


Working with the new business manager during the early part of 2023 we separated ourselves financially from the school and ceased payment collections through their ParentMail system. Explanation of any uncertainties about the charity continuing as a going concern	<p>An EGM was held in November 2023 due to very low numbers in attendance at the AGM in September and the quorum not being met.</p> <p>The Chair stepped down during the EGM and it was unsure if anyone would volunteer to fill the position and continue the work of the association.</p> <p>Thankfully Marian was nominated and overwhelmingly voted into the role. The Friends of Cavendish has been going from strength to strength since and any uncertainties around its continuation have been dismissed.</p>



