Trustees Report for the year ended 31st March 2024

Following another successful year at the Royal Manchester Children's Hospital under the guidance of our chief consultant Professor Rob Wyn we hereby submit our annual report. If somebody had said 42 years ago that we would be the largest Leukaemia centre in Europe with 11 cubicles treating thousands of children with blood disorders we would have laughed. I am happy to report that not only are we conquering this problem but we are taking children from other hospitals in the UK where a transplant has failed and putting them right.

As you can see from our accounts the money we have is rather statutory in that having achieved all our goals we are waiting to contribute to the next stride forward. Every woman giving birth in all our local hospitals is asked will she donate the umbilical cord and these we take and freeze. Following a transplant we take the required Stem Cells from the cords and introduce them to the child and the results speak for themselves. There are other "spin offs" in that we don't necessarily need related donors anymore something that in 1983 was impossible and went towards the Anthony Nolan Bone Marrow Fund being formed. Following all this success we now look to the future.

Professor Wyn is setting up a project where research is required to further the Stem Cell process and we are lucky in Manchester to have the Patterson Laboratories and Manchester University on our doorstep to help with this. I foresee that it won't be a singular donation but a series of payments to various sections of the Hospital for research and developments. To this aim I think we need to modernise the Trust and look towards electronic banking and under guidance from our accountants change banks. We have had a good year in donations with a large donation from a millionaire who died and a permanent attachment to PayPal where people donate when buying.

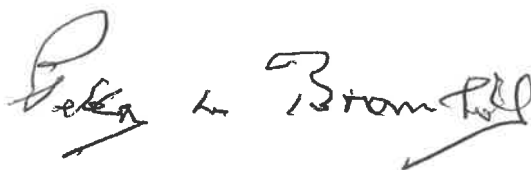
