Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2025

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2025. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

INCORPORATION

The charitable company was incorporated on 20 March 2007 and commenced trading on the same date.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The Company's principal activities are concerned with the advancement of education of the public by :

(a) the co-ordination and development of the use of film and any other form of audio-visual communication for the purpose of education and research and in particular to promote:

(i) the production and broadcast of films and documentaries that advance the knowledge and understanding of different cultures, traditions, beliefs and political, social and economic developments within the island of Ireland;

(ii) the collection and dissemination of educational material;

(b) helping or co-operating with other educational institutions, centres, agencies or bodies.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

As reported last year GMT concluded its, "Epilogues: The Human Face of Conflict" project in August 2024. That project was jointly funded by The Joseph Rowntree Charitable (JRCT) and the Irish Government's Department of Foreign Affairs - Reconciliation Fund.

The company chose not to apply for any further funding from September 2024 to reflect on its body of work to date and future strategic direction in light of the current challenges to peace-building in Northern Ireland.

It has maintained its offices at 1 West End Park, BT48 9JF. During this period, it received fees for the delivery of two epilogues programmes it has committed to in advance.

GMT's board anticipates launching a new phase of its work in early 2026.

At the date of writing this report no projects are ongoing, however, should any opportunities arise in the future the Charity will take these on if relevant funding is available.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Statement of Financial Activities, on page 14 indicates that Gaslight Media Trust had incoming resources of £37,681 in the year. £34,331 of this relates to deferred income released in respect of the main funder - The Joseph Rowntree Charitable Trust (JRCT). The JRCT funding consisted of £189,220 to be paid quarterly over three years from January 2020 to supply twelve epilogues programmes/deliveries. At date of writing this report all of these programmes have been delivered and all of this funding has now been spent.

There was also £3,350 of other income - unrestricted - re programmes delivered to Antrim & Newtownabbey Borough Council & Neighbourhood Management Team - The Better Together Project.

There is now a total of nil Deferred Income left on the Balance Sheet at 31 March 2025.

The total expenditure for the year was £46,127. There was an overall deficit for the year of £8,446 - arising from programmes scheduled in 2024 but not delivered until 2025 re funding received in prior years. £21,152 of this loss related to Restricted Funds and was taken off the restricted reserves balance brought forward at 31 March 2024 of £21,152 - leaving a balance in restricted reserves of nil at 31 March 2025.

Risk Management

The Management Committee have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the Charity, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the exposure to the major risks.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

There are currently 4 members on the Management Committee and there have been no new appointments or resignations over the year.

Organisation

Day to day running of the company is carried out by its Project Manager Jim Keys. Operational management of the project is delegated to an Operational Sub-committee which is accountable to the Board of Directors. The Operational Sub-committee comprises the Project Manager, and a Company Director. It meets regularly in person or on Zoom to monitor progress and strategise next steps.

The company chose not to apply for any funding from September 2024 but rather to reflect on its body of work to date and future strategic direction in light of the current challenges to peace-building in Northern Ireland. In the meantime it has maintained its offices at 1 West End Park, only delivering programmes it had already committed to. GMT's board anticipates launching a new phase of its work in early 2026.

Induction and training of new trustees

New members undergo an orientation day to brief them on: their legal obligations under charity and company law, the charity commission guidance on public benefit, and inform them of the content of the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the committee and decision-making processes, the business plan and recent financial performance of the charity. During the induction day they meet key employees and other members. Members are encouraged to attend appropriate external training events where these will facilitate the undertaking of the role.


- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;

Basis of the independent examiner's report







1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Computer equipment - 20% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Grants of a revenue nature are credited to income in the period to which they relate. If received in advance of delivering the goods and services required by the Funder, or is subject to other conditions wholly outside the control of the recipient, Charity income should not be recognised and should be accounted for as a liability and shown on the balance sheet as deferred income.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

As reported last year, after the death of our project manager in November 2022, Jim Keys initially stepped in on a voluntary basis to pick up the pieces of the current project - 'Epilogues: The Human Face of Conflict'. Thereafter, in consultation with our funders, he took on the management of the project from April 2023 with a new completion date of 31st March 2024.

'Epilogues: The Human Face of Conflict' comprises twelve epilogues deliveries in residential settings, a follow up workshop and thereafter gatherings of graduates from each of the previous four deliveries. With five of the twelve deliveries to complete, delivery eight took place in June 2023. However the prep work involved in setting up delivery nine was lost when the host organisation cancelled at the last minute. It proved extremely difficult to find and prep a new group and secure new hotel dates that suited. This meant that delivery nine only took place in November 2023.

Given this combination of the difficulties listed below, apparent by November 2023:

- identifying and prepping additional groups in areas that both expanded the geographical spread of the project, and
- yet fulfilled the funding criteria of a balanced PUL/CNR group makeup in the current climate, and
- hotel availability that suited the group

Jim flagged up the need for a further extension with the funders - The Joseph Rowntree Charitable (JRCT) and the Irish Government's Department of Foreign Affairs - Reconciliation Fund - and secured an additional £6,000. This was agreed and the project was extended to August 2024.

Delivery ten took place in this funding period on a weekly basis from January through to March 2024. Subsequently, delivery eleven took place in April 2024 and delivery twelve in May 2024. Finally, a gathering of participants from all twelve deliveries took place in June 2024 and the project completed in August 2024.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Statement of Financial Activities, on page 15 indicates that Gaslight Media Trust had incoming resources of £35,974 in the year. This relates to deferred income released in respect of the two main funders - The Joseph Rowntree Charitable Trust (JRCT) and the Irish Government's Department of Foreign Affairs Reconciliation Fund (DFA). The JRCT funding consisted of £189,220 to be paid quarterly over three years from January 2020 to supply twelve epilogues programmes/deliveries. At date of writing this report all of these programmes have been delivered by August 2024. The DFA funding of £23640 (€28805) was received in August 2022 which was in addition to funding of £18092 (€22000) received in January 2020 to help with the delivery of these programmes. All of this funding has now been spent.

There is now a total of £34,331.67 of Deferred Income left on the Balance Sheet and this will be released to cover the expenditure needed to complete the deliveries up to August 2024.

The total expenditure for the year was £58,052. There was an overall deficit for the year of £22,078 arising from programmes scheduled in 2023 but not delivered until 2024 re funding received in 2023. This all related to Restricted Funds and was taken off the restricted reserves balance brought forward at 31 March 2023 of £43,230 - leaving a balance in restricted reserves of 21,152 at 31 March 2024.

Risk Management

The Management Committee have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the Charity, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the exposure to the major risks.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Tragically, as reported here last year, we lost our Project Manager, Stephen Gargan, in November 2022. Stephen had established strong community foundations for the various aspects of our peace-building work and for the current project - 'Epilogues: The Human Face of Conflict' and as such we were able to continue the work. Central to this has been the flexibility granted to us by the project's funders - The Joseph Rowntree Charitable (JRCT) and the Irish Government's Department of Foreign Affairs - Reconciliation Fund.

'Epilogues: The Human Face of Conflict' comprises twelve epilogues deliveries in residential settings, a follow up workshop and thereafter gatherings of graduates from each of the previous four deliveries.

Delivery one took place in late May 2021 and early June 2021. While 2020/2021's output was largely frustrated by Covid 19, the follow-up on delivery one and planning and recruitment for the other three deliveries scheduled for 2021/22 was marred by the legacy of Covid 19. This was a combination of residual fear for coming together in public, even with assurances that workshops would take place under the government's prescribed social distancing rules and with appropriate PPE provided. In addition, a number of the deliveries of the epilogues two-part programmes had to be cancelled due to participants contracting Covid between sessions. As an example, delivery three was scheduled to take place in late November 2021/early December 2021 but the second delivery did not take place in the end until late March 2022. As a result of these issues, while four deliveries and their follow-up were begun in the 2021/2022, only three were completed in that financial period.

Delivery four was completed in May 2022. The gathering (Gathering 1) of graduates from the completed four deliveries took place in Belfast in September 2022. Thereafter delivery five took place in September/October 2022 followed by delivery six in October/November 2022.

Stephen Gargan died on 27 November 2022.

Jim Keys - our primary facilitator - who created both Epilogues and our other multimedia workshop education programme - Just Us - with Stephen volunteered to step in to pick up the pieces. Connecting with the project's delivery partners - Falls Women's Centre & Shankill Women's Centre - he set up and facilitated delivery seven in February/March 2023 and then set up delivery eight for June 2023.

Thereafter, in consultation with our funders, we invited Jim to take on the management of the project from April 2023 and subsequently negotiated the extension of the project deadline to 31 March 2024.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Statement of Financial Activities, on page 15 indicates that Gaslight Media Trust had incoming resources of £48,518 in the year. There are two main funders - The Joseph Rowntree Charitable Trust (JRCT) and the Irish Government's Department of Foreign Affairs Reconciliation Fund (DFA). The JRCT funding consists of £189,220 to be paid quarterly over three years from January 2020 to supply twelve epilogues programmes/deliveries. At date of writing this report eight of these programmes have been delivered with a further four to be completed by March 2024. The DFA funding of £23640 (€28805) was received in August 2022 which was in addition to funding of £18092 (€22000) received in January 2020 to help with the delivery of these programmes. £6642 of this new funding was deferred and should be spent by end of March 2024.

There is now a total of £64304.85 of Deferred Income on the Balance Sheet and this should be released in the coming year.

The total expenditure for the year was £68,798. There was an overall deficit for the year of £20,280 arising from programmes scheduled in 2022 but not delivered until 2023 re funding received in 2022. This all related to Restricted Funds and was taken off the restricted reserves balance brought forward at 31 March 2022 of £63,783 - leaving a balance in restricted reserves of 43,230 at 31 March 2023.

Risk Management

The Management Committee have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the Charity, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the exposure to the major risks.







1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2023

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2023. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

INCORPORATION

The charitable company was incorporated on 20 March 2007 and commenced trading on the same date.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The Company's principal activities are concerned with the advancement of education of the public by :

- (a) the co-ordination and development of the use of film and any other form of audio-visual communication for the purpose of education and research and in particular to promote:
 - (i) the production and broadcast of films and documentaries that advance the knowledge and understanding of different cultures, traditions, beliefs and political, social and economic developments within the island of Ireland;
 - (ii) the collection and dissemination of educational material;
- (b) helping or co-operating with other educational institutions, centres, agencies or bodies.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Tragically, as reported here last year, we lost our Project Manager, Stephen Gargan, in November 2022. Stephen had established strong community foundations for the various aspects of our peace-building work and for the current project - 'Epilogues: The Human Face of Conflict' and as such we were able to continue the work. Central to this has been the flexibility granted to us by the project's funders - The Joseph Rowntree Charitable (JRCT) and the Irish Government's Department of Foreign Affairs - Reconciliation Fund.

'Epilogues: The Human Face of Conflict' comprises twelve epilogues deliveries in residential settings, a follow up workshop and thereafter gatherings of graduates from each of the previous four deliveries.

Delivery one took place in late May 2021 and early June 2021. While 2020/2021's output was largely frustrated by Covid 19, the follow-up on delivery one and planning and recruitment for the other three deliveries scheduled for 2021/22 was marred by the legacy of Covid 19. This was a combination of residual fear for coming together in public, even with assurances that workshops would take place under the government's prescribed social distancing rules and with appropriate PPE provided. In addition, a number of the deliveries of the epilogues two-part programmes had to be cancelled due to participants contracting Covid between sessions. As an example, delivery three was scheduled to take place in late November 2021/early December 2021 but the second delivery did not take place in the end until late March 2022. As a result of these issues, while four deliveries and their follow-up were begun in the 2021/2022, only three were completed in that financial period.

Delivery four was completed in May 2022. The gathering (Gathering 1) of graduates from the completed four deliveries took place in Belfast in September 2022. Thereafter delivery five took place in September/October 2022 followed by delivery six in October/November 2022.

Stephen Gargan died on 27 November 2022.

Jim Keys - our primary facilitator - who created both Epilogues and our other multimedia workshop education programme - Just Us - with Stephen volunteered to step in to pick up the pieces. Connecting with the project's delivery partners - Falls Women's Centre & Shankill Women's Centre - he set up and facilitated delivery seven in February/March 2023 and then set up delivery eight for June 2023.

Thereafter, in consultation with our funders, we invited Jim to take on the management of the project from April 2023 and subsequently negotiated the extension of the project deadline to 31 March 2024.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Statement of Financial Activities, on page 15 indicates that Gaslight Media Trust had incoming resources of £48,518 in the year. There are two main funders - The Joseph Rowntree Charitable Trust (JRCT) and the Irish Government's Department of Foreign Affairs Reconciliation Fund (DFA). The JRCT funding consists of £189,220 to be paid quarterly over three years from January 2020 to supply twelve epilogues programmes/deliveries. At date of writing this report eight of these programmes have been delivered with a further four to be completed by March 2024. The DFA funding of £23640 (€28805) was received in August 2022 which was in addition to funding of £18092 (€22000) received in January 2020 to help with the delivery of these programmes. £6642 of this new funding was deferred and should be spent by end of March 2024.

There is now a total of £64304.85 of Deferred Income on the Balance Sheet and this should be released in the coming year.

The total expenditure for the year was £68,798. There was an overall deficit for the year of £20,280 arising from programmes scheduled in 2022 but not delivered until 2023 re funding received in 2022. This all related to Restricted Funds and was taken off the restricted reserves balance brought forward at 31 March 2022 of £63,783 - leaving a balance in restricted reserves of 43,230 at 31 March 2023.

Risk Management

The Management Committee have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the Charity, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the exposure to the major risks.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

There are currently 4 members on the Management Committee and there have been no new appointments or resignations over the year.

Organisation

Day to day running of the company is being managed by Jim Keys who was appointed Project Manager in April 2023. Operational management of the project is delegated to an Operational Sub-committee which is accountable to the Board of Directors. The sub committee comprises of the project manager and a company director. It meets mostly in person or on Zoom to monitor progress and strategise next steps regularly.

Induction and training of new trustees

New members undergo an orientation day to brief them on: their legal obligations under charity and company law, the charity commission guidance on public benefit, and inform them of the content of the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the committee and decision-making processes, the business plan and recent financial performance of the charity. During the induction day they meet key employees and other members. Members are encouraged to attend appropriate external training events where these will facilitate the undertaking of the role.

Related parties

None of the members receive remuneration or other benefit from their work with the charity. In the current year no such related party transactions were reported

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

The trustees (who are also the directors of Gaslight Media Trust for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Report of the Trustees and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. 
- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
