We provide varied services and activities to try to assist as many people as possible. The trustees have considered the Commissions guidance on public benefit and, in particular, the specific guidance on charities for the advancement of religion. In particular we try to enable ordinary people to live out their faith as part of our community through: worship, prayer, discipleship, pastoral care, mission and outreach work. Main areas of activity were: Children's Work, Youth Work, Special Events, Visitation, Mission Work, Various Courses, Weekly Drop-ins, School Work, Community Choir and Community Projects. In addition to these activities the Church held regular weekly services which are open to all. Links have been maintained with other local churches and joint ventures undertaken with them. We have also maintained links with local schools and the wider voluntary and community sector. We have also helped with mission work abroad particularly in India and Uganda. To facilitate this work, it is important that we maintain the fabric of The King's Church Thornton Centre.</p>

The charity continues to be funded by donations from the members of the church congregation. Expenses exceeded income in part due to timing differences of payments for seconded and salaried staff. The deficit was funded by unrestricted reserves. The trustees consider that the charity remains on a solid financial footing, with stable long term trend of donation income, and reduced outgoings forecast for the following year.
