Annual Report 2023/24



OUR VISION

vision4kids is a Christian based charity with a vision of helping children and young people around the world wherever there is a need to improve the quality of life. In everything we do our aim is to promote the Gospel of Jesus Christ and see lives transformed.

We base all our work on four main themes:

Education

Promoting and supporting school projects ensuring children and young people have the correct tools and facilities to receive an education. This can include repair and maintenance, construction and building at local schools; supply of teaching material, uniforms, classroom furniture and teaching aids; provision of school meals, funding for educational programmes and guidance to school management.

Health

vision4kids will aim to support projects for healthcare working with established charities as well as individual cases where certain funds or practical help can be offered. Always working in a way that makes life more comfortable for the child in question. This will include paying for hospital, surgery and medical bills for the children ensuring they receive necessary treatment and continued after care by local experts; large scale medical screening of larger groups (eg: a school) including basic treatment for minor ailments by a local qualified doctor.

Welfare

Throughout the world there are many children without basic shelter, clothing and food. vision4kids will look to provide the necessary materials to improve living conditions and relieve poverty giving a better way of life. This will include helping with home renovations, providing food to the child and their immediate family; relief shelter in times of emergency and ensuring the child has sufficient clothing and footwear for school and home.

Spiritual

As a Christian based charity the main theme in all we seek to do is to promote the Gospel and see children and young people's lives transformed through the saving power of our Lord Jesus Christ. This will include holding children's Bible Clubs and Sunday School meetings; provision of Bibles and other Christian literature; Bible study and development/counselling classes; visits to local schools to take RE classes and Scripture Union.

OUR FUNDRAISING

Our fundraising focus this year has been on generating much needed funds for the running of our school and the construction of new classrooms. Through the year, there have been a number of methods used to raise funds for the charity; these include:

Child Sponsorship Programme – We have increased the number of sponsor children to 50. Each child has a sponsor family in the UK who provide a £15 donation per month. This contribution goes in its entirety to benefit the child through payment of their school, exam and sports fees; provision of school uniform, shoes and hygiene products; inclusion in school meals; regular health checks and necessary treatments; a Bible; a sack of maize into the family home at the start of each school term.

Fundraising Events – Through the year we hold a number of events including Concerts, Craft Fairs, Coffee Mornings and Sponsored Walks. These are all great ways of getting people involved and raising funds for the work. We also have volunteers who hold their own event or sponsored activity and donate all the proceeds, which has included a parachute jump.

Street Collections – A long standing method of raising funds is through Street Collections and 'Bed Pushes' in local towns and villages. This involves working with the PSNI and Parades Commission to ensure the necessary legal permits are approved and we are fully covered and insured to collect. We have been overwhelmed by the generous response from the local people each time we hold a collection.

Insight Meetings – From time to time the team are invited to speak at various church, school and youth groups. These groups provide a donation to go to the project they are interested in. The vision4kids team are volunteers which ensures 100% of the donation goes to the work amongst the boys and girls.

General Donations – We are so thankful to those supporters who provide donations on a regular, and quite often, a monthly basis. We make full use of the HMRC Gift Aid service which means each donation (where applicable) goes even further. We are thankful to supporters close to vision4kids who cover costs associated with the running of the charity.

We operate a number of income channels including cash, cheque, bank transfer and standing order, Give As You Earn through the workplace, Gift Aid, GASDS, PayPal and online donations through our Givey account.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

This past year has been a time of tremendous progress for both the physical and spiritual work of vision4Kids at Blessed Hill Academy. The Lord has blessed our efforts, and we have seen mighty steps forward in the development of the school and the growth of its community. Significant strides have been made in the construction of the new classroom block, providing much-needed space for our growing student body. We give thanks to God for His provision, knowing that "Except the Lord build the house, they labour in vain that build it" (Psalm 127:1). These advancements have not only improved the learning environment but have also strengthened the school's foundation for future growth.



The appointment of a new school manager, tasked with the pastoral care of the pupils and teachers, has brought fresh energy and leadership to the school. As it says in Proverbs 27:17, *"Iron sharpeneth iron; so a man sharpeneth the countenance of his friend."* The influence of this new leadership has helped to foster a nurturing and spiritually enriching atmosphere for both students and staff.

During our visit in January, Stephen and I were greatly encouraged by the proactive and positive attitude of Divah and his wife, Cecilia. We were able to carry out promising business and financial planning in close collaboration with the vision4Kids Kenya NGO members, laying the groundwork for continued success in the year ahead. *"Where no counsel is, the people fall: but in the multitude of counsellors there is safety"* (Proverbs 11:14).



The highlight of the year for me personally was the mission trip in August 2023, where I had the privilege of leading a team of 16 dedicated individuals. Each day, over 200 children participated in activities, divided into four age groups. We engaged the children with age-appropriate Bible studies, quizzes, singing, and games. It was truly a week filled with joy and blessings. On the final afternoon, five of the older children professed their faith in Christ, an event that brought us all to our knees in thanksgiving. *"I say unto you, that likewise joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth"* (Luke 15:7). We give all the

glory to God for this spiritual harvest, knowing that He has truly blessed the work of Vision4Kids.

Looking back, we see God's hand in all aspects of the charity's work, and we are humbled by His grace and provision. As we move forward, we are filled with anticipation for what He will do next. *"Now unto him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us"* (Ephesians 3:20).

We continue to trust in the Lord for the future, confident that He will guide and provide for the ongoing work at Blessed Hill Academy. All the glory belongs to Him alone. *"Not unto us, O Lord, not unto us, but unto thy name give glory, for thy mercy, and for thy truth's sake"* (Psalm 115:1).

We give thanks for the progress made, and we look forward with faith to the year ahead, trusting that God will continue to bless the children, teachers, and everyone involved in vision4Kids.

AG Electrical Transform School Campus



At the beginning of May, a team of electricians from AG Electrical in Newtownards, supported by PB Plumber from England, made the trip to Kiambururu. It had been a year in the planning spearheaded by company owner Adam Gilmore who was keen to use the teams' skills and expertise to make a difference in the running of the school and in turn, the lives of the pupils.

Specialising in electrical work, the team transformed the wiring and lighting at our school campus. The work started weeks before the team arrived with local builders installing new duct around the grounds and

constructing a switch room which would be the hub for all the wiring, fuse boards, and switches. The team worked through all types of weather to install new cabling across the site, replace all existing wiring in each of the buildings as well as fit new sockets, inside lights, outside security lights, fuse boards, install and set up a computer suite with a projector, and much more. While the electricians were busy wiring, Peter Booth took charge of the kitchen block tiling worktops, and splash boards, installing new toilets, and providing running water into the food preparation area. A superb effort across the week with a lot of hard work. The team at vision4kids is indebted to Adam and the team for not only funding this project but also giving up work at home and leaving family to come to Blessed Hill Academy.



It wasn't all work for the trip. The team were able to take time out to have fun with the children to play football and games. Special assemblies were held by the children to recognise the team's efforts, and Adam had the opportunity to share Bible stories. The team also provided electrical training which was deeply appreciated by the local worke

Denis's Story

As the AG Electrical team worked at the school, a young boy called Denis caught their attention. He lived next to the school compound and was always peering through the fence watching the work. Through the week, the team got to know Denis who loved receiving attention, posing for photographs, and eating everyone's chocolate. After a few days, the team learned that Denis lived with his two siblings and their dad in a small tin hut no bigger than a large garden shed. Like most children in the surrounding area, the family didn't have many possessions, very little money, and they often went days without food. This is one reason why Denis loves to come to school. Not only does he learn, and play with his friends, but he also gets two meals per day: his porridge in the morning and a warm cooked meal in the afternoon usually of maize, rice, vegetables, and meat. Denis' father struggled with poor health and was unable to work, so relied heavily on donations and support from neighbours and family.

During a visit to Denis's home, the team were saddened to see the conditions in which the family lived. The children shared a broken bed while their father slept on some old grain bags on the floor. Their kitchen was outside, next to their toilet facilities which can only be described as extremely unhealthy. Yet Denis still had a smile and a wave every time he spied one of the team. Burdened by the great need of this family, the AG Electrical team gathered some finances and planned a small new home for Denis, including a new toilet, and new kitchen, all covered with a tin roof. It still wasn't going to be a luxurious block building, but it was going to be a massive uplift and improvement on their current situation. Unfortunately, it was towards the end of the team's visit, so they engaged with local skilled builders to construct the building once they left.

Two weeks later and a new home was finished for Denis, his dad, and his brother and sister. Denis' smile just got bigger. Everyone had a new bed, new furniture, new cooking area, sanitised toilet, some new clothes, blankets, pillows, and a table to do his homework. Everyone was so pleased and excited about a new start in their new home.

However, their joy quickly turned to mourning when just ten days after spending their first night in their new home, Denis' dad passed away. Thankfully they got to spend time together and enjoy their new home with comfortable conditions, but it was a tragic time for Denis and the other children. Thankfully, through the help of Samson, and the staff at our school, the children were reunited with their estranged mother, and

they all continue to do well in their studies at our school. Denis is now 7 years old and next year will move into class 3. Please remember Denis in your prayers.

August Mission Trip

A team of 16 volunteers came together from Scotland, Northern, and Southern Ireland for one purpose, to serve God through a mission trip to Kiambururu. The team were hosted at Samson's home compound in new dorm accommodation constructed in recent months. New bunk beds, showers, and toilets ensure anyone travelling to our project have a clean and safe place to stay. Adventure Alternative provided transport, cooks, and helped with all activities for the group. Every morning the team trekked across the valley through long Napier grass, brown mud tracks, coffee, and banana trees to reach Blessed Hill Academy. Repair tasks were completed, and classrooms painted. Everyone got involved, from the youngest teenager to the oldest in their mid-seventies, there was a job for everyone to do. As always, there were many children on campus to entertain the workers, have some laughs, and play games.

Every day after lunch, the team held a Vocational Bible School and had the opportunity to teach the children from God's Word and sing choruses from the new chorus books purchased by friends of the charity from Northern Ireland. It was an opportunity for every team member to get involved by playing guitar, lead the singing, teaching a memory verse, or sharing a Bible story. It was a great time for everyone to experience missionary work and appreciate how the gospel

message is the same for every child, no matter where they are in the world. The inter-school's sports tournament attracted over 500 children from the local area; football, games, volleyball, and touch rugby were enjoyed by all. We are thankful for children who trusted in Christ as their Saviour and are pleased that they continue to attend the children's meetings and are routinely visited by Samson.

The trip turned out to be extremely eventful for one young couple. After one of the meetings, the team watched as Luke McKinley dropped on one knee to propose to his girlfriend Hannah Holmes. Thankfully, the proceedings were under the watchful eye and permission of Hannah's father Irwin. The whole school erupted with excitement for this special moment. We would like to wish Luke and Hannah God's blessing for the future and trust the honeymoon will be back in Kiambururu – there are a few hundred children who would like to see them again.

The next morning, they headed back into the city, this time with 35 pupils for a safari at Nairobi National Park. This was extremely exciting as for many of the children, it was their first time out of the village and their first sighting of a lion, giraffe, and elephant. What a blessing to see so many smiles, with each child thankful for the wonderful experience of enjoying a trip away with the mission team.



The trip was a massive success, and we thank God for His faithfulness to each member of the team, and for His hand of safety for the duration of the trip. Everyone returned with hundreds of photographs, precious memories, and hearts full of love for the children of Kenya, and a greater desire to see the work of God continue.

Dedication of Classrooms

The climax to the trip, and the final full day in Kiambururu, seen the dedication of four new classrooms in loving memory of dear friends and supporters of the charity. Mrs Rosemary Legge, wife of County Down artist Ken Legge, was remembered with the remaining three classrooms dedicated to people from Ballymoney. Mrs Marguerita Holmes the mother of trustee Irwin, Mrs Gillian McCahon the wife of David and mother of Jenny, and the late councillor Alderman John Finlay, husband of Linda and father of Naomi and Rebekah. Like many others, those remembered enjoyed viewing the updates from the children of our school and were a great encouragement through their prayers, giving, and support for the charity. God willing, the classrooms will be fully finished by early 2024 and pupils able to enjoy the new facilities during the first term of the new school year. In addition to the classrooms there will be full toilet and washing facilities for all pupils.

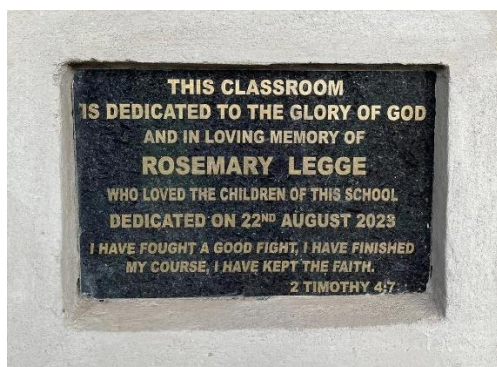

Elaine's 3 Month Visit to Kiambururu

For the final three months of 2023, Elaine Campbell (one of our board members) has been in the village to help run the NGO charity and prepare for the 2024 academic year. Her help has been invaluable, and our team of Samson, Fred, Bob, and Monicah have loved having her stay for an extended period. Elaine has been busy in our charity office ensuring all NGO and school policies are up-to-date and has conducted child safeguarding training with all our teachers and other staff. It has also been an opportunity to conduct children's meetings as well as mentoring and praying with the older children from our school who are sitting national exams. Elaine had the opportunity to follow up on some past pupils from our school who were previously part of our child sponsorship programme. It was great to see many of the children, who are now young adults, doing well at work, in further education, and some preparing for university. More importantly, she was delighted to see how they are going on with God and living for Him, a living testimony to those around them.



During November, Elaine was joined by Naomi Lamont and Krista Watt who were keen to put their talents to good use, teaching revision classes, creating learning aids for the pre-school, and helping Elaine run a three-day Vocational Bible School for all children of the village. It was great to see hundreds of children listen to the Bible stories, play games, recite God's Word, and sing choruses.



New Year's Sit Out 2023

On Friday 29th December, Stephen Fletcher from the town held his 24-hour sit out to raise funds for children's charity vision4kids. This was his 5th annual New Year's sit out and once again it was a massive success with £6,015 raised through various channels online and in-person donations. On the day, a total of £1,662.82 was raised through the public collection with the remainder online. Stephen thanks his supporters, "Once again, I'm humbled by the generous support of the people from Ballymoney, and those further afield



who donated. Every year I'm surprised, but so thankful, for the massive response to the work of vision4kids and its school project with the children of Kiambururu, in Kenya."

Just a few weeks after the sit out, Stephen, along with fellow trustee Irwin Holmes BEM, travelled to Kenya to see firsthand how the funds were being spent in the running of the school. January commenced the 2024 academic year in Kenya, and it was great to see 164 local children registered at the vision4kids charity school. The boys and girls, predominately from poor homes, enjoy a Christian based education, good teachers, porridge in the morning, a cooked meal for lunch, with fresh drinking water from the bore hole. Stephen reports, "It was great to see each of the children looking so happy for the start of another school year. They are thankful for the support of people from Northern Ireland who contribute to the running of the school. Our next classroom block is nearing completion, with construction expected to be finished by Easter. This will provide a further 4 classrooms for the school allowing the children to move from their current temporary tin structures."

Annual Report 2022/23



OUR VISION

vision4kids is a Christian based charity with a vision of helping children and young people around the world wherever there is a need to improve the quality of life. In everything we do our aim is to promote the Gospel of Jesus Christ and see lives transformed.

We base all our work on four main themes:

Education

Promoting and supporting school projects ensuring children and young people have the correct tools and facilities to receive an education. This can include repair and maintenance, construction and building at local schools; supply of teaching material, uniforms, classroom furniture and teaching aids; provision of school meals, funding for educational programmes and guidance to school management.

Health

vision4kids will aim to support projects for healthcare working with established charities as well as individual cases where certain funds or practical help can be offered. Always working in a way that makes life more comfortable for the child in question. This will include paying for hospital, surgery and medical bills for the children ensuring they receive necessary treatment and continued after care by local experts; large scale medical screening of larger groups (eg: a school) including basic treatment for minor ailments by a local qualified doctor.

Welfare

Throughout the world there are many children without basic shelter, clothing and food. vision4kids will look to provide the necessary materials to improve living conditions and relieve poverty giving a better way of life. This will include helping with home renovations, providing food to the child and their immediate family; relief shelter in times of emergency and ensuring the child has sufficient clothing and footwear for school and home.

Spiritual

As a Christian based charity the main theme in all we seek to do is to promote the Gospel and see children and young people's lives transformed through the saving power of our Lord Jesus Christ. This will include holding children's Bible Clubs and Sunday School meetings; provision of Bibles and other Christian literature; Bible study and development/counselling classes; visits to local schools to take RE classes and Scripture Union.

OUR FUNDRAISING

Our fundraising focus this year has been on generating much needed funds for the running of our school and the construction of new classrooms. Through the year, there have been a number of methods used to raise funds for the charity; these include:

Child Sponsorship Programme – We have increased the number of sponsor children to 50. Each child has a sponsor family in the UK who provide a £15 donation per month. This contribution goes in its entirety to benefit the child through payment of their school, exam and sports fees; provision of school uniform, shoes and hygiene products; inclusion in school meals; regular health checks and necessary treatments; a Bible; a sack of maize into the family home at the start of each school term.

Fundraising Events – Through the year we hold a number of events including Concerts, Craft Fairs, Coffee Mornings and Sponsored Walks. These are all great ways of getting people involved and raising funds for the work. We also have volunteers who hold their own event or sponsored activity and donate all the proceeds, which has included a parachute jump.

Street Collections – A long standing method of raising funds is through Street Collections and 'Bed Pushes' in local towns and villages. This involves working with the PSNI and Parades Commission to ensure the necessary legal permits are approved and we are fully covered and insured to collect. We have been overwhelmed by the generous response from the local people each time we hold a collection.

Insight Meetings – From time to time the team are invited to speak at various church, school and youth groups. These groups provide a donation to go to the project they are interested in. The vision4kids team are volunteers which ensures 100% of the donation goes to the work amongst the boys and girls.

General Donations – We are so thankful to those supporters who provide donations on a regular, and quite often, a monthly basis. We make full use of the HMRC Gift Aid service which means each donation (where applicable) goes even further. We are thankful to supporters close to vision4kids who cover costs associated with the running of the charity.

We operate a number of income channels including cash, cheque, bank transfer and standing order, Give As You Earn through the workplace, Gift Aid, GASDS, PayPal and online donations through our BT MyDonate account.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

It had been 4 years since my last visit. The Covid pandemic had put a stop to all travel and Kenya, like the rest of the world, was in lockdown. Finally, in November, several of our directors and I headed back to the village we know well, to the children we love. Once again, we were greeted with cheers, smiles, and open arms. It was great to be back.



This visit was an emotional one. I was able to witness the great progress made in our building work, but what stood out for me was the appreciation and thankfulness of the local families who received our support during Covid lockdown. They had not forgotten the food parcels received, and the teachers appreciated continuing to be paid throughout a time of uncertainty. It is humbling to think that our small charity had such a wide impact across a poor region of Kenya. I was pleased to attend the end of year graduation service. Each class took part through singing or traditional dance, with my favourite being one class's attempt of Scottish dancing (must be the Ulster Scots in me). Most of all, it was amazing to hear the children sing the hymns and chorus from our Chorus book we printed and took out in 2018. It was clear that the children are taught Scripture and sing the love of God daily.

This year has once again taught me to rely on God regardless of your circumstance. During the times of Covid we wondered how we could provide for our school family and where the funds would come from – but God provided. And this year as we stepped out in faith for our building work, we wondered where the funds would come from – but God provided. So, we go again – we step out in faith for 23/24. Not in blind faith, but with a faith in God that He will advance His kingdom in Kiambururu, and He will provide for His children. I (we as a team) must be faithful in executing His plan by going into all the world and making disciples.

Partnering with Trinity Baptist Church

Over the past four years, we've been privileged to work alongside believers from Trinity Baptist Church, located in Nairobi, just over an hour's drive from Kiambururu. We have enjoyed getting to know Pastor Murungi and Pastor Dominic and their team of workers who are dedicated to sharing the gospel message with the boys and girls of the greater Nairobi area. We have learned much from the various teams who have travelled to Blessed Hill Academy (BHA) to conduct children's meetings and Bible studies and have enjoyed the friendship and fellowship as we work together to serve our Saviour.



Pastor Dominic oversees the children's ministry at Trinity Baptist Church. He was saved as a teenager at High School, and although after graduating from university he started a career in pharmaceuticals, he knew God's call to the ministry, and went on to study at Trinity Pastors College. Pastor Dominic regularly visits Kiambururu to minister to the children. He has conducted assembly meetings and is our guest speaker on graduation and prize day.

Moving into 2023, we plan to commence a new monthly teen Bible Study. Under the guidance of Trinity Baptist Church, both Samson and Pastor Dominic will look to minister to Christian teenagers in the Kiambururu area. They will provide biblical answers to the secular questions and challenges young people face. This is in addition to our Saturday night village meeting which will recommence in January, and the various assemblies and studies conducted during school hours.

As a charity, we recognise the importance of the biblical model of ministry through the local church. Christmas Bible Camp

Between Christmas and New Year 2021 we held our first Bible Camp organised by Pastor Dominic from Trinity Baptist Church. Early morning, the children registered for a special day of Bible lessons, singing, drawing, and study. After the lockdowns brought about by the Covid-19 pandemic, it was great to see over 200 boys and girls come together to learn God's Word. The team of workers showed great enthusiasm as they organised the children by age groups and tailored the activities and lessons to suit. It was great to see the love they had for the children of Kiambururu and the desire to tell them about Jesus.



This year we aim to hold a 2-day Bible camp on 28th and 29th December when the children are off school. Please pray for every aspect of the camp including safety of the children and the workers, and that many children will trust in Christ as their Saviour.

Once again, we are thankful to the team from Trinity Baptist Church who will give up time during their Christmas holidays to conduct the Bible Camp.



Sponsored Walk Success



On Saturday 3rd of September, we held our annual fundraising sponsored walk. This year we were back in the Mourne Mountains with the option of summiting up to three peaks. However, the weather was not favourable with torrential rain forecast. The decision was taken to reduce the walk to one summit with Slieve Binnian as the chosen peak. Despite the awful weather, there was a great turnout of walkers including some teenagers. Starting at Carrick Little we took the path to the foot of the mountain before following the Mourne Wall to the summit of Binnian at 747m. We had to be careful, ensuring we stayed together and walk at a pace to suit the whole group. Visibility was down to 10m in places, but thanks to the guidance of our expert trekker Irwin Holmes, everyone made it safely to the peak and back to base. The rain only eased momentarily for several minutes on our descent. It was at this point the clouds cleared to reveal the beauty of the Mountains and Ben Crom Reservoir.



The wet weather didn't dampen the spirits of the walkers who showed great determination to safely summit Binnian, have lunch, and head back to the Café for a slice of lemon meringue and a cup of tea. The turf fire was very welcomed to dry out soaked clothing and rucksacks. We are thankful to all who participated and to everyone who donated. A total of £3,285 was raised for our building project. As a team, we deeply appreciate the fundraising efforts of the trekkers and their commitment to walk on such a bad day. Without the support and help of these fundraisers, we wouldn't be able progress in our building work. We look forward to completing our next classroom block in 2023.

Funding Shyline's Operation

In October one of our class 2 pupils, Shyline, was rushed to hospital after experiencing dizziness. It transpired that a fall and bang to the head resulted in a blood clot. The seriousness of the situation was quickly realised after several scans and x-rays showed that surgery was the only option. The medical team at Kenyatta National Hospital took great care of Shyline as they admitted her for two rounds of surgery. One to drain the fluid in her head, and a second surgery to remove the tumour.

We praise God for the amazing recovery of Shyline. After two weeks in hospital, she returned home with her mother and grandmother. Her family would like to thank those from the UK and Singapore who prayed for Shyline and funded her surgery. In December she will receive physiotherapy to help with her recovery from surgery. Please continue to pray for this lovely little girl.



New Block of 4 Classrooms

This year we commenced construction on our new two-story building consisting of four classrooms, two toilets, and a large store. Due to the gradient of our school site, it was essential to have structural drawings created for the builder to work from. There have been several building collapses in Kenya recently, and we must do all we can to ensure the safety of our pupils by following all local procedures and guidelines before beginning to build. Sometimes this is not easy. Processes in Kenya are very manual and rely on a physical paper trail rather than using electronic documents.



Deep foundations: The biggest job was to clear the site and dig deep enough foundations for a two-story building. At the lower end of the slope, the foundations were over seven feet deep. All trenches were dug manually, no diggers involved. Blocks marked out the frame of the building and large stones were used to fill the trenches before concrete was used to secure it in place. Steel rebar was used to reinforce the structure before a smooth cement finish left the ground floor ready for the block work.

Employing local builders: Local knowledge is essential to recommend proper construction techniques based on the soil type and content. It also means we are supporting the community by employing local skilled builders and labourers. For this stage alone, we have paid £2,200 in wages to the local workers. At one point, we had over 15 men and women working on site to complete the foundations.

Rising cost of materials: Kiambururu is no different when it comes to the rising cost of materials and fuel. A lower currency exchange rate from the UK to Kenya has also resulted in the current structure costing more than originally planned. We are thankful to have successfully completed phase 1 of this build but await a better exchange rate before sending out more funds for stage 2.

Ground floor complete: The block construction is now complete for the ground floor, and we are ready to fix the first floor slabs. This is an expensive and time-consuming process as the floor must be reinforced with steel rebar to strengthen the structure and ensure it can carry the weight of another floor and the roof. Once again, we will work with local structural engineers to ensure it is completed safely and compliantly.





Building Into 2023

God willing, construction will recommence in early 2023. We continue to raise funds and are thankful to all those who have donated to our building project. A number of the classrooms will be dedicated in memory of vision4kids supporters whose family have donated funds to the classroom build. The loss of a loved one isn't easy, and we are humbled that supporters would consider leaving a legacy gift or a family making donations in lieu of flowers. It all helps to establish a permanent witness amongst the boys and girls in Kiambururu.

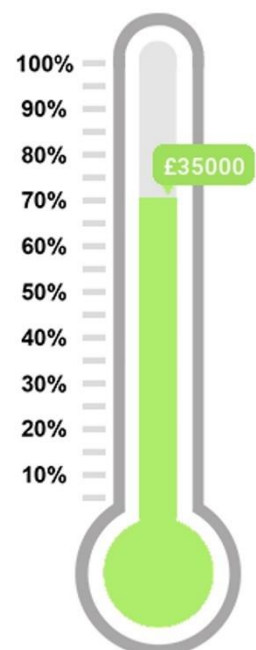
We believe the total cost of this classroom block will be £50,000, although that is dependent on the price of materials, especially steel and blocks. Over the coming months we need to raise £15,000 to complete this block. This will include the first-floor slabs, first floor block work, metal roof support, suitable sheet roof, plastering, plumbing, electricals, toilets, furniture, and blackboards. We look forward to the New Year's Eve 24-hour sit out and other fundraising events to complete our target. If you'd like to contribute, please get in touch.



Moving into 2023 we hope to announce some very exciting projects. We are thankful to a Northern Ireland businessman and electrical contractor who plans to take a work team to our school to support local Kenya builders with electrical, plumbing, plastering, and

joinery work. This will help ease the cost of completing the classrooms. In August, in addition to conducting Bible Clubs with the children, our mission team hope to help with the cleaning, painting, and set-up of the new classrooms.

November Board Visit

It was a long time coming. The pandemic resulted in cancelled trips and zoom calls to keep in touch with Samson and the team in Kiambururu. It was April 2019 since the last UK visitor, but in November, several Board members and friends travelled to Kenya. It was an opportunity to get an update on various projects, hold meetings with Head teacher Julius and his teaching staff, encourage Samson, Fred, Bob and their families, scope out future building and maintenance projects for our Northern Ireland work team, conduct and audit of NGO financials and accounting practices, and hold meetings with Pastor Murungi and Pastor Dominic from Trinity Baptist Church.



Once again, the team were warmly greeted by the children of Blessed Hill Academy. Our visit also coincided with the final day of the school year with a special graduation and prize day service held. The children sang various hymns and choruses, performed some traditional musical items, and quoted Scripture. Pastor Dominic spoke on the text from James 1:17, “Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above,” and prayed for each class as they finished the year, with classes 6 and 8 about to sit national examinations. The days passed quickly, and we were soon on our way home. We are thankful for a faithful team in Kiambururu who work hard to educate the local children, provide for their physical needs, and have a desire to see children taught God’s Word. We look forward to returning soon.



New Year's Sit Out 2022

The 2021 New Year's Eve sit out proved successful with over £7,000 raised through on-line donations and cash in the bucket. It was Stephen's first year back on the streets of Ballymoney after the nationwide lock down of the previous year. A massive thanks to some friends of the charity who



constructed a shelter for Stephen to use if the weather turned nasty. This year the 24-hour sit out will commence at **9am on Friday 30th December and run to 9am on Saturday 31st on New Year's Eve.**

Once again, Stephen will be located on Church Street, just outside the old Ulster Bank in Ballymoney. This year's funds will go towards completing our four new classrooms.

Stephen is mindful that this year is different, "I am so thankful for the generous help and support in previous years. However, this year is going to be more difficult for many families given the significant cost of living increases. I do not take the donations for granted and appreciate even the smallest amount. I will ensure that every single penny donated goes towards the new classrooms and is spent wisely when it comes to choosing the correct materials at the most cost-effective price. Thank you."
