The above named individuals served {and continue to do so} as Directors/Trustees of Angling First Ltd{hereinafter referred to as the company} in accordance with the companies Memorandum and Articles of Association which are: To promote the benefit of children and young people of in the main,18 years, by providing access to a leisure time occupation of angling so as to develop their physical, mental and social skills with the object of improving their conditions of life so that they may grow to maturity as individuals and as members of society and to act as an aid to the social inclusion of the said young people. The same above people seek to state that they have served with the full regard to the Commission's public benefit requirement statutory guidance for the accounting period covering the 01/03/24 to 28/02/25{and again will continue to do so}.

Achievements and Performance.

With demand for services returning to levels similar to that prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, the company was able to meet these demands through a number of programmes including the completion of a deep sea fishing programme. During this period approximately 1644 individual people availed of the services offered via a broad number of organisations from across N.Ireland. See Annexe A

Financial Review:

The abridged balance sheet as at 28th February 2025 indicated a surplus of £23,770 with an accumulated fund of £27,724 with a reserve of unrestricted funds of £27,724

The board realise that the reserve level is at an insufficient level and that all efforts must be made to ensure that an adequate level of reserves is maintained at all times.

Summary:

Despite challenging economic conditions along with increased demand for services the Company completed all programmes of delivery whilst restoring financial reserves to the required level in accordance with the company's reserves policy.

The trustees during this period have had regard to the Commission's Public Benefit Requirement.

Going Concerns:

Mobile phone usage is an increasing concern, particularly in relation to young people and the impact such usage is having on their mental health and subsequent interaction with the older generation.
