PUBLIC BENEFIT STATEMENT

The directors of Practical Christian Outreach confirm that they have had due regard for the guidance on Public Benefit by the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland and are pleased to report that during the year the charity continued to provide the Public Benefits through programmes and services we offer. In particular, the directors consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives they have set.

Public Benefits:

Governing document

Practical Christian Outreach is a charitable company limited by guarantee and does not have any share capital. It was incorporated on 25th May 2010 and registered as a charity with The Charity Commission for Northern Ireland on 16th February 2015.

In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £10.

Recruitment, appointment, induction and training

The directors regularly review the requirements of the charity and the possibility of a need for additional directors. Any new directors would be appointed by resolution of a meeting of all the directors passed by a majority of those present. Appropriate training and induction is available to all directors.

Risk management

The directors have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the Trust, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate an exposure to major risks. Where appropriate, systems or procedures have been established to mitigate the risks the charity faces. Internal control risks are minimised by the implementation of procedures for authorisation of all transactions and projects. Procedures are in place to ensure compliance with health and safety of staff, volunteers, clients and visitors. These procedures are periodically reviewed at least annually to ensure that they continue to meet the needs of the charity.

Organisation Structures

The directors oversee the running of the charitable company.

- 2) The Charity is established to also offer practical benefits to people internationally.
 - a) This will have particular focus on, but not limited to, people who live in areas of the world where the basic commodities of accommodation, water, food, and sanitation are not available.
 - b) Since the invasion of Ukraine by Russia, new projects have been undertaken to help those people who have been displaced by the war and those who are in need whilst defending their country.
 - c) It will utilize the skills and capabilities of people who are or have been, embedded in the communities to direct the implementation of sustainable solutions.
 - d) These solutions will be focused on short term delivery of significant and impactful projects.
 - e) These projects will aim to have ownership for the project imbedded with the community in need as well as the commitment to the management and maintenance of the project once commissioned.
 - f) Wherever possible the aim will be to use local labour to undertake the project.
- 3) The Charity will engage with people locally to enable the delivery of the various projects.
 - a) This will include people who volunteer their time.
 - b) People who will provide the funds or fund raise.
 - c) People who have a heart to connect with the people in need.
- 4) The Objects of the company will be carried out in accordance with its doctrinal basis namely under the Word of God our Father, the Love of our Lord Jesus Christ and the Inspiration of His Holy Spirit, as revealed to man in the Holy Scriptures

Volunteers

The charity is grateful for the unstinting efforts of its volunteers who are involved in all aspects of the charity's work.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Total income for the year amounted to £49,232 (2023 - £41,250). Income derived from donations and legacies amounted to £47,703 (2023: £40,355), charitable activities of £Nil (2023: £Nil) and other income of £1,529 (2023: £895). Total expenditure for the year amounted to £49,064 (2023 - £38,835). The cost of charitable activities amounted to £49,064 (2023 - £38,835).

The net income for the year amounted to £168 (2023 – £2,415).

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the charity to maintain free reserves which matches the needs of the trust, both at the current time and the foreseeable future. This provides sufficient funds to cover running costs which include management, administration and support costs. Free reserves are those unrestricted reserves not designed nor invested in fixed assets which are available for general use.

Funding

The principal funding is from donations.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

During the period Practical Christian Outreach continued to respond to opportunities to reach out to help those whom we believed God had directed us to.

The majority of activity was directed to projects in Ukraine. These were identified and implemented by our two key personnel in country who we have met, both there in Ukraine and over here in Northern Ireland. These relationships are essential to ensure the legitimacy of the needs and the efficacy of the actions we take. We delivered almost 40 projects over this past year and we were delighted with the opportunity to do so.

Separately we supported 3 additional projects, 2 in Northern Ireland and one in Kenya.

The income and expenditure for the year were almost equal, leaving the net assets in a good position at the end of the year.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DIRECTORS

The trustees (who are also the directors of Practical Christian Outreach (formerly Youth Outreach) for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Directors' Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice) including FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland"

The law applicable to charities in Northern Ireland requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
 - observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP 2015 (FRS 102);
 - make judgements and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
 - state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General information and basis of accounting

Youth Outreach is a charitable company limited by guarantee and does not have any share capital. It registered as a charity with The Charity Commission for Northern Ireland on 16th February 2015 and it is incorporated in Northern Ireland. The address of the registered office is given in the charity information on page 1 of these financial statements.

The charitable company constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008, The Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015 and the Companies Act 2006 and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements are prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest £1.

The significant accounting policies are set out below. The directors consider that these accounting policies are suitable, have been consistently applied and are supported by reasonable and prudent judgement and estimates.

Fund accounting – unrestricted funds

The company's unrestricted funds consist of a General Fund which is expendable at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the charitable objects of the company. The directors may at their discretion designate funds for specific purposes but the designation does not legally restrict the directors' discretion to apply the funds.

Income recognition

All income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the charity is legally entitled to the income after any performance conditions have been met, the amount can be measured reliably and it is probable that the income will be received.

For donations to be recognised the charity will have been notified of the amounts and the settlement date in writing. If there are conditions attached to the donation and this requires a level of performance before entitlement can be obtained then income is deferred until those conditions are fully met or the fulfilment of those conditions is within the control of the charity and it is probable that they will be fulfilled.

Donated facilities and donated professional services are recognised in income at their fair value when their economic benefit is probable, it can be measured reliably and the charity has control over the item. Fair value is determined on the basis of the value of the gift to the charity. For example the amount the charity would be willing to pay in the open market for such facilities and services. A corresponding amount is recognised in expenditure.

Income recognition (*continued*)

No amount is included in the financial statements for volunteer time in line with the SORP (FRS 102). Further detail is given in the Directors' Annual Report.

Where practicable, gifts in kind donated for distribution to the beneficiaries of the charity are included in stock and donations in the financial statements upon receipt. If it is impracticable to assess the fair value at receipt or if the costs to undertake such a valuation outweigh any benefits, then the fair value is recognised as a component of donations when it is distributed and an equivalent amount recognised as charitable expenditure.

Voluntary income received by way of donations and gift is credited to revenue on a receivable basis.

Fixed asset gifts in kind are recognised when receivable and are included at fair value. They are not deferred over the life of the asset.

For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received. At this point income is recognised. On occasion legacies will be notified to the charity however it is not possible to measure the amount expected to be distributed. On these occasions, the legacy is treated as a contingent asset and disclosed.

Investment income is interest earned through holding cash at bank. Interest income is recognised when receivable.

Expenditure recognition

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Expenditure is recognised where there is a legal or constructive obligation to make payments to third parties, it is probable that the settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Where costs cannot be directly attributed to a particular heading they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of the resources. Staff costs and overhead expenses are allocated to activities on the basis of staff time spent on those activities.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged as an expense against the activity for which expenditure arose.

Fund-raising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in support of the charitable activities.

Value Added Tax

The charity is not registered for VAT purposes, therefore expenditure is shown gross of VAT.

Fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost, or valuation less accumulated depreciation.

Taxation

As a charity, the company benefits from various exemptions afforded by tax legislation. It is therefore not liable to corporation tax on income or gains falling due within those exemptions. Recovery is made of tax deducted from receipts under gift aid.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. The Directors consider the basis to be appropriate assuming that the charity has adequate financial support from the bankers and related parties.

 - c) It will utilize the skills and capabilities of people who are or have been, embedded in the communities to direct the implementation of sustainable solutions.
 - d) These solutions will be focused on short term delivery of significant and impactful projects.
 - e) These projects will aim to have ownership for the project imbedded with the community in need as well as the commitment to the management and maintenance of the project once commissioned.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Total income for the year amounted to £41,250 (2022 - £75,358). Income derived from donations and legacies amounted to £40,355 (2022: £60,908), charitable activities of £nil (2021: ££14,450) and other income of £895 (2022: £nil). PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

During the financial year, the Trustees were pleased to continue with the new Water Drops project. The aim of this project is to create fresh drinking water for rural communities in Kenya. In a year where we all became more aware of the importance of washing our hands thoroughly with clean water, the reality that many rural communities in Kenya don't even have clean water to drink came sharply into focus. We were delighted to complete our first project to create a sustainable solution for a village using local labour to undertake the project and to maintain it into the future. What is more, the project was completed on time and under budget. We have progressed with at least 4 additional projects.

As part of our sustainability strategy, we plan to enable the two fellow founders of these Water Drops projects to launch their own charitable company to carry on with these projects independently of PCO.

Additionally, we will be engaging with two individuals we have met in Ukraine, one a Church Deacon/Pastor and the other a widow of a volunteer who died defending their country. They will be sharing with us projects that conform with our mission and our values.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General information and basis of accounting

Youth Outreach is a charitable company limited by guarantee and does not have any share capital. It registered as a charity with The Charity Commission for Northern Ireland on 16th February 2015 and it is incorporated in Northern Ireland. The address of the registered office is given in the charity information on page 1 of these financial statements.

The charitable company constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008, The Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015 and the Companies Act 2006 and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements are prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest £1.

The significant accounting policies are set out below. The directors consider that these accounting policies are suitable, have been consistently applied and are supported by reasonable and prudent judgement and estimates.

Fund accounting – unrestricted funds

The company's unrestricted funds consist of a General Fund which is expendable at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the charitable objects of the company. The directors may at their discretion designate funds for specific purposes but the designation does not legally restrict the directors' discretion to apply the funds.

Income recognition

All income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the charity is legally entitled to the income after any performance conditions have been met, the amount can be measured reliably and it is probable that the income will be received.

For donations to be recognised the charity will have been notified of the amounts and the settlement date in writing. If there are conditions attached to the donation and this requires a level of performance before entitlement can be obtained then income is deferred until those conditions are fully met or the fulfilment of those conditions is within the control of the charity and it is probable that they will be fulfilled.

Donated facilities and donated professional services are recognised in income at their fair value when their economic benefit is probable, it can be measured reliably and the charity has control over the item. Fair value is determined on the basis of the value of the gift to the charity. For example the amount the charity would be willing to pay in the open market for such facilities and services. A corresponding amount is recognised in expenditure.

Income recognition (*continued*)

No amount is included in the financial statements for volunteer time in line with the SORP (FRS 102). Further detail is given in the Directors' Annual Report.

Where practicable, gifts in kind donated for distribution to the beneficiaries of the charity are included in stock and donations in the financial statements upon receipt. If it is impracticable to assess the fair value at receipt or if the costs to undertake such a valuation outweigh any benefits, then the fair value is recognised as a component of donations when it is distributed and an equivalent amount recognised as charitable expenditure.

Voluntary income received by way of donations and gift is credited to revenue on a receivable basis.

Fixed asset gifts in kind are recognised when receivable and are included at fair value. They are not deferred over the life of the asset.

For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received. At this point income is recognised. On occasion legacies will be notified to the charity however it is not possible to measure the amount expected to be distributed. On these occasions, the legacy is treated as a contingent asset and disclosed.

Investment income is interest earned through holding cash at bank. Interest income is recognised when receivable.

Expenditure recognition

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Expenditure is recognised where there is a legal or constructive obligation to make payments to third parties, it is probable that the settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Where costs cannot be directly attributed to a particular heading they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of the resources. Staff costs and overhead expenses are allocated to activities on the basis of staff time spent on those activities.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged as an expense against the activity for which expenditure arose.

Fund-raising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in support of the charitable activities.

Value Added Tax

The charity is not registered for VAT purposes, therefore expenditure is shown gross of VAT.

Fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost, or valuation less accumulated depreciation.

Public Benefit

Purposes

The charity was established for the public benefit within Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the area of benefit") by promoting community safety, reducing anti-social behaviour and crime without distinction of gender, sexual orientation, disability/ability, race, political, religious, or other opinion, providing facilities in the interest of social welfare with the object of improving the conditions of life for the inhabitants of the area of benefit. :

- a) To provide a venue or venues both directly and with other parties, for young people to interact and socialise.
- b) To recruit, select and train volunteers for service within the area of benefit and in turn to support their personal and professional development.
- c) To organise and provide outings and other activities to further the company's aims and objectives

As the charity has progressed, the advancement of religion has become an additional purpose that we seek to fulfil. Specifically, we seek to advance the Christian faith by providing a welcoming space for Young People to meet and learn about Christianity that is free from any intimidating denominational labels or infrastructure, so they may know that they are loved, valued, have a purpose, and feel part of a community whom they can trust and rely on.

This purpose has been at the heart of our activities for 11 years and was delivered under the banner of the "Rhythm Project".

In February 2020, the responsibility for the ongoing delivery of this project was transferred, along with the assets pertaining to the project, to Youth for Christ.

In September 2020 the name of the Company and of the Charity was changed to "Practical Christian Outreach". This was to facilitate the pursuance of a broader outreach of needs.

The first of these new outreach projects was "Waterdrops". The charity has extended "its area of benefit" to Kenya/ East Africa as it promotes access to clean water facilities in remote rural areas. Some of the communities have little or no water supply, so a new supply is created. Others may have some water tanks but require additional work to upgrade their system to a fully functioning supply which brings a good quantity of water to the whole community.

This objective has many benefits including:

- a. Improved health conditions for the all the families in the affected neighbourhood.
- b. Children can attend school more regularly and obtain a better quality of education.
- c. Helps relieve poverty as adults are healthier and able to work better and bring home a constant wage to feed their families.
- d. The women who normally carry the water have more time to be involved in community activities instead of walking long distances.

To ensure the sustainability of our water projects, we consult with local leaders from the onset so that they feel ownership of the facility. We train a water management committee whose role it is to ensure the water distribution point is well looked after and maintained. We also use local labour as much as possible to bring income to the immediate area.

Most Kenyans think holistically that there is no division between the physical and spiritual, so when they are blessed with a clean water supply, they immediately thank God for this. Likewise, our project reflects this as we pray as a community before work begins and then hold a dedication service to handover each finalised project.

In parallel with the delivery of the projects into Kenya we worked with the two co-founders of the project to enable them to set up a separate company and charity so that they can sustain the work into the future. This was successfully achieved and with the launch of the new charity and the transfer of assets in 2022.

In January 2023 our we part funded the provision of 250 Generators to churches in Ukraine to support their local communities during the power outages inflicted by the Invasion of Russia. Our chairman, along with two other men from Northern Ireland, took these into Ukraine and spent 10 days delivering them. This experience created the opportunity to launch our latest projects to provide ongoing support the people in Ukraine. We engaged with two individuals from Ukraine who help identify the specific aid that is necessary and equally to divert us away from help that is not optimum.

Beneficiaries

During the year 2020-21, the direct beneficiaries of Practical Christian Outreach were the inhabitants of a very remote area in South-eastern Kenya called Oltiasika, populated by approximately 2,000 people of which 60% are children under 10 years old.

These people totally rely on collecting rainwater as the closest borehole is approximately 25 kms away. They were provided with a water distribution point which was serviced by three large underground water tanks. Because of this, some temporary jobs were created for the local people while the building work was progressing. Provision of this water means the women no longer must travel a long distance by foot to collect water. These water tanks serve people within a range of 10 kms.

Supporters and donors from N. Ireland and further afield have also benefited from Waterdrops as they have been invited to partner with the project and support communities in Kenya. They are educated through the website and social media about life and culture in these Maasai communities and this brings about an appreciation of the time and effort involved in gaining access to fresh clean water. As supporters connect with people in villages, this nurtures a global viewpoint and encourages people to see the diversity of life beyond their own culture.

To date we have targeted 50 individuals, 20 church communities with emphasis on engaging young people, 5 schools and 10 businesses.

In Ukraine the beneficiaries have been displaced people and these who have been defending their country.

Activities and Achievements

The primary activities with Waterdrops were the successful setting up of the new charity and the transfer of the relevant assets.

The Primary activities with our Ukrainian project was the completion of 15 projects in country.

Restriction on who can benefit

There are no restrictions whatsoever on who can benefit from this project.

Harm

A risk assessment is completed before each work project is implemented. This includes overseas travel to a remote area for the staff involved.

Private Benefit

All those involved in running the Charity do so on a voluntary basis and receive no income, expenses, or other private benefits.

Statement of Compliance

In setting our objectives and planning our activities for the year, the trustees have considered the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland's guidance on public benefit to ensure that the activities have helped to achieve the charity's purposes and provide a benefit to the beneficiaries.

 - e) These projects will aim to have ownership for the project imbedded with the community in need as well as the commitment to the management and maintenance of the project once commissioned.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

During the financial year, the Trustees were pleased to continue with the new Water Drops project. The aim of this project is to create fresh drinking water for rural communities in Kenya. In a year where we all became more aware of the importance of washing our hands thoroughly with clean water, the reality that many rural communities in Kenya don't even have clean water to drink came sharply into focus. We were delighted to complete our first project to create a sustainable solution for a village using local labour to undertake the project and to maintain it into the future. What is more, the project was completed on time and under budget. We have progressed with at least 4 additional projects.

As part of our sustainability strategy, we plan to enable the two fellow founders of these Water Drops projects to launch their own charitable company to carry on with these projects independently of PCO.

Additionally, we will be engaging with two individuals we have met in Ukraine, one a Church Deacon/Pastor and the other a widow of a volunteer who died defending their country. They will be sharing with us projects that conform with our mission and our values.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General information and basis of accounting

Youth Outreach is a charitable company limited by guarantee and does not have any share capital. It registered as a charity with The Charity Commission for Northern Ireland on 16th February 2015 and it is incorporated in Northern Ireland. The address of the registered office is given in the charity information on page 1 of these financial statements.

The charitable company constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008, The Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015 and the Companies Act 2006 and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements are prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest £1.

The significant accounting policies are set out below. The directors consider that these accounting policies are suitable, have been consistently applied and are supported by reasonable and prudent judgement and estimates.

Fund accounting – unrestricted funds

The company's unrestricted funds consist of a General Fund which is expendable at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the charitable objects of the company. The directors may at their discretion designate funds for specific purposes but the designation does not legally restrict the directors' discretion to apply the funds.

Income recognition

All income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the charity is legally entitled to the income after any performance conditions have been met, the amount can be measured reliably and it is probable that the income will be received.

For donations to be recognised the charity will have been notified of the amounts and the settlement date in writing. If there are conditions attached to the donation and this requires a level of performance before entitlement can be obtained then income is deferred until those conditions are fully met or the fulfilment of those conditions is within the control of the charity and it is probable that they will be fulfilled.

Donated facilities and donated professional services are recognised in income at their fair value when their economic benefit is probable, it can be measured reliably and the charity has control over the item. Fair value is determined on the basis of the value of the gift to the charity. For example the amount the charity would be willing to pay in the open market for such facilities and services. A corresponding amount is recognised in expenditure.

Income recognition (*continued*)

No amount is included in the financial statements for volunteer time in line with the SORP (FRS 102). Further detail is given in the Directors' Annual Report.

Where practicable, gifts in kind donated for distribution to the beneficiaries of the charity are included in stock and donations in the financial statements upon receipt. If it is impracticable to assess the fair value at receipt or if the costs to undertake such a valuation outweigh any benefits, then the fair value is recognised as a component of donations when it is distributed and an equivalent amount recognised as charitable expenditure.

Voluntary income received by way of donations and gift is credited to revenue on a receivable basis.

Fixed asset gifts in kind are recognised when receivable and are included at fair value. They are not deferred over the life of the asset.

For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received. At this point income is recognised. On occasion legacies will be notified to the charity however it is not possible to measure the amount expected to be distributed. On these occasions, the legacy is treated as a contingent asset and disclosed.

Investment income is interest earned through holding cash at bank. Interest income is recognised when receivable.

Expenditure recognition

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Expenditure is recognised where there is a legal or constructive obligation to make payments to third parties, it is probable that the settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Where costs cannot be directly attributed to a particular heading they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of the resources. Staff costs and overhead expenses are allocated to activities on the basis of staff time spent on those activities.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged as an expense against the activity for which expenditure arose.

Fund-raising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in support of the charitable activities.

Value Added Tax

The charity is not registered for VAT purposes, therefore expenditure is shown gross of VAT.

Fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost, or valuation less accumulated depreciation.

Taxation

As a charity, the company benefits from various exemptions afforded by tax legislation. It is therefore not liable to corporation tax on income or gains falling due within those exemptions. Recovery is made of tax deducted from receipts under gift aid.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. The Directors consider the basis to be appropriate assuming that the charity has adequate financial support from the bankers and related parties.

The directors of Practical Christian Outreach (formerly Youth Outreach) confirm that they have had due regard for the guidance on Public Benefit by the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland and are pleased to report that during the year the charity continued to provide the Public Benefits through programmes and services we offer. In particular, the directors consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives they have set.

Public Benefits:

The Benefits which flow from Practical Christian Outreach (formerly Youth Outreach) known as Rhythm are that young people aged 13-18 of all backgrounds have somewhere other than the streets and public parks to socialise on a Saturday night. This also benefits the local population in that it reduces underage drinking and other forms of anti-social behaviour. These benefits will be evidenced by increasing numbers attending Rhythm and a reduction in antisocial behaviour. The direct beneficiaries are Young People aged 13-18. Other beneficiaries are the general public in Banbridge and particularly those living in areas where the young people would otherwise congregate. All those involved in running the charity do so on a voluntary basis and receive no income, expenses or other private benefits.

 - e) Wherever possible the aim will be to use local labour to undertake the project.
- 3) The Charity will engage with people locally to enable the delivery of the various projects.
 - a) This will include people who volunteer their time.
 - b) People who will provide the funds or fund raise.
 - c) People who have a heart to connect with the people in need.
- 4) The Objects of the company will be carried out in accordance with its doctrinal basis namely under the Word of God our Father, the Love of our Lord Jesus Christ and the Inspiration of His Holy Spirit, as revealed to man in the Holy Scriptures

Volunteers

The charity is grateful for the unstinting efforts of its volunteers who are involved in all aspects of the charity's work.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Total income for the year amounted to £38,357 (2020 - £22,896). Income derived from donations and legacies amounted to £38,357 (2020: £21,781) and other income of £nil (2020: £1,115). Total expenditure for the year amounted to £41,308 (2020 - £41,308). The cost of charitable activities amounted to £21,040 (2020 - £41,308).

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

During the financial year, the Trustees were pleased to oversee the successful launch of the new Water Drops project. The aim of this project is to create fresh drinking water for rural communities in Kenya. In a year we all became more aware of the importance of washing our hand thoroughly with clean water, the reality that many rural communities in Kenya don't even have clean water to drink came sharply into focus. We were delighted to complete our first project to create a sustainable solution for a village using local labour to undertake the project and to maintain it into the future. What is more, the project was completed on time and under budget. We identified up to 6 additional projects to undertake and launched fund raising to enable these to be progressed

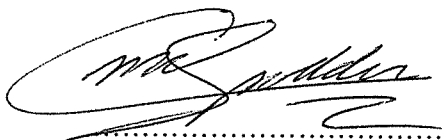

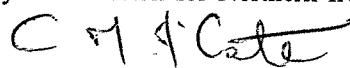

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General information and basis of accounting

Youth Outreach is a charitable company limited by guarantee and does not have any share capital. It registered as a charity with The Charity Commission for Northern Ireland on 16th February 2015 and it is incorporated in Northern Ireland. The address of the registered office is given in the charity information on page 1 of these financial statements.

The charitable company constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008, The Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015 and the Companies Act 2006 and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements are prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest £1.

The significant accounting policies are set out below. The directors consider that these accounting policies are suitable, have been consistently applied and are supported by reasonable and prudent judgement and estimates.

Fund accounting – unrestricted funds

The company's unrestricted funds consist of a General Fund which is expendable at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the charitable objects of the company. The directors may at their discretion designate funds for specific purposes but the designation does not legally restrict the directors' discretion to apply the funds.

Income recognition

All income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the charity is legally entitled to the income after any performance conditions have been met, the amount can be measured reliably and it is probable that the income will be received.

For donations to be recognised the charity will have been notified of the amounts and the settlement date in writing. If there are conditions attached to the donation and this requires a level of performance before entitlement can be obtained then income is deferred until those conditions are fully met or the fulfilment of those conditions is within the control of the charity and it is probable that they will be fulfilled.

Donated facilities and donated professional services are recognised in income at their fair value when their economic benefit is probable, it can be measured reliably and the charity has control over the item. Fair value is determined on the basis of the value of the gift to the charity. For example the amount the charity would be willing to pay in the open market for such facilities and services. A corresponding amount is recognised in expenditure.

Income recognition (*continued*)

No amount is included in the financial statements for volunteer time in line with the SORP (FRS 102). Further detail is given in the Directors' Annual Report.

Where practicable, gifts in kind donated for distribution to the beneficiaries of the charity are included in stock and donations in the financial statements upon receipt. If it is impracticable to assess the fair value at receipt or if the costs to undertake such a valuation outweigh any benefits, then the fair value is recognised as a component of donations when it is distributed and an equivalent amount recognised as charitable expenditure.

Voluntary income received by way of donations and gift is credited to revenue on a receivable basis.

Fixed asset gifts in kind are recognised when receivable and are included at fair value. They are not deferred over the life of the asset.

For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received. At this point income is recognised. On occasion legacies will be notified to the charity however it is not possible to measure the amount expected to be distributed. On these occasions, the legacy is treated as a contingent asset and disclosed.

Investment income is interest earned through holding cash at bank. Interest income is recognised when receivable.

Expenditure recognition

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Expenditure is recognised where there is a legal or constructive obligation to make payments to third parties, it is probable that the settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Where costs cannot be directly attributed to a particular heading they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of the resources. Staff costs and overhead expenses are allocated to activities on the basis of staff time spent on those activities.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged as an expense against the activity for which expenditure arose.

Fund-raising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in support of the charitable activities.

Value Added Tax

The charity is not registered for VAT purposes, therefore expenditure is shown gross of VAT.

Fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost, or valuation less accumulated depreciation.

Trustees' Annual Report 2020-21

Public Benefit

Purposes

The charity was established for the public benefit within Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the area of benefit") by promoting community safety, reducing anti-social behaviour and crime without distinction of gender, sexual orientation, disability/ability, race, political, religious, or other opinion, providing facilities in the interest of social welfare with the object of improving the conditions of life for the inhabitants of the area of benefit and in particular:

- a) To provide a venue or venues both directly and with other parties, for young people to interact and socialise.
- b) To recruit, select and train volunteers for service within the area of benefit and in turn to support their personal and professional development.
- c) To organise and provide outings and other activities to further the company's aims and objectives

As the charity has progressed, the advancement of religion has become an additional purpose that we seek to fulfil. Specifically, we seek to advance the Christian faith by providing a welcoming space for Young People to meet and learn about Christianity that is free from any intimidating denominational labels or infrastructure, so they may know that they are loved, valued, have a purpose, and feel part of a community whom they can trust and rely on.

This purpose has been at the heart of our activities for 11 years and was delivered under the banner of the "Rhythm Project".

In February 2020, the responsibility for the ongoing delivery of this project was transferred, along with the assets pertaining to the project, to Youth for Christ.

In September 2020 the name of the Company and of the Charity was changed to "Practical Christian Outreach". This was to facilitate the pursuance of a broader outreach of needs.

The first of these new outreach projects was "Waterdrops". The charity has extended "its area of benefit" to Kenya/ East Africa as it promotes access to clean water facilities in remote rural areas. Some of the communities have little or no water supply, so a new supply is created. Others may have some water tanks but require additional work to

upgrade their system to a fully functioning supply which brings a good quantity of water to the whole community.

This objective has many benefits including:

- a. Improved health conditions for the all the families in the affected neighbourhood.
- b. Children can attend school more regularly and obtain a better quality of education.
- c. Helps relieve poverty as adults are healthier and able to work better and bring home a constant wage to feed their families.
- d. The women who normally carry the water have more time to be involved in community activities instead of walking long distances.

To ensure the sustainability of our water projects, we consult with local leaders from the onset so that they feel ownership of the facility. We train a water management committee whose role it is to ensure the water distribution point is well looked after and maintained. We also use local labour as much as possible to bring income to the immediate area.

Most Kenyans think holistically that there is no division between the physical and spiritual, so when they are blessed with a clean water supply, they immediately thank God for this. Likewise, our project reflects this as we pray as a community before work begins and then hold a dedication service to handover each finalised project.

Beneficiaries

During the year 2020-21, the direct beneficiaries of Practical Christian Outreach were the inhabitants of a very remote area in South-eastern Kenya called Oltiasika, populated by approximately 2,000 people of which 60% are children under 10 years old.

These people totally rely on collecting rainwater as the closest borehole is approximately 25 kms away. They were provided with a water distribution point which was serviced by three large underground water tanks. Because of this, some temporary jobs were created for the local people while the building work was progressing. Provision of this water means the women no longer must travel a long distance by foot to collect water. These water tanks serve people within a range of 10 kms.

Supporters and donors from N. Ireland and further afield have also benefited from Waterdrops as they have been invited to partner with the project and support communities in Kenya. They are educated through the website and social media about life and culture in these Maasai communities and this brings about an appreciation of the time and effort involved in gaining access to fresh clean water. As supporters connect with people in villages, this nurtures a global viewpoint and encourages people to see the diversity of life beyond their own culture.

To date we have targeted 50 individuals, 20 church communities with emphasis on engaging young people, 5 schools and 10 businesses.

Activities and Achievements

Unfortunately, the launch of this project coincided with the onset of the coronavirus so consequently plans were paused. As everyone was focused on dealing with their own changing circumstances, it was not a good time to be looking for overseas funding.

Also, although Kenya was behind UK in terms of the start of the virus, it spread more slowly throughout the country, so we had to ensure it was safe to travel and implement the project.

The building work could only be carried out during the rainy seasons which occur in March/April and then October/November. This would ensure we were not depleting any water supply available to the local people as we used only fresh rainwater for building.

While we waited, a website was launched, and social media platforms set up so we could begin fundraising and contact possible donors.

We contacted local leaders in the Oltiasika area to plan to implement the project. A team of water technicians was also alerted to begin preparations for the building work.

By October the Project Manager was able to travel to Kenya to supervise all the activities. The project was successfully delivered on time and completed under budget by November.

Restriction on who can benefit

There are no restrictions whatsoever on who can benefit from this project. Even though it is seen as a donation from a Christian charity, the water is received gratefully by all, regardless of faith or denomination and all beneficiaries are dealt with equally.

Harm

A risk assessment is completed before each work project is implemented. This includes overseas travel to a remote area for the staff involved.

We must also ensure that the water provided does not carry any risk of introducing water borne diseases. The water collection point is to be used by people only and their animals

must drink at a separate tank some distance from the main collection point. The concrete base used to place their water containers on is always kept clean.

Private Benefit

All those involved in running the Charity do so on a voluntary basis and receive no income, expenses, or other private benefits.

The exceptions to this are a Project Manager and Project Administrator for the Waterdrops project, who are employed on a part-time basis. They are not trustees of the Charity nor Directors in the company.

Statement of Compliance

In setting our objectives and planning our activities for the year, the trustees have considered the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland's guidance on public benefit to ensure that the activities have helped to achieve the charity's purposes and provide a benefit to the beneficiaries.

No Serious or Periodic Reports have been required.

PUBLIC BENEFIT STATEMENT

The directors of Practical Christian Outreach (formerly Youth Outreach) confirm that they have had due regard for the guidance on Public Benefit by the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland and are pleased to report that during the year the charity continued to provide the Public Benefits through programmes and services we offer. In particular, the directors consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives they have set.

Public Benefits:

The Benefits which flow from Practical Christian Outreach (formerly Youth Outreach) known as Rhythm are that young people aged 13-18 of all backgrounds have somewhere other than the streets and public parks to socialise on a Saturday night. This also benefits the local population in that it reduces underage drinking and other forms of anti-social behaviour. These benefits will be evidenced by increasing numbers attending Rhythm and a reduction in antisocial behaviour. The direct beneficiaries are Young People aged 13-18. Other beneficiaries are the general public in Banbridge and particularly those living in areas where the young people would otherwise congregate. All those involved in running the charity do so on a voluntary basis and receive no income, expenses or other private benefits.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Practical Christian Outreach (formerly Youth Outreach) is a charitable company limited by guarantee and does not have any share capital. It was incorporated on 25th May 2010 and registered as a charity with The Charity Commission for Northern Ireland on 16th February 2015.

The company changed its name to Practical Christian Outreach on 22nd September 2020.

In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £10.

Recruitment, appointment, induction and training

The directors regularly review the requirements of the charity and the possibility of a need for additional directors. Any new directors would be appointed by resolution of a meeting of all the directors passed by a majority of those present. Appropriate training and induction is available to all directors.

Risk management

The directors have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the Trust, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate an exposure to major risks. Where appropriate, systems or procedures have been established to mitigate the risks the charity faces. Internal control risks are minimised by the implementation of procedures for authorisation of all transactions and projects.  - b) It will utilize the skills and capabilities of people who are or have been, embedded in the communities to direct the implementation of sustainable solutions.
 - c) These solutions will be focused on short term delivery of significant and impactful projects.
 - d) These projects will aim to have ownership for the project imbedded with the community in need as well as the commitment to the management and maintenance of the project once commissioned.
 - e) Wherever possible the aim will be to use local labour to undertake the project.
- 3) The Charity will engage with people locally to enable the delivery of the various projects.
 - a) This will include people who volunteer their time.
 - b) People who will provide the funds or fund raise.
 - c) People who have a heart to connect with the people in need.
- 4) The Objects of the company will be carried out in accordance with its doctrinal basis namely under the Word of God our Father, the Love of our Lord Jesus Christ and the Inspiration of His Holy Spirit, as revealed to man in the Holy Scriptures

Volunteers

The charity is grateful for the unstinting efforts of its volunteers who are involved in all aspects of the charity's work.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Total income for the year amounted to £38,357 (2020 - £22,896). Income derived from donations and legacies amounted to £38,357 (2020: £21,781) and other income of £nil (2020: £1,115). Total expenditure for the year amounted to £41,308 (2020 - £41,308). The cost of charitable activities amounted to £21,040 (2020 - £41,308).

The net income for the year amounted to £17,317 (2020 – net expenditure of £18,412).

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the charity to maintain free reserves which matches the needs of the trust, both at the current time and the foreseeable future. This provides sufficient funds to cover running costs which include management, administration and support costs. Free reserves are those unrestricted reserves not designed nor invested in fixed assets which are available for general use.

Funding

The principal funding is from donations.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

During the financial year, the Trustees were pleased to oversee the successful launch of the new Water Drops project. The aim of this project is to create fresh drinking water for rural communities in Kenya. In a year we all became more aware of the importance of washing our hand thoroughly with clean water, the reality that many rural communities in Kenya don't even have clean water to drink came sharply into focus. We were delighted to complete our first project to create a sustainable solution for a village using local labour to undertake the project and to maintain it into the future. What is more, the project was completed on time and under budget. We identified up to 6 additional projects to undertake and launched fund raising to enable these to be progressed

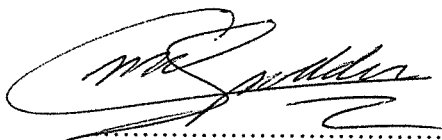

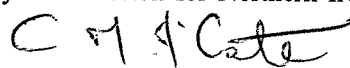

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General information and basis of accounting

Youth Outreach is a charitable company limited by guarantee and does not have any share capital. It registered as a charity with The Charity Commission for Northern Ireland on 16th February 2015 and it is incorporated in Northern Ireland. The address of the registered office is given in the charity information on page 1 of these financial statements.

The charitable company constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008, The Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015 and the Companies Act 2006 and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements are prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest £1.

The significant accounting policies are set out below. The directors consider that these accounting policies are suitable, have been consistently applied and are supported by reasonable and prudent judgement and estimates.

Fund accounting – unrestricted funds

The company's unrestricted funds consist of a General Fund which is expendable at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the charitable objects of the company. The directors may at their discretion designate funds for specific purposes but the designation does not legally restrict the directors' discretion to apply the funds.

Income recognition

All income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the charity is legally entitled to the income after any performance conditions have been met, the amount can be measured reliably and it is probable that the income will be received.

For donations to be recognised the charity will have been notified of the amounts and the settlement date in writing. If there are conditions attached to the donation and this requires a level of performance before entitlement can be obtained then income is deferred until those conditions are fully met or the fulfilment of those conditions is within the control of the charity and it is probable that they will be fulfilled.

Donated facilities and donated professional services are recognised in income at their fair value when their economic benefit is probable, it can be measured reliably and the charity has control over the item. Fair value is determined on the basis of the value of the gift to the charity. For example the amount the charity would be willing to pay in the open market for such facilities and services. A corresponding amount is recognised in expenditure.

Income recognition (*continued*)

No amount is included in the financial statements for volunteer time in line with the SORP (FRS 102). Further detail is given in the Directors' Annual Report.

Where practicable, gifts in kind donated for distribution to the beneficiaries of the charity are included in stock and donations in the financial statements upon receipt. If it is impracticable to assess the fair value at receipt or if the costs to undertake such a valuation outweigh any benefits, then the fair value is recognised as a component of donations when it is distributed and an equivalent amount recognised as charitable expenditure.

Voluntary income received by way of donations and gift is credited to revenue on a receivable basis.

Fixed asset gifts in kind are recognised when receivable and are included at fair value. They are not deferred over the life of the asset.

For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received. At this point income is recognised. On occasion legacies will be notified to the charity however it is not possible to measure the amount expected to be distributed. On these occasions, the legacy is treated as a contingent asset and disclosed.

Investment income is interest earned through holding cash at bank. Interest income is recognised when receivable.

Expenditure recognition

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Expenditure is recognised where there is a legal or constructive obligation to make payments to third parties, it is probable that the settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Where costs cannot be directly attributed to a particular heading they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of the resources. Staff costs and overhead expenses are allocated to activities on the basis of staff time spent on those activities.

Irrecoverable VAT is charged as an expense against the activity for which expenditure arose.

Fund-raising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in support of the charitable activities.

Value Added Tax

The charity is not registered for VAT purposes, therefore expenditure is shown gross of VAT.

Fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost, or valuation less accumulated depreciation.

Taxation

As a charity, the company benefits from various exemptions afforded by tax legislation. It is therefore not liable to corporation tax on income or gains falling due within those exemptions. Recovery is made of tax deducted from receipts under gift aid.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. The Directors consider the basis to be appropriate assuming that the charity has adequate financial support from the bankers and related parties.
