Total incoming resources amounted to £41,179 (2024 - £35,079) and after deducting total resources expended of £46,995 (2024 - £24,652) net incoming resources amounted to (£5,816) (2024 - £10,427).

At the year-end unrestricted funds amounted to £3,297 and restricted funds amounted to £8,707.
