Reserves in the bank as at 30/6/2021 were £46172 are at that point were all unrestricted. As we are currently reviewing our maintenance policy and structure of finances, a policy document with Risk Register will be written for the foreseeable future with a view to having restricted funds.

There are no funds in deficit.

The funds held in reserve are to cover the next 18 -24 months due to the adverse effect of the Coronavirus Covid19 pandemic.

The village hall charity had an income of £35938 in the year ended 30th June 2021 and has been subject to an independent examination. Of this income the total of £33394.75 can be accounted for furlough payments and various grants through the UK Government and local authority. This means the actual trading income amounted only to £2543.25.

In the course of my examination, no matter has come to my attention

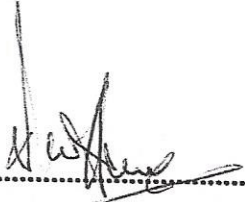

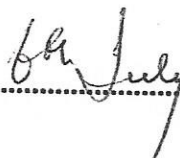
