The removal of the unsatisfactory Caretakers was put in place.

Due to Covid, the Hall was closed to the public in March 2020. During this time the hall, kitchen and meeting room were redecorated to a high standard.

The treasurer completed all financial statements and paid all ongoing bills, e.g. water rates, gas and electricity.

Anonymous donations were received, one cheque for £20,000 and a further cheque for £30,000, to be used for the good of the Village Hall.

Covid grants of £10,000 and £1334 were received from CDC during the year.

A Yorkshire Dales National Park grant of £2771 was received towards the cost of the redecoration of the hall.
