Wine Group, The Entertainment Group; The</p>

		<p>Playgroup; The Art Group; The Indoor Bowling Group; The Keep Fit Group; The Scottish Dancing Group and The Parish Council.</p> <p>In addition the hall would be used for a number of villagers' private functions such as weddings, birthdays and children's parties.</p>

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	The Charity's financial position has been strengthened by the COVID grants it has received during the year even though its room rental revenue has dropped significantly. At the end of 2021 the general fund balance was £22767 compared with £13630 the previous year. The hall development fund balance is £21126. A copy of the Receipts and Payments account is attached to this report.
Statement explaining the policy for holding reserves stating why they are held	Para 1.22	The reserve policy is to hold at least £3,000 as a contingency against any unforeseen future expenditure. Of the reserves at 31 st Dec 2021, £28,200 is earmarked for insulation work already contracted for being undertaken in February 2022. Other improvement work will be decided on in the near future in order to utilise the lion's share of the hall general fund, which has accrued due to COVID grants.



